




DEAR PRO RIDER EDITOR,





THE SEA-DOO | Introducing the new RXP-X XPERIENCE! | and the 2021 Sea-Doo Lineup

recently had the privilege of attending the Sea-Doo Media release and test ride for the all-new 2021 Sea-Doo RXP-X. Following the initial presentation, I piloted a midnight purple RXP-X set up in the "1-up" configuration. Eight skis were led at a spirited clip by a Sea-Doo pace boat down the scenic Saint John's River outside Orlando, Florida, fifteen miles to a location where we had the opportunity to perform personal evaluations and refuel. The trip took us through narrow weaving channels and open bay areas, dodging the occasional alligator.

As the younger riders opened throttle, I decided to utilize the merging boat wake, backwash, and rough water conditions to test the handling and ride quality of the ski. Still at a fast pace for me, I pinned the throttle at every possible opportunity. The new T3-R hull with the Shark Gill design slices through chop and is smooth through sweeping

turns at any speed inspiring rider confidence. Every time I pinned the throttle, it reminded me of the first time I thrashed my Kawasaki Ninja 900 the moment the odometer rolled over its last break-in mile. The ski's acceleration rate produces pure motorhead joy without the fear of speeding tickets. The Ergolock-R System is very comfortable and held me in place like a tick on a squirrel. The adjustable rear saddle was very effective in reducing back fatigue for the entire 30-mile ride. The IBR braking system was very easy to operate and became second nature after a little practice. It enables the rider to select neutral, reverse and brake with one lever. The brake system stops the ski amazingly well. This ski will satisfy racers and recreational PWC enthusiasts. PK

ve been told most of my life nothing is easy and racing in 2020 proved to be an extremely daunting task. Following the success of The Hot Products 2020 Mark Hahn Memorial presented by Yamaha in February it seemed the sky was the limit on the 2020 Hot Products "Best of the West" Series. That was in the early part of the year when nobody heard of Covid 19 much less was confined to home. Within a week in mid-March when the country was actively shutting down, one by one, race sites canceled permits. Another site was chosen however during due diligence it became clear it couldn't accommodate the throngs of racers climbing the walls waiting to "bang buoys." Other sites including Windsor Beach in Lake Havasu were put in the que to obtain permits but failed. Thankfully La Paz County Park granted a permit at a newly renovated location, Patria Flats in Parker, Arizona and what a great race site and event it turned out to be!

The 2020 Hot Products IJSBA National Championships presented by Jettrim, Impros, Hydro-Turf, Jet Re-Nu, Bomber Eyewear, Jettribe, Blowsion, Works H20, Kawasaki, Oakley, JC Racing, 3D Design Concepts T.C. Freeride, Pro Watercraft, Rivera Trucking, Skat-Trak, Ultimate Watercraft, West Coast Watercraft Club and Pro Rider Watercraft Magazine were held on the Colorado River at Patria Flats. The freshly manicured beach, fishbowl start line area and elevated viewing were highlights of the great venue. Teams arrived and began their pre-race rituals in anticipation of what was for many, the first closed course event of the 2020 season.

The course was set and timed. Practice commenced as hungry racers attacked the track with great intensity. Everyone was extremely happy just to be out of their houses. Competition is always intense and while some were a little rusty from no racing, for the vast majority the first snap of the band looked like the 2019 Season Championships with racers not giving an inch on the course. With 160 entries, the largest turnout in 10 years, from Juniors to novices, amateurs, vintage racers and Pros, no race was handed to the winner, each racer fought for every place earned. CONGRATULATIONS to all participants and 2020 IJSBA National Champions!



et ski fishing has been creating lifelong memories for me for several years. I've racked up over 650 engine hours on two Yamaha WaveRunners, the first a 2017 VX Limited, and the current my awesome 2019 FXHO. I can't imagine my hours on the water decreasing anytime soon!

When researching my first ski, I was looking for reliability. Initially I was swayed by Sea-Doo, but Yamaha offered 3 years warranty locally, giving me confidence in the brand. In addition, a local PWC dealer who specializes in fishing was championing the reliability and suitability of Yamaha for serious offshore fishing. The VX gave 400 trouble-free hours with no additional costs over standard servicing. My current Yamaha FXHO is a fantastic platform for fishing and touring, and now with 250 hours, is repeating that reliability. The FXHO has the right combination for fishing: large fuel tank, good fuel economy, and a proven powerplant, the 1.8L high output engine. The seat is flatter than a touring seat, making it far more suitable for fishing yet very comfortable for all-day riding.

After the initial hours spent learning the finer points of jet ski fishing and gaining confidence to explore further offshore and target larger species, I soon found I could never carry enough gear to suit the various techniques I wanted to use. I wanted to maximize my time on the water, so I started looking at options for adding storage.

The number one tip I give anyone getting into the sport is to buy good safety equipment. Nothing limits your fishing more than fear, fear of the weather, fear of tipping over, fear of breakdowns or worse! I installed a 25-watt marine VHF radio, an auxiliary fuel tank and I always wear a personal locating beacon (PLB). I have dual batteries, and the best accessory made for serious jet ski fishing - Tubbies!

Tubbies are custom fiberglass pods that attach securely to the sides of the PWC. Removal is literally just a minute or two job, no tools required. Tubbies offer immense storage space that turns your ski into a serious fishing chariot and add stability to match the roughest seas. They offer the safety of added buoyancy and keep the rear deck free for reboarding or pulling up that really big fish! Tubbies include a live bait well plumbed into the water scoop used by the Yamaha's visibility spout, and a watertight safety "grab" bottle.

We have an increasing problem locally of sharks lurking under skis, waiting to tax your catch. I had a large Tuna bitten completely in half right next to my ski. The added height of the Tubbies deck offers better leg protection and peace of mind!

I've worked in the creative industries all my adult life, and love photography and video editing. When I really started to enjoy my jet ski fishing and obtained better success with the fish, I started a YouTube channel called Jetfisher. Initially it was selfishly intended to relive the better days out, but soon I was contacted by other riders wanting ski and fishing tips or looking for an experienced rider to accompany them offshore until they gained confidence. I've now developed some special jet ski fishing products that fill a gap in the market and hope to extend the range in coming years.

WHAT IS CAVITATION?

avitation occurs when your engine is turning along with your impeller (or propeller on an outboard engine) and your jet ski (or boat) doesn't accelerate when throttle is applied or takes time for the ski to start moving or gain speed. It can also cause a loss of top end speed. This is true for sitdown and standups alike.

What causes cavitation?

There are a few things that cause cavitation: having the wrong pitch impeller, debris such as weeds or grass caught in the intake grate or jet pump or a worn wear ring or bent impeller. On a jet ski, the jet pump has an impeller and a wear ring. The space between the two should be nominal. The thickness of a business card is how close a gap should be between a new wear ring and impeller. As time goes on, sand, shells and other foreign debris will erode the wear ring, making the gap grow larger. If a stick or rock or even a rope gets stuck between the impeller and wear ring, the plastic wear ring can wear down instantly. It is also possible for the impeller to wear down or become chipped, bent and destroyed.

Some manufacturers use a plastic type wear ring, others use stainless steel. And of course you can get aftermarket in both as well. It is usually a lot less costly to replace a wear ring then it is an impeller.

Another cause of wear ring failure is jet pump failure. Bearings that have taken on water can rust and blow apart, then the impeller starts to wobble and hit the wear ring.

Wear rings are a consumable item. They are meant to wear out and should be checked with routine maintenance. They are not expensive to replace unless there are other issues such as pump bearings or a pump shaft gone bad.

'm Chris and this is my 1100 swapped '94 WaveRaider. I started riding and working on jet skis in the summer of 2019 as a way to cope with my Multiple Sclerosis diagnosis I received in October, 2018. My original intent was to stay mostly stock, merely upgrading the ride plate, sponsons, and intake grate, and doing graphics similar to the old Pro-Tec Racing Raiders on my '95 1100, but that quickly spiraled out of control, having two friends, Roger and David Ho-Yen, who raced in the local Region 8 circuit.

With winter in Connecticut taking away riding time, I had plenty of time to look for parts, and quickly found myself finding rare parts that I couldn't pass up. NOS Riva sponsons even though I already had Beach House sponsons-why not? Suspension steering? That looks cool. I found myself part of a network of people that knew where the hard to find parts were and realized this was no longer going to be a stock ski. Stock SBN38 carbs quickly became SBN44s. The new carbs needed a new intake manifold, so obviously I needed to get a Pro-Tec to match my theme. The whole thing kept snowballing.

In May I got a message from David, "I found you a '94 hull." For those who don't know, the '94 was the first year of the Raider, is the only purple Raider hull, and was also a fiberglass hull that weighed 95 pounds less than my '95 1100 smc. I got it, obviously. Now I had to do a complete swap of engine, pump, etc. The hardest part by far was working in the tight space with the ADA conversion brackets. In hindsight, I would have glassed in new mounts, but I hadn't done it before, so I went with the brackets.

Overall, I spent nearly a year collecting parts and then putting the ski together, primarily at night after the kids were asleep. While it took far longer than it should have, I made great new friends and learned a ton along the way. I was also able to utilize newly established relationships and connections to host a raffle to benefit the National MS Society, through walkMS.org, raising over \$3,000.

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


The expressions on everyone's faces signaled coffee was essential. The fire was restoked as breakfast was prepped. A well-fed team is a happy team.

PURSUING FITNESS KNOWS NO OBSTACLES

How badly do you want to win? To perform 'ok', requires little. To be 'good', requires dedication. But to be truly 'great', requires an endless desire, dedication, commitment and belief every minute of every day. Training and practicing are not one time or seasonal investments but instead are required elements necessary for success and winning. Athletes don't plan to fail but often times fail to plan. No matter what obstacles are put in front of you, (e.g. COVID, cold weather, unsavory waters, mechanical failure), your success depends on your preparation. So, to you I say, never stop training, never stop pushing to win.

BALL SLAMS-TRAINING THE ABDOMINALS

OVERVIEW: Ball slams are a great abdominal exercise which can be performed along with traditional abdominal exercises such as crunches, sit-ups, and leg-lifts. Ball Slams are a dynamic exercise requiring rapid muscle contraction. Any large ball can be used but medicine balls of various weights are best.

BASICS: Standing upright, hold a medicine ball in both hands with outstretched arms above your head (Photo 1). To initiate the movement, bend slightly backwards stretching the abdominal muscles. After the slight backward movement, immediately contract the abdominal region pulling the ball, arms and upper torso forward as quickly and explosively as possible (Photo 2). Release the ball slamming it to the ground while following through with your arms and pulling the upper torso as far forward/downward as possible (Photo 3). Collect the ball and repeat this exercise. By using various weighted balls, you are able to change the intensity and velocity. A heavier ball will slow down the movement but will recruit more muscle fibers. Using a lighter ball will allow for a higher velocity however you will recruit fewer muscle fibers. Using both heavier and lighter balls will enhance core strength and speed of movement.

PRECAUTIONS: Depending on the type of ball used, when slamming a ball be cautious about the rebound. Heavy rubber medicine balls can bounce high and fast therefore pay careful attention not to hit yourself or others and be aware of surrounding objects so not to inflict damage. Open driveways or parking lots work best.

EXERCISE RELEVANCE TO PWC: Core strength, endurance and rapid movements are the focal point to all sports. Riding and especially racing stand-up PWC requires muscular strength, endurance and rapid upper and lower body movements throughout a race. The body core is the keystone linking upper to lower body for both stabilization and movement.

PRESCRIPTION: Add Ball Slams to your regular abdominal exercise routine

DAYS OF THE WEEK: 2 days a week

BEGINNERS: 2–3 sets of 8–12 ball slams using a lighter weight ball (2–5 lbs.)

INTERMEDIATE: 3–4 sets of 8–10 ball slams increasing the ball weight (5–10 lbs.)

ADVANCED: 4–5 sets of 6–8 ball slams alternating ball weights on different days.


Light day (5–10 lbs.) and a heavy day (10–20 lbs.)

REVIEW: SXR 1500 JETTRI **MAT INSTALLATION**

ne of the nicest upgrades to your SXR 1500 is a mat kit. It not only looks great but provides a nicer tray experience. Installing kickers to lock your feet in as well as back and front humps allows you to easily align your feet keeping you in the tray longer! Jettrim is one of the industry leaders in this area.

Like any job it's a good idea to have the right tools:

- Good sharp utility blade(s)
- · Crayon or marking pencil
- Rubber mallet (white)
- · Contact adhesive
- · Spray gun or painting
- · Green abrasive scotch pad · Pop rivet gun and
- foam brush
- stainless pop rivets
- Superglue
- Drill and 3/16 bit

Prior to this installation I was extremely concerned how difficult it would be to remove the mats. On my 550 it was a nightmare, but this was the easy part.

First job is drill out the back-mat strap and remove the tow gromet. I chose to go with the Jettrim tow loop. I was able to get my fingernail under the side mats first then by giving them a hard, fast tug it came off in one sheet. I wouldn't recommend using a tool any sharper than your finger as your primary goal is to avoid scratching that gel coat on the hull. Pull off both sides and then work on the floor mat.

Like you, I've tried everything for removing mats and glue -- heat, sanding discs, you name it I've tried it. The best trick is carburetor cleaner, turns the glue to mush fast then scrape it off. Pull up the floor mat in one hard pull then clean it up with white fuel or Shellite, cleans and evaporates fast.

Now chill and take this bit slow.

Lay the mats out and trace around the edge with your crayon. I traced around mine twice, took it slow and used tape to hold them in place. I used a green sanding pad and gave the deck a good scuffing. Now time to glue. If you don't have a spray gun use a sponge brush. Work in sections. I sprayed the front part first, giving the two coats time to tack and then stuck it, finishing it off with a white rubber mallet, tapping the mat all over to make sure it never comes off. Work on the side mats one at a time ensuring you do not overspray past your crayon mark as that means more work removing it later.

Tap, tap, tap - stick, stick, stick. Do the other side. Lay the bottom mat down, install the hump by tracing it and cutting away the foam. Glue and insert.

Cut out the back kickers and install the tow loop by drilling two bolt holes and install. I found the bolts to protrude a little and was worried it would damage the mat, so I reinforced. Spray the bottom mat and install. Stick down the top of the mat and then apply a little pulling (towards the back of the ski) apply pressure and stick down. The kickers do a good job of stopping the two glued surfaces prematurely touching.

Cut the bottom of the mat off with a blade and install the back plate with stainless rivets. Run a bead of superglue around the complete edge--don't use too much!

Overall, the process took around 2 hours. It looks great and is a treat to ride! PR






Rock'n Riverfest 2020 in the Lone Star State

BACKGROUND

Founders Ron Brok and Tamarin Gullett have a combined half century of experience on the water on various types of watercraft and share a love for personal watercraft. Both carry extensive maritime and emergency response training and are heavily involved at the local and state level in personal watercraft activities including charity events, environmental initiatives, and safety events up and down the Atlantic Seaboard and beyond.



BEGINNINGS

The conversation about meaningful safety instruction began while preparing for a trip from Miami to Bimini Bahamas. During the preparation stage, the combined open ocean knowledge Ron and Tamarin shared from their prior experiences at sea gave rise to a common vision to help guide new personal watercraft operators from the beginnings of their journey into the recreational riding world, and to help curate authoritative sources of information, training, and gear acquisition to ensure safe and effective operation in a variety of conditions. Drawing from long distance and closed water trip experience, Ron and Tamarin provide tips to enhance situational awareness of the rules of the water, and frequently collaborate with guests through their website and blog that enhances the availability of knowledge beyond pure mechanics, through the introduction of rider health and safety information.

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an acute attention to detail. The ski was a platform for me to create what I believe to be an ideal recreational watercraft. It is 100% hands on restoration, with me completing all disassembly, cleaning, assembling, fiber glassing, painting, electrical and detail work including custom coated wiring and colored epoxy resin. Having no prior experience with fiberglass or painting, it was a challenging "learn as you go" project

There is great information in the PWC community and plenty of individuals willing to help. If you do the research, read lots of articles, ask the right questions and thank people twice, you can accomplish a lot on your own. I wanted a custom watercraft that was true to the era and had that real feel energy of hands on custom work. Some of that art has been lost, it seems that bolt on anodized parts and decals are the go-to

for me. I knew there had to be a way to achieve my goal. Upon my research I found that fiberglass work and painting have very specific instructions; if you are patient and follow those instructions exactly, you can do it. It takes time and planning but is 100% worth it! I grew up in Daytona Beach, Florida. Much of my inspiration is from the colors I remembered seeing at the shores of Daytona in the early 1990's. These colors inspire me to be creative and make me smile. How can something that looks like that, not be fun? In my opinion, the constant presence of the "tough as nails" look is becoming a drag. Jet skis are fun—I don't want to look like I'm trying to sneak attack somebody on the water, and I most certainly don't want to be virtually invisible to other boaters.

I hope this build inspires others to break the mold, think outside the box, and get creative with the way we choose aesthetics. There are leaders, and there are followers. If you believe in yourself, they will too! PR


JUNIOR SKI


