

We gear up with 5/4mm wetsuits, rain jackets, hoods, and snow goggles to combat the 32-40-degree water temps. Recently we attended the Wave Rave Freeride, met lots of people, rode some aftermarket hulls, and had an absolute blast! Our group keeps growing as we meet local riders at boat launches and through social media. There are no requirements to join WSM other than owning a jet ski and getting out on the water! We are about getting together to ride, meeting new people, and learning from riders with more experience than us. Our goal for next year is to attend the Daytona Freeride to get a taste of the real action!


Alabama ski riders crab island getaway

PWC CHAIN GANG LOOP THE LAKES

The PWC Chain Gang, composed of 731 members, was established in 2018. The name was a twist on our home base water system, the Chain O' Lakes in northern Illinois. The Chain O' Lakes waterway system is made up of 15 lakes, multiple channels, 7,100 acres of water, 488 miles of shoreline and 45 miles of river broken up into three main areas, the lakes, the upper river, and lower river. The upper and lower have a lock system that takes 30 minutes





to pass through. Our group allows for people to ride where they may not be comfortable doing so without a "wingman."

To date our most memorable ride was the 3rd Annual Loop the Lakes. We gained the attention of local powersports dealer Nielsen Enterprise the Midwest's largest powersport dealer who sponsored the event. Over 100 PWCs, perfect weather, and a great group of riders from several states made for a fantastic event. The main rule is 'don't pass the pace boat.' It isn't easy to keep 100 skis idling while waiting for a drone to launch between lakes, but everyone held back, and the results were incredible as we traveled through 8 lakes on the 2-hour ride. With the help of Nielsen's sponsorship and involvement from other local businesses we plan to continue this event every year. All are welcome to join the PWC Chain Gang--the only requirement is a PWC and a desire to have fun.







BRITISH FREESTYLE GOES VIRTUAL

British Freestyle's response to the coronavirus is to adapt and change to a new format. Scheduled to screen on October 17th on Facebook, the first ever Virtual British Freestyle Championships breaks new ground in the sport of jet skiing. The Virtual British Freestyle Championships (VBFC) open to British and International riders, offers five classes: 800cc British, 900cc British, 900cc International, 1200cc British, 1200cc International. Riders are from all over the UK, and as far afield as the US, Qatar and Russia, including several iuniors and first-time competitors.

A full event production will be pulled together from individual footage of riders performing a timed routine following competition rules and guidelines. British Freestyle Manager Paul Hewitt explains, "With this Virtual Championships we wanted to put on a freestyle show in spite of the challenging climate and give riders a reason to train and stay motivated whilst showcasing and growing our sport."



JET SKI GATEWAY TO THE WILD ATLANTIC WAY

elcome to Kilkee by the Sea, Co. Clare, situated on Irelands' west coast, the home of some of the most rugged, wild waters and cliffs and the closest point to the United States from Europe. Kilkee is an old Victorian town and for hundreds of years has welcomed visitors from around the world to its amazing half mile horseshoe strand and glorious summer Atlantic water swimming pools. Kilkee is one of Ireland's favorite destinations for exploring the magnificent Wild Atlantic Way.

Kilkee Jet Ski Club offers coastal day trips to international visitors, north to the Aran Islands or south to the magnificent Loop Head Peninsula. The club, with close to 30 members focuses on a family-friendly approach to jet skiing and water sports. A strong ethos of the club is community-based projects, beach clean ups and plastic collection days while always focusing on respect for other water users.

The Atlantic Ocean here is tidal with up to 22 ft difference between high and low tides, sea conditions vary a lot throughout the day. Prevailing winds are typically north westerly and when the blow swells waves get big!

Jet skiing in Ireland has seen a huge increase in popularity especially with the growth in social media and equipment for taking on PWCs. GoPro's affordability makes it easy for a day jet skier to capture amazing media and share it creating demand for more people wanting to visit Ireland's dramatic west coast.

The skis of choice here are predominately Sea-Doos. Yamaha is a close second with Kawasaki and Honda having a small footprint. The large platform of the Sea-Doo RXT and the power of the 300's seems to be the choice of visitors when looking to tackle big swells and rough conditions.

The Aran Islands Adventure, a 24-mile trip north of Kilkee, passes the world-famous Cliffs of Moher, an amazing vertical rock formation, one of the largest in Europe. Towering along the coast for 10 miles these cliffs sheer up to 600ft high. Sitting on a PWC at the base of these touching the cold sea battered stone is an experience of a lifetime. Onwards up the coast turquoise waters and white sands of quaint and traditional islands abound. Dolphins and other sea life are a common sight while local pubs are perfect for lunch and Ireland's best Guinness.

Southbound from Kilkee towards Loop Head, Ireland's most westerly point, is 8 miles of amazing sights starting with Bishops Islands and Kilkee Cliffs. Local knowledge is essential as rocks, small islands and reefs will make short work of a hull and a ride plate at any speed. There are caves to explore with complete darkness and inlets and coves where snorkeling and lobster pot fishing is enjoyed. This ride includes an enormous canyon which was in one of the scenes from the Star Wars movies. **PR**

s newcomers are continually joining the personal watercraft community enjoying the freedom, fun and convenience of PWCs, we are reminded of the importance of looking after your ski correctly.

In this tech tip we underline the importance in the procedure if your ski is ever in need of being towed by another vessel. As stated in all manufacturer's operators guides it is very important. When being towed by another vessel your ski must be towed at the recommended speed by the manufacturer. If you are unaware of the recommended speed your safest bet would be 6 knots (6.9 mph). The reason for this is very much the same as when flushing your ski; you do not want to force water into your ski without the engine running and forcing it back out again. When you tow a ski at speed you are forcing water through the fitting in the jet pump that feeds the cooling system.

The problem is either when towing or flushing your ski without the engine running forcing that water out it can potentially fill up your exhaust and that water can then travel back up the exhaust, back into engine possibly causing internal water damage to your engine. The

ways you can prevent this from happening is always make sure you start your ski before flushing on the tap and always make sure you turn the water off before you turn your ski off. Check your operators guide to insure you are flushing for the recommended period of time.

As for towing it is highly recommended to get a tow tap fitted to your ski. For a very low cost at your local qualified PWC workshop this will enable you to turn off the tap that feeds the water to the exhaust and tow your PWC at speed without the worry of filling your engine with water and the costly exercise of repairing that it can cause.

A little tip: If you do use the tap I recommend wrapping your lanyard around it as a reminder when you go to turn your ski on again and grab that lanyard it will help remind you to turn the tap back on.

As a guide all taps should flow water in the direction of the handle. If the tap handle is in line with the hose it should be flowing water. Double check with your qualified installer and I'm sure if you have any questions about any of these matters, they will be happy to help; also make sure you read your operators guide to insure you don't ever get caught with an engine full of water.

Explore Remote Waters with PWC FISHING!

y name is Mark Forrest, from the YouTube Channel Forrest Sound Adventure and Exploration. I've wanted a Sea-Doo for as long as I can remember, and when they came out with the Spark, I had to get one. Since then, I have had a GTI 130 and am now on to a 2019 GTX 155 with the ST3 hull. I've been using my Sea-Doo to explore remote waters throughout Ontario, Canada and making videos of these trips for my channel.

In 2018, word came out about this ST3 hull that Sea-Doo had and how great it was for stability. It featured tons of storage, and even a new way to access your storage bin. I saw the Fish Pro, and really liked all the accessories it had but the overall look didn't grab me. So, I turned my eyes to the Sea-Doo GTX 155. It had everything needed to get me started on longer adventures, to places further away in Ontario. My first season with the GTX 155, I put close to 100 hours on the unit taking it to places like the Niagara River, Tobermory, and Parry Sound in Ontario. I really started to put time into filming these trips, which the stability of the ST3 hull made a lot easier to capture. Plus, with the new storage bin access, I no longer needed to stand up to get my gear from the bin, which was a huge game changer for me.

My best friend from the YouTube channel Doo Diligence Fishing, is the reason I got into fishing. I take my rod and tackle box with me whenever we go so we can do some fishing while out on adventures. We have been all over Ontario to explore and fish, including Massasauga Provincial Park, Midland, Lake Simcoe, Georgian Bay, Lake Ontario, and some hidden lakes. Mainly we fish for Pike and Muskie – but the great thing about Ontario fishing is the huge variety of options like bass, salmon and lake trout.

With the GTX 155, I've had to come up with ways to get my gear on the Sea-Doo. Putting the tackle box in the front storage bin was no issue, but the rod and net were. I did not get the large cooler, and therefore did not have the option for rod holders. After some testing, I found I could fit the rod down between the hand grips and the back seat. Even in the worst waves, it still has not come out. I then found a net with a cord and was able to clip it to the other hand grip. Now into my second season with the Sea-Doo GTX 155, I added the Garmin Echomap Plus 62V to my unit and the Sea-Doo fishing gunnels as well. The combination has added a whole new level to my fishing game.

Get out and explore on your PWC and do some fishing in places you could never get to before!

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



ueensland Personal Watercraft Club is honored to have such an accomplished, dedicated rescue crew on our team. Lead marshal, Daz Keal brings a wealth of expertise and passion to the sport and serves as a general committee member bringing many years of experience and fresh, new ideas to the table. With such accomplishments under his belt Daz and his team are a great asset to our club.

Here is Daz's story in his own words:

My passion is the sea. I have surfed, dived and swam all over the world. Originally from England I now live with my fiancée on the Gold Coast and have been associated with motorsport most of my life coming from a military background and have always been involved in repairing, tuning pretty much everything including cars, motorcycles, boats and PWCs.

My first ski back in 1988 was a Kawi JS440 and I was hooked ever since. My current PWC is a 2020 Sea-Doo GTI 170SE for Rescue and Recreation. Currently I provide event safety coverage for the Queensland PWC series and help train the new marshals and racers in Australia. I am K38 trained and a current member of the International P1 Super Stock and Agua X racing series with over 25 Years experience as a beach lifeguard in the UK having provided PWC safety in Australia, the UK, Malaysia and India over the last 20 years.

I spent 10 years in HM Coastguard as a member of Newquay Search and Rescue team providing water and cliff helicopter rescue.

In 2009 I was awarded the Chief Coastguard's commendation by the Maritime and Coastguard Agency for a cliff rescue as part of the Newquay Cliff Rescue Team.

I appreciate all water sport disciplines that led me to follow water safety and training RWC operators to provide safety cover for many disciplines of powerboat, PWC racing, and freestyle events.

The gear I wear and use in rescue and recreation reflects years of fine tuning by the manufacturer listening to feedback and

gives me and my team 100 % confidence in the products performing in extreme situations. I was due to be part of the P1 Aqua X event at Cocoa Beach in May but due to the Covid 19 outbreak that has been put on hold. I am looking forward to the restrictions being lifted when the time is right, and we can get back to racing worldwide again.

While in the UK I was a teacher and beach lifeguard trainer which has given me the skills required to train RWC (Rescue Watercraft) users in the demanding conditions that are present in the rescue environment.

Our team consists of Ash Downs and Aaron Fenby with a batch of keen up and coming marshals who join when required. We train in the surf and waterways on the Gold Coast fine tuning our skills and regularly rescue everyday water users on our outings.

I currently have support from C Skins Wetsuits, Gath Helmets, JSW Powersports, Hydro-Turf, Jet Tech Rescue sleds, Thonchors Anchors, Bobby Cardone 239 Raceboat and Bb Talkin. PR

FITNESS TIP

NEVER STOP TRAINING-GET OUT AND WORK OUT!

Never stop training, no excuses. COVID-19 may have slowed down the country but you can't let that stop you from exercising. Exercise enhances overall health which includes our immune system. A strong healthy body is our best defense against infection, disease and injury recovery. Get out and work out!

BENT OVER STANDING CABLE PULLS

DVERVIEW: Bent Over Standing Cable Pulls (rows) are a great way to strengthen the back, while secondarily strengthening the rear shoulders, biceps and grip strength. It's a simple but highly effective exercise but one which requires a focused concentration on correct form. This exercise closely resembles stand-up jet ski movements and to a lesser extent sit down watercraft.

BASICS: Attach a straight or curved bar to a lower cable weight stack and select a lighter weight to initially practice. Hold the bar shoulder width and step back so the weight stack is suspended. Squat down so the knees are close to 90 degrees. Keep your head and shoulders upright while rotating your pelvis so your butt pushes backwards (Photo 1: Starting Position). This position helps keep the lower back straight. It's critical not to curve the back forward (spine flexion). Let the weight stack tension pull the arms forward so they are straight. Then pull the bar towards your mid-section, between chest and abdominals. While pulling, bring the shoulder blades back as far as possible (Photo 2: End Position). This is key because if you don't pull the shoulder blades back, much of the exercise only works the arms and rear shoulders (Photo 3 and 4: Back: scapular retraction). Then extend the arms until straight and repeat the exercise. Keep the arms and cable aligned. This is much like rowing a boat, but you're standing during the exercise instead of sitting.

PRECAUTIONS: With any lifting activity, keeping the lower back straight or slightly concave is essential for injury prevention.

EXERCISE RELEVANCE TO PWC: Stand-up watercraft riders and racers are generally in a squatted position while holding the handlebars. The high speeds, rapid turns, and rough waters require extensive dynamic back and arm strength. This land-based exercise is a great way to help subsidize your riding, racing and training.

PRESCRIPTION: Add exercise to 'back day' during your typical resistance training routine.

DAYS OF THE WEEK: 2-3 days a week

BEGINNERS: 2–3 sets of 8–12 repetitions

INTERMEDIATE: 3–4 sets of 8–10 repetitions

ADVANCED: 4–5 sets of 6–10 repetitions

(heavier weight, lower reps)







Resurgence of the Super Chicken


y name is Steve Hotchkiss, my friends call me Beerdart. I ride all over Connecticut training, tuning and racing in Region 8. I'm the defending IJSBA National Super Chicken Champion, riding and building jet skis since 2006, constantly looking for ways to improve what I started with. After building several conversion skis, including a GPRXP and a MSXRXP 4Tec Jetmate, it was time for a change of pace. I chased speed and hit 85MPH on my GPRXP, but decided that was fast enough, time to slow things down a bit. The Super Chicken fit the bill. Of course, this build was not your daddy's Chicken.

> Looking at the Chicken, I wanted more power so went with Big Pin cases, new OEM SXR cylinders ported and clearanced for Wiseco pistons by Erickson Machine. Obviously that alone wasn't enough, so I threw in a HotRods crankshaft, ADA girdled head with pump gas domes

(it is still a Chicken, after all), Boyesen intake manifold with RAD valves, fed by Tru Cad Red Top 44 carbs. To get those little explosions that make the engine go, I used a lightened total loss flywheel and Zeeltronics programmable CDI with my own custom mapping. I went unique with the exhaust, using twin pipes from a Polaris 780 with my own custom adapters, exiting into a TDR waterbox and 23/4" outlet. Originally, I bought the pipes for a Polaris triple project, then realized I could use 2 for my Chicken. With all this power, the stock pump wasn't going to be enough, so why stop there?

The Chicken had some serious limitations pump wise. I wanted to go with a quality pump that would allow me to move all the water my power would allow, so I went with a Solas SXR Mag pump with drop trim and interchangeable reduction and steering nozzle rings. Using the SXR Mag pump was a bit of a challenge as no one makes a drop- in shoe or intake grate for them. The next step was clear: I would need to make my own Beerdart Performance shoe and intake grate. This pump is going to hook up like no other Chicken out there.

I've spent approximately 3 months building this Chicken, but are you ever truly done? I am always looking for ways to improve my skis, or something unique to make them cool and different. It's exciting seeing the resurgence of the Super Chickens and I really tried to set the bar high with my build. There isn't guite any other ski like the Super Chicken, and I hope I can motivate others to join in! PR





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
