

In Kristiansand I ride with Jetski Club Stavanger. Recently I established Jet-Ski Club Kristiansand group on Facebook that collects the jetski riders here. It's open for all to share pictures and invite others to join for a scooter ride. Last year, I travelled a lot with my Trixx and a group of 12 to Lysefjorden, a well-known fjord in Norway, Prekestolen, Kvitsøy, and from there to Haugesund and Karmøy, and back. My favorite place to ride is Lysefjorden in Rogaland, an awesome fjord.

Agder Vannscooter Utleie is a place to rent jet skis, from Trixx up to 230rxt, and 300rxp, something for everybody. Planning to visit Kristiansand in Norway, and want to have a day or two on a scooter? Find us on Facebook: Agder vannskuterutleie or www. agdervannscooterutleie.no.

My most memorable ride was in 2020. We rented a house in Forsand, in front of Lysefjorden, with 25 skis going in the fjord together—it was magic. Five years ago, Clifford Leasure and his wife were driving to a lake. Clifford shared, "While driving we passed a lake with no dock. The truck with a boat on the



trailer was leaving the lake. The truck and boat passed us, and the boat was on the trailer at about 25 degrees from flat. I said, 'why can't someone come up with something that would allow anyone to load a boat centered by themselves?'. This idea popped into my head and when we got home, I constructed a prototype of Easyguide. When I took it to the lake it performed much better than what I thought it would. The first set of floats were very large and ugly, so I made a sleeker lined set. These worked just as good as the big ugly ones. A few of my friends saw these and wanted a set. A friend of mine wanted a set for his son's jetski. We put them on his ski. and they worked amazingly well."

'A very good friend of mine is a retired executive from Mercury Marine. I showed them to him, and he said I have something. Over the course of a year we went to several boat shows and a lot of boat ramps doing research. Everyone that saw these wanted them. So, we started the company and produced quite a few prototypes. We have these on jet skis and small fishing boats from Indiana to Florida. From individual people to marinas there is a demand for these floats. We began production in March 2021. If you watch our videos you can see how these function and perform. A lady in eastern Indiana told me with a lot of excitement in her voice "I can load this thing by myself - it's awesome!" A young man that jet skis a lot told me he will never be without them.

tend to think a true test of a new race boat design should be done by someone that races that class. Tension and energy flows off the line as you smack talk each other before you punch the clock. I always admired from afar the wild reckless abandon and sheer raw talent sport riders bring to every turn. I'm doing this review anyway. Why? I've always envied you. The grin you sport riders have on the line; you look like maniacal hackers with your first back door install. Now, it's my turn!

THE NEW WAVEBLASTER 3-R

Disclosure: I'm pretty sure Billy Dearman didn't think I would say "yes" when he asked if I wanted to ride the WaveBlaster 3-R. Wish you could have seen his face, when I snatched that boat faster than a kid grabbing the last go kart. Please imagine the look as I ride off with his brand-new boat that he's been working on for 3 years, brand new. Brave man.

The custom race hull designed by Jerry Marquis (Watoosee Racing) and Billy Dearman is built to round out a three-year dream of Billy's to build the perfect handling race boat; his quest brought him to this model.

Let's start with the race proven V Hull built by a leader in race hull construction with decades of experience. The hull was ready at World Finals two years ago, but Billy felt some modifications were needed. The lightweight top deck is a direct copy of the Yamaha WaveBlaster800, WB3. The hull setup is also designed to accept engine configurations of a Kawasaki 1100, Sea-Doo 951-1050, and a Kawasaki 1500, four stroke, with the Sea-Doo XPL driveline, #flexibility.

Under the hull, the one-piece carbon seat/hood combo allows for ease of working on the inside of the hull. Watoossee hulls are known for smooth tracking on the water, and I see why. The rider friendly design provides predictable tracking around the course, with a hull design that stays close to the water, a true no hunt or twitch ride! Corner speeds are consistent, predictable on turns, key for Sport GP, and suitable for experienced and newer riders.

ENGINE: As usual the great Tim Judge turned the wrenches and provided the vision for this engine. Billy wanted his ski to be aggressive with the option for adjustability, so the engine mounts can be moved forward or rear for a specific rider's liking, and space on the sides to put in whatever bells and whistles you want. Installation of a Sea-Doo XPL tank allows the hull the option of running more fuel and thus adds more weight for desired handling characteristics. The battery can be positioned anywhere you want for weight distribution. The B1 UMI steering rounds off the overall smoothness of this ski. The motor, nothing crazy, basic Kawasaki 1500, offshore kit with pistons and a reflashed ECU.

You need to feel this boat, buoy to buoy, quick with a signature deep scream. This boat's response going in a turn and coming out is just one big rush. The WB3-R's smooth power band just kept teasing me to push it a little more. I never once felt unsure about her grip and the back stretch was just a flat out high. It is reminiscent of a 2 stroke (even though it's not). Jonathan Owens calls this ski "unobtanium." Previously the WB3 was never available to the US market but FINALLY, it has arrived!

Final note: watch for her in the midrange because that is a holeshot waiting to happen. I recommend watching the live stream when Bill brings it to the line. Or if you don't want to wait that long, give him a call, they start at \$12K.

JOLLY GATOR FUN RUN

n the last issue of Pro Rider Magazine, I gave you a taste of what the St. Johns River has to offer with beautiful Silver Glen Springs. This time we are going on a trip to the South St. Johns River where the fun level takes it up to 100! We call this ride the Jolly Gator Fun Run which covers a distance of 65 miles round trip and is an absolute blast with twists and turns, side trails, rope swings, alligator sightings and some of the best chicken wings you can find on the water. If you have a supercharged ski, bringing extra gas is highly recommended, as there are no fuel stops on this route.

Starting at Lake Monroe Marina Boat Ramp in Sanford, Florida, we head east encountering small no-wake zones, then it's off to the races. The no wake zones restrictions only apply if the St. Johns River is in flood stage, so be sure to check the local water levels at https://tinyurl.com/stjohnswaterlevels.

Halfway through the river take a break at Iron Bend a local boater hangout that gets full before noon. Splash into the river at the rope swing, grab a snack and a drink before heading out towards Lake Harney and Jolly Gator. As you depart Iron Bend, be cautious of other boaters coming around the turn, as this is a wide-open zone with no speed restrictions. Once past Iron Bend, it's full throttle to Lake Harney, which you must cross to get to Jolly Gator Fish Camp. This is a fun, high-speed ride with twists and turns. Lake Harney can be smooth as glass, or choppy with waves 3 feet high. For the most part it's usually smooth. Once you cross the lake, you will encounter the main channel to Jolly Gator Fish Camp, as well as several side trails that lead back to the river. The side trails should only be

explored when the water level is high. During low water levels on the St. Johns River, stay in the main channel.

The Jolly Gator Fish Camp dock accommodates up to 10 PWCs, or you can park along their shoreline and anchor to land. Although the chicken wings are amazing at Jolly Gator, everything on the menu is good including the gator bites! The staff is always friendly and eager to serve our PWC family.

Want to check out Silver Glen Springs with others who know the area well? Check out the Jet Rider Nation Florida Facebook Group. The Jolly Gator Fun Run is one of their signature rides, conducted in a safe group setting several times a year. Interested in checking this amazing spot out on your own or with a group of friends? Over the years Jamin added several other top offroad motorcycle brands expanding his foothold in the e-commerce industry. Our plan is to merge the Hidden Trails and AOMC brands to expand our e-commerce focus into PWC, ATV and UTV segments. HTM currently offers Yamaha, Suzuki, Can-Am and Sea-Doo brands.

PR: What is AOMC's focus, specialties, and primary customers?

IF: AOMC already has a great following in the off-road / street motorcycle industry and sells brands KTM, Husqvarna, GasGas. Sherco and Beta. AOMC sponsors many motorcycle racing series across the US and is now a large sponsor of the Pro Watercross National Tour. We are just getting our feet wet in the PWC segment and will be adding new product daily. The goal is to bring the best products and excellent customer service to your buying experience. Our primary customers would simply be powersport enthusiasts. We are anticipating that most of our customers enjoy many different types of powersports just like we do!

PR: Please share what you and your family members ride, favorite riding locations and what you like to do when you are not working.

IF: We ride everything from standups, sitdowns, ATVs, UTVs, dirt bikes, street bikes, choppers and lawn mowers! Just kidding, but I do have a Husqvarna push mower. IF: Don't overlook your maintenance! A little focus on maintenance goes a long way, not just with PWCs but with all powersports. Get to know your machine, give it the maintenance and attention it needs, and you'll enjoy your investment for many years.

PR: Any special plans for 2021?

IF: Our plans for this year are to get back into racing and promoting our new business venture with AOMC. We took over AOMC operations April 1st, and have been working hard figuring out where we can improve the website and overall customer buying experience. With any powersports dealership, we will focus a lot of advertising at racing events. We'll continue to sponsor off-road motorcycle events and you'll see us on the Pro Watercross National Tour / World Championship as well as competing at the IJSBA World Championship in Lake Havasu. Building out a larger 70,000 sq ft warehouse / office complex for AOMC will give us room to expand; we hope to be moved in by June or July.

PR: Are you currently working with jet ski racers or riders?

IF: Yes, once we knew the AOMC deal was going through, we put a deal together with riders we've supported in the past. I've been a huge fan and supporter of Jimmy Wilson over the years. His talent and work ethic make him the total package in the Pro Ski GP class. Jimmy and his family have been great for Hidden Trails in the past, so it was an easy choice to offer Jimmy a deal to ride for AOMC. The next rider shouldn't come as any surprise because I've been supporting him in racing his whole life. My brother, Cameron Frame, who has always been there with me, works incredibly hard and earned several National and World titles over the years. Cam actually works for HTM and is the lead PWC mechanic. He'll be competing this season in the IROC GP class on the Pro Watercross Tour. We will be doing some contingency sponsorships with young racers like Tory Snyder and Sammy Nehme. I've been watching these kids for years; you'll see some breakout rides from them this season. These guys are all solid representatives of the AOMC brand and I'm looking forward to getting back into PWC racing. It's hard to put into words, but simply put, I love this sport and always will!



TRAILERING TIPS FOR THE NEW SERSON

railering is more than hitching up and hitting the road. Front to back inspection of your trailer and evaluation of how the PWC sits on the bunks is crucial to preventing mishaps and possible insurance liabilities. Consider protecting your investment with insurance coverage.

Before you go, ensure the coupler, chains, lights, and brake line (if equipped) are properly attached to the tow vehicle. It's a good habit to cross the chains before attaching them to your tow hitch hooks; ensure lights are functional by conducting a quick indicator and brake check; replace broken bulbs or faulty wiring promptly.

Once the trailer is safely attached to the tow vehicle, visually inspect, and ensure the bow of the PWC sits securely against the bow roller, and the strap and safety backup are securely attached. Check the winch and ensure the locking pin is in place. Continue to move aftward, swing the dolly wheel into the up and locked position, inspect the bunks as the PWC sits on them, check for visible cracks in the wood or noticeable bowing. If signs of decay, promptly replace bunks with pretreated wood.

CHECK: hubs of wheels for signs of grease leakage, lugs for tightness, tire tread for depth and side walls (inner and outer) for signs of dry rot. Consider upgrading to radial tires for better traction and longer, safer wear over long distances.

Ensure the rear of the PWC is securely strapped down to the rear of the trailer. This protects it from being bounced off the bunks over rough roads and helps stabilize the rear of the trailer by securing the weight downwards, reducing the risk of losing the load on a sharp turn or if the bow roller strap fails. There are many ratcheting tie downs with locking mechanisms available. Fit the ratchet strap to the ski and trailer and trim and lightly burn the ends of the straps so they are short enough not to flap behind the trailer. While not exhaustive, these tips will get you on the road safely. For more in-depth information, visit your local trailer service shop or follow us online for tips.



GREENHUUKNET PWC PERFORMANCE FORUM

ummer is quickly approaching, and for most, that means installing the latest and greatest high- performance parts on our skis to be the fastest on the water. Some of us will bolt on new goodies and may be slightly disappointed when the outcome isn't as fast as expected. Why is that? Depending on your location in the world, elevation, or even the weather conditions, different factors can affect your ski's performance.

To thoroughly understand this, we must first understand how the internal combustion engine works. As an engine's piston moves downward in its combustion cycle, air and fuel is pulled in through the intake and into the combustion chamber. As the piston moves back up, that air and fuel mixture is compressed and ignited. This powers the piston back down to the bottom of the cylinder. The spent air and fuel mixture is then expelled out of the exhaust as the piston comes up again. The more air that enters the combustion chamber, the more fuel that can be added; more air and fuel means a larger explosion moving the piston faster which equates to more horsepower. This is why superchargers and turbochargers add more horsepower, they force more air and fuel into the combustion chamber. Keep in mind, not all air is created equal.

The key factor in this whole equation is oxygen! Without oxygen, there is no combustion. The amount of oxygen in "air" itself depends on multiple factors. For starters, as elevation increases oxygen density depletes. If you've ever been at extreme heights, you may have noticed it gets more difficult to breathe; this struggle to breathe is something your engine will also feel. Less oxygen means less fuel and a smaller explosion in an engine's combustion chamber, resulting in less horsepower. Not only will altitude affect oxygen density, so will temperature. Cooler air is naturally packed with more oxygen molecules than hotter air. Low- or high-pressure systems, humidity, and other weather patterns all have their effect on oxygen density. Given that everyday conditions and geological locations greatly affect horsepower, what do we do about it?

The best thing to get desired speeds when horsepower is lacking is to get RPMs up by re-pitching your jet pump impeller. Re-pitching a jet pump impeller is very simple, almost anyone can do it. Generally, more RPMs lead to more speed! In the GreenHulk Store, you will find digital tachometers that read exact engine RPMs and are necessary to get your RPMs dialed in perfectly. Once installed, you can decrease the trailing edge impeller pitch until your desired RPMs are reached. It is important you only re-pitch the trailing edge of your impeller to gain or lower RPM. Personally, I like to pitch the trailing edge of my impellers to get 150-200 RPMs less than the rev-limiter of whatever tune I am running. After you have your RPMs where you want them, you'll notice you've gained any speed you may have lost due to altitude or other weather factors. Most importantly, you will be getting the advertised speeds, or better, from the performance parts you just installed!



his Vintage Feature provides a glimpse into the eighties as we introduce a custom original JS550 designed and modified by the late Gary Hart. "Super G" as Gary was known, was the founder and owner of Jettrim and his legendary mats, scalloped paint designs, early widened tray mods, bars, braces, hoods and glass work make this legendary ski a true diamond in the rough. Finding this ski with many unique and very sought after Jettrim parts made this build very special as Gary and I worked together creating the Vintage Jet Ski Museum for many IJSBA World Finals. I'm proud to see this particular creation come to completion. The crisp paint by JeffSki laid down in the mid to late 80's looks like the day it rolled out of the paint booth. My son, Chad Campbell found it stored in a local airport hangar. Recognizing the legendary "Super G" design I immediately called the owner and secured the purchase of this rare original. The hull was stored under covers, completely disassembled in the hangar with all its parts crammed into various boxes and bags. This amazing '85 hull was just screaming to be completed. The JeffSki paint you see in the photos, as well as the custom Jettrim mats and accoutrements put the cherry on top.

Work immediately began on freshening up the engine and pump. But there were problems, a hull leak and the pump was trash. Once we evaluated the condition of the JS pump and made hull repairs, we decided to upgrade the back half to a modified SX pump. Sourcing the parts and making the necessary modifications was a breeze as my son and a few industry leaders came up with several custom pump/prop combos that worked extremely well and were proven on our previous builds. Doing this gave homage to a true "Vintage Jet Ski" without doing a 750 swap or making unnecessary modifications

As the work continued on the "Super G" hull, a lot of cleaning, polishing and repairing of each part took place. Many hours of work went into prepping and completing this time capsule. To our surprise the hull was void of all exhaust outlets as they were glassed over during body mods. A Rhaas right hand billet exhaust was decided upon and we couldn't be happier with the results. A few unknowns took place as many builds do. But once completed, the day of reckoning came. A trip to Lake Havasu City Body Beach during this years' Mark Hahn 300 proved a great success. I felt Gary was with me. The "Super G" ski rips and looks as Bitchin as Gary's Stichin. Keep an eye out for me on the lakes, this vintage beauty is hard to ignore. PR



Jason Chait aka 'Jason Frank' has been riding skis recreationally since he was 18. A 20-year EMT, Jason is Admin and page originator of the Jersey Shore PWC Riders, Co-Host of Yeah Buddy Productions Rec Ride Report, Admin of Sea-Doo 300 Enthusiasts Official on Facebook, and several others. Jason recently shared some background and exciting plans for the year.

PRO RIDER: Please tell us a little about yourself. What motivated you to establish the Jersey Shore PWC Riders?

JASON CHAIT: I started on a Sea-Doo SPI and Sea-Doo SPX in 1999 then sold them for a supercharger for my Ford Mustang. Years later I rented a jet ski in the keys and caught the bug all over again. Since then I've owned Sea-Doos and Yamahas but as a technology and ergonomic person, the Sea-Doo brand keeps drawing me back. Currently I own a 2018 Sea-Doo RXT X 300 with a few modifications. In 2016 frustrated with the lack of organization getting people together for group rides, along with Marco Fiorenza and Tommy Branella, Jersey Shore PWC Riders page was established to come together, share photos, share rides, sell items, and most importantly help one another with their jet skis. The group took off with members along the Jersey shore, New York, and Pennsylvania. Most events are planned for the Atlantic City area; the scenery on the Jersey coast is amazing. Groups and individuals are encouraged to join. This year we are expecting Ohio PWC Enthusiasts, Strong Island and Buffalo Ski Riders to join us.

Riding the inlets, bays and intercoastal waterways we encounter dolphins, lighthouses, marshes with swooping turns that challenge your skills and your skis!

In 2018 we partnered with Pro Watercross Rec Tour to develop a ride where all proceeds went to the Wounded Warriors Project. Close to 50 skis participated. Boats lined up the intercoastal taking photos and videos of our group as we passed. As we cruised into Atlantic City a video from one of the casinos was taken of us passing in the ocean. The video ended up on the 6 o'clock news!

PR: How did you become involved in the Yeah **Buddy Show?**

JE: In 2018 after meeting Kenny Kgees (host of Yeah Buddy Productions Rec Ride Report) we developed a great friendship. Kenny has mentored me a lot with non jet ski issues and provides great advice. Kenny left the two networks he had a segment on for recreational riding and I stressed to him well before he left, that he has a great following and great personality and needed to host a show on his own. Running a podcast/livecast is no easy task! Kenny and I both knew that but there came a time where he said after badgering him constantly, the community needs a voice and it's time to do this. He said he wasn't doing this without me. The PWC community responded in positive ways we couldn't even imagine. Tune in the Yeah Buddy Productions Rec Ride Report on Facebook Thursday nights at 8:00pm EST.

PR: What is your best advice to PWC owners?

My best advice for PWC owners is simple: read the owner's manual, as corny as that sounds it has all the answers you need without looking for advice on the internet and potentially being steered the wrong way; also pick the brains of the professionals in specialized performance shops!

PR: What are your plans for 2021?

For 2021 I am looking forward to continually unifying the community and promoting this sport positively and professionally. My beautiful girlfriend Caitlin who has been helping me with the podcast and planning the June 19th Jersey Shore PWC Riders charity event to help raise money for Make-A-Wish. is relatively new to the sport so I can't wait to share my passion with her. We have a lot of great rides planned. I look forward to meeting new people nationwide and locally. This is going to be an amazing year and I'm eager to share my experiences on the Jersey Shore PWC Riders page and Yeah Buddy Productions Rec Ride Report for all!



t just 18 years old, Tory Snyder has accumulated some major hardware over the past few years. Tory didn't become serious about racing until 2018—that's when the spark ignited, and determination set in. Pro Rider recently caught up with Tory's dad, Troy, a highly decorated 2 X Kings Cup Champion, 3 X IJSBA World Champion, 9 X USA National Champion and Tory's biggest fan.

PRO RIMER: When did Tory first start racing? What prompted him to start?

TROY SAUDER: Tory started racing in 2013 in Islamorada, Florida at age 10 on a Sea-Doo XP800. He raced basically because I was making him. I stopped forcing him and let him find his own way. He stopped racing shortly thereafter. One day in 2018 he said, "hey dad what are you going to do with that Yamaha EX?" My reply—"it's sitting there waiting for you to want to race again." That is when the spark ignited, and determination set in.

PR: What classes did Tory race in 2020 and in 2021?

15: Tory started 2020 on the Pro Watercross tour in Amateur Box Stock and won every race that year in that class. When we got to IJSBA World Finals I had a broken leg, so I let him move up to Pro Stock on my boats where he won the very first moto enroute to 4th overall and ended up winning Pro Open and Pro Endurance at Lake Havasu World Finals. This year he's racing Pro Stock and Pro Runabout GP on the Pro Watercross tour and Pro Enduro 300 on the P1Aquax tour. He'll race Pro Stock and Pro Limited at the IJSBA World Finals and Pro Stock in Poland at the IJSBA World Series events.

As a father, what has been most rewarding and what are you most proud of regarding Tory?

75: The most rewarding aspect has been seeing him go from "dad I don't want to race to dad I want to race" and then winning 3 world titles and the opening round of P1 Aquax. It shows how much youngsters soak up being raised at the race site around competition and the good people of jet ski racing, good, competitive fun!

PR: What are Tory's racing plans for 2021?

15: To be on the podium at P1Aquax and IJSBA World Finals and put his name next to mine in Thailand Kings Cup later this year.










YESTERDAY'S HOME RUNS DON'T WIN TODAY'S GAMES

FITNESS TIP

GET STRONGER WITH WHOLE BODY TRAINING

Babe was right. You can't live on yesterday's successes or defeats. That day has come and gone. It's today that matters. You want to progress? You want to succeed? You want to win? Learn from yesterday, but focus on today. Winning isn't just getting a trophy; it's about bettering yourself every day of your life. If you advance yourself in everything you do (work, family life, training, competition), every single day, you're winning. Look back but never go back. Winning is forward thinking.

DEADLIFTS-WHOLE BODY TRAINING

OVERVIEW: The deadlift is a core exercise and fundamental movement of everyday life. It's one of the 'king' movements in strength and conditioning. In short, you squat down, grab an object and standup. So simple yet so complex. There is something magical and satisfying about lifting an extremely heavy weight. With each lift, you get stronger and each time you perform such a lift, you push to lift more. Yesterday, as Babe Ruth implies, isn't good enough, and so today, you load more weight on the bar to challenge yourself. Today, if you lift more weight or perform an additional repetition, you 'win'. Looking for inspiration? Simply Google or YouTube Hafthor Bjornsson (Game of Thrones "the Mountain") and see the 2020 COVID world record 1.104 lb. deadlift.

BASICS: There are two methods for this lift (parallel stance or sumo stance). In this article, I'll describe the parallel stance. First, stand behind the object (typically an Olympic weight bar) with your feet pointing forward and your stance shoulder width apart (Photo 1). Squat down lowering your thighs and butt keeping your head up and back straight (Photo 2). Hold the bar with an opposing grip (one hand over and one hand under the bar). Keep the bar close to the shins (Photo 1 & 2). With the legs, begin standing, ensuring your head is up and back remains straight. The bar will drag along the shins and thighs (Photo 3). Continue an upward motion until you are fully standing erect (Photo 4). At this point lower the bar to the ground reversing the movement until the bar/plates touch the floor.

PRECAUTIONS: Maintaining a straight back is a critical part of the movement. When there is more weight than a person can safely lift, there is a tendency for the hips to rise faster than the bar which causes bending or rounding (flexion) of the spine. This places excessive stress on the intervertebral discs of the spine leading to back injuries. Therefore, keep the head moving towards the ceiling and ensure your shoulders and hips rise at the same speed. Do not allow the hips to outpace the upper body. Many forget that when lowering the bar to the floor, there is still stress on the back and the exercise is not over. Again, lower the bar in the same reverse manner as you lifted the bar until the bar rests on the floor. Safety is paramount.

EXERCISE RELEVANCE TO PWC: Regardless of standup or sit-down PWC, the legs, back, and upper body play a major role in controlling the vehicle. The stronger the entire body, the less fatigue while racing which equates to faster times in straight a-ways or cornering. And if riding for recreation, the same applies

PRESCRIPTION: Deadlifts can complement other exercises or be a stand-alone workout

DAYS OF THE WEEK: Once every 5 to 8 days

(Due to intensity, this is often performed 1x a week, not more)

BEGINNERS: 2 – 3 sets of 6 – 8 repetitions (learn the form before increasing weight)

INTERMEDIATE: 3 – 4 sets of 5 – 6 repetitions

ADVANCED: 4-5 sets of 2-3 repetitions one week (heavy) and

4 - 6 repetitions (lighter) opposite weeks



n a sleepy, picturesque village on the northern shore of the great Lake Taupo, lies Kinloch, home to the annual end of summer. New Zealand AquaX Grand Prix. Riders from both North and South Islands met as they challenged for a coveted title

Cancelled in 2020 because of Covid, Kiwis acknowledge how fortunate we are in New Zealand to be COVID free, for now anyway. This rare and precious freedom enabled us to resume a normality other nations only dream of. Knowing we are one case away from social restrictions, we all eagerly attended this year's event.

When we set up the course, the lake was like a millpond. It was a chilly 6 degrees Celsius, and the predicted rain had not arrived. The pilots had, however, pulling up with trailers laden with skis. The race site took shape with marquees erected and skis unloaded onto trolleys. Old friends greeted each other, shared stories, and commented how the young racers had grown. This event attracted more racers than usual to compete for silverware and prize money.

Lake Taupo, in the centre of the North Island, has a weather pattern all its own. High winds blew and waves were over a metre high.

As a UIM affiliated club classes are categorised by horsepower and include pole skis and runabouts. We ran a total of six classes. Runabout GP 1, the open supercharged class battled it out since the start of summer back in December; this was their final chance to post points for the season. Zach Prevette was undefeated and this event was to be no different. Apart from falling from his ski in the first race, he maintained a strong lead in every other race on his midnight purple 2021 RXP-X 300 RS, a stock ski that qualified for GP2, which he also won.

Runabout GP3 skis are under 200hp and are naturally aspirated. The class includes Sea-Doo GTX170s, Sea-Doo 155s, Yamaha VXR, Yamaha FXHO and a GP4 Spark racing up a class. These skis are largely stock, the type used commonly for recreational riding.

The AquaX GP3 Grand Prix was taken out by 16-year-old rider, Ben Morris from Christchurch racing a Yamaha VXR. The season, however, was won by the over 60-year-old, Club President, Dave Vennell.

Runabout GP4 is limited to EX Yamahas and Sea-Doo Sparks, small plastic skis that have become very popular on the harbours and lakes of New Zealand and are ideal entry level to racing being affordable, nimble, fun to ride and quick enough to provide enthralling racing without great risk of injury in the event of a mishap.

South Island took the GP4 spoils with Ollie Morris winning the AquaX GP4 Grand Prix. The GP3 pole ski class (from stock up to modified Rec Lites) was the largest class with pilots ranging from 12 to 64 years old. This class was won by 16 year old Corban Farnley from Christchurch, a current IJSBA World Champion.

The inclusion of Rookie races unearths new talent and allows recent inductees to learn their craft in a controlled environment.

The event concluded with prizegiving including trophies, certificates, and cash. As in previous years perpetual trophies were awarded to Rider of the Year, Zach Prevette, and Member of the Year, this time President Dave Vennell for his ongoing commitment to the sport. PR






