Following daily sessions on and off the water learning to safely attempt to backflip, Anna completed her first backflip in July at the age of 13! Anyzeski shared, "Anna is an absolute sweetheart, a talented young lady with the potential to go far in the sport. I couldn't believe how motivated and tough she was learning how to do her first backflip. Aside from jet skis Anna does very well in school. To my knowledge,

Anna is the youngest female to do a backflip on a jetski. Her family is the first I know of daughter, mother, and father to all three complete a backflip on flat water skis." Anyzeski started his training business Freestyle Connection under the supervision of Wamiltons Customs in 2008. "Wamilton helped shape me as a rider and guided me how to help other riders excel. People skills is a trait I pride myself on, riding is my #1 passion, mixing the two was easy. My motivation is seeing people reach their goals. Aside from training riders on their own watercraft. I started a backflip jetski rental in 2018 with Ricker RRP. As far as I know I'm the only school in the world where you can rent a 1200cc competition ski and get trained how to backflip."

MEET STRONGMAN TURNED WAVE JUMPER/RACER: A CHAT WITH WARRICK BRANT

Pro Rider caught up with strongman title holder Warrick Brant who graciously shared the following:

"I've always loved the water and motorsports. It was no surprise when I saw jet ski racing on TV I was hooked. At age eleven I rode my first jet ski, a JS440 and spent hours playing on it in the garage waiting for the weekend. Yamaha brought out the new Superjet the sexiest thing I'd ever seen. My father brought home 2 brand new SJs with the grey and yellow decals. The passion I felt that day still flows through my veins.

I got into Strongman after breaking my neck playing rugby professionally. After 2 surgeries, 8 screws and 3 metal plates I was back on my feet. My journey started in bodybuilding and powerlifting before I stepped into the world of Strongman. I had a very successful career, never won world's strongest man but was the first and only Australian to make it to the 2014 finals. That year I won Southern Hemisphere's Strongest Man title and was undefeated as Australia's Strongest Man over my 10-year career.

Gold Coast Australia is the best place to ride a PWC. We launch off 3–4-foot perfect swells, whale watch and cruise through the spectacular Broadwater. For racing I don't mind the rough stuff. If you want to get

into strength sport be prepared to work hard for it. You are your own machine, feed it, rest it, look after it, keep to the basics, get a coach/ trainer with proper experience. I offer online coaching if anybody is interested. When it comes to jet skiing, join a club, get to a few test/demo days, find the ski that is right for you and what you want to do on it. Many cowboys get their license and the fastest ski and never learn the art of riding. Spend a year on an old JS440/550 and learn the roots of the sport. Support the clubs and people who keep the sport going. Ride because you love it.'



The addition of foot chocks placed where the footwells meet the stern provide a secure stance when riding standing up and effectively transfer body weight input to the hull when riding freestyle.

The new custom-tuned Electric Trim feature allows the rider to transform the JetBlaster's riding characteristics from serious to playful and everywhere in between. untersville, Alabama is known for big races. Less than two hours from Talladega is Guntersville Lake which plays host to one of America's largest watercraft racing events – the Guntersville Lake HydroFest. Alongside H1 Unlimited Hydroplanes and the ProTunnel classes of Powerboat Nationals, HydroCross Nationals returned to Alabama in 2021 with its ProSport (Sport GP) series.

HydroCross Nationals debuted at HydroFest in 2019 to rave reviews with Team Faith's Kelly Smith taking home the hardware in the inaugural event. Smith was back in 2021 to defend his title.

"We're ready. (2019) was really kind of our debut for the Huracan-R and to get our first win with it was definitely amazing," said Smith before qualifying.

The field included two past series World Champions, Kyle Hayes ('18) and Tom Keller ('19), two teen phenoms in Deven Farthing and Haden Skellett, and veteran riders including Johnny Smith and Matt Johnson. When the green dropped, Kelly Smith on his Team Faith Huracan-R beat the fleet to the hole shot and grabbed P1 early.

Farthing and Skellett were locked in solid battle for fourth, but Farthing slipped off his boat on the opening lap and was forced to catch up. Skellett got by Kyle Hayes and moved up to third. Lake Guntersville claimed leader Kelly Smith as he got spun around and went for a dip. Matt Johnson took the lead but surrendered the spot to Johnny Smith when he went for his trip around the joker.


As laps progressed, Kelly Smith worked his way back into second. When Johnny Smith went for his trip around the joker, he gave the lead back to Kelly Smith and kept it to the end with Haden Skellett finishing second and Matt Johnson third.

"I definitely made it hard on myself having the spin-out where I came off and had to climb back on," said the back-to-back Guntersville winner Smith. "Not the way I really wanted to get it done because I was getting a pretty sizable lead at the beginning of that race and felt that I was pulling away."

his project started a year ago when father and son Dave and Jake Zier contacted me as I specialize in restoration work in the industry. They crated the craft and shipped it from Indiana to Las Vegas for the magic to start! The paint needed to be redone due to a large "for sale" fading through the neon orange. There was body damage on the hull from years of Pro racing. Longtime watercraft master painter Don Serrano duplicated the paint after prep and fiberglass work. Fortunately, the original carbon fiber was in excellent condition. Brandon of BP Concepts & Designs in Vegas was a no brainer for the vinyl. My job was to source and rebuild the engine parts, most important short block was replaced for an OEM Kawasaki power plant with the bolt-ons from the original set up.

 Cleaned, powder coated and installed new parts to the dual Mikuni 38mm BN carbs, KV Total loss ignition with aluminum total loss flywheel, PJS exhaust system with reed chamber, modified 440 pump and Extrude Honed to stage 5. Motor was a PJS reed 550cc cylinder with OEM 550 JS cases and a true and welded rebuilt crankshaft by Jeff Seebold of Competitive Crankshafts. I had this reed cylinder from a complete re-sleeve and new standard bore pistons for a new motor; ported it to stage 5 that is race only and a PJS race head with copper head and base gaskets; topped off with an original &N filter.

A unique aspect of this craft is what was done to the hull. Looking closely, you can see the top deck was cut off an original Kawasaki JS550 watercraft and a custom top deck and hood installed made of carbon fiber by SRS of Indianapolis who was big in making carbon fiber pieces for INDY. A reliable source stated only three were made. This one, the Number #7, was raced by Jacque "The Hammer" Bryant, a fast pro standup racer in the 80's and successful race promoter and later Race Director for the IJSBA World Finals.

Upon completion Jake said, "I love it! Happy to own history. Gary Hart would be proud." PR

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












VIRTUAL FREESTYLE PARTICIPATION UP 40% OVER LAST YEAR!

he United Kingdom, Finland, USA, Germany, and Australia were represented in this year's Virtual British Freestyle Championships, a truly international event sponsored by TJ Products. Building on the success of the first ever virtual freestyle jet ski championships and flying the flag for freestyle despite covid restrictions, the 2021 event saw 40% growth in participation. 27 competitors submitted their best two-minute routines during the filming window, with Tim Plumpton adding his unique brand of commentary. The event was screened on Facebook and YouTube in July and offered a real depth of freestyle talent across five classes.

The British 800cc class was won by Steve Riley, a first time British champion, who impressed with a packed, exciting, flawless old school routine. He narrowly edged out Darren Ogden (2nd) and Paul Hewitt (3rd).

The 900cc International class was taken the second year running by USA wonderkid Nolan Jukish, one half of the Jukish super duo. Adam Reynolds won the 900cc British class the second year running and Best Trick.

Tony Blair caught the eye in 1200 International Novice, edging ahead of competitors in this class, all of whom were competing in their first ever freestyle competition. Former fighter pilot Tony also won the Most Inspirational Newcomer Award, voted by the public and kindly sponsored by Tommo's Dream Foundation (TDF). Pro flyboarder James Curtis repeated last year's feat, winning the 1200cc British class before flying off to join his flyboard team in China. The 1200cc International class attracted world caliber competitors. Mark Gomez took the title with a jaw dropping display, challenged all the way by the ever-improving Gabe Jukish; Neal Smith took third.

Following demand from riders, organizers added a new class at short notice; 800cc International Open. This was equally compet-

itive, with Germany's Thomas Wolf narrowly edging out Mark Gomez with an aggressive and well executed compilation. USA's Gary Burtka (Team Twangled) took 3rd.

Congratulations to 2021 Novice Virtual Champions: Brian Fredericksen (900cc Int); Bailey Cunningham (800cc Int).

As well as setting a new benchmark in freestyle events, the Virtual Championships brought together arguably the most experienced freestyle judging panel for a single event: Vaclav Zacek, Michael Ratti, Marc Sickerling, Keith Thomas, Mark Curtis, and Martin Pearce. 

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
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

natural phenomenon 'luminescence' occurs when lightning and earthquakes happen simultaneously, making the ground look like it cracks open, with electricity and lightning emerging forth. That's the best way I can describe Andrzej Wisniewski. He never stops moving, he is electrifying, and he is grounded. No wonder his nickname is 'Amper'.

Andrzej is Aquabike's top Runabout GP 1 rider, top seed, equivalent to a world number one. The amount of excellent racing he's done in a remarkably short career is noteworthy, and he started later than most at 39. He has podiumed 7 times and been Polish Champion for several years running.

I spent three weeks with Andrzej and the Black Shadows Power Team, a disciplined and structured team, very close-knit working together like a well-oiled machine, and they are positive. Looking at Andrzej, it's easy to see a reflection of his personality in the team. He is charismatic, A-type personality, and a perfectionist. A tenacious fighter relentless in his commitment to his racing and his business, he shares these traits with high performing racers and mechanics; 12-hour workdays, long practices, multiple responsibilities, and still fitting in time with family.

Andrzej, a humble and generous soul, is full of praise for his competitors. He works in the construction business and grew up in the (then) small town of Elk, Poland, a ranch kid, helping his parents raise pigs and cows. All these years later, Andrzej is a cornerstone of Elk's commercial growth, seeing it become a hub for European holiday makers and growing businesses.

Most of all, Andrzej can be described as a family man. His two children, Paulina and Patryk, embody the Wisniewski spirit: persistence, tenacity, and hard work. Paulina works with Andrzej at his construction company, Patryk is finishing his dentistry degree. Part of his family includes Black Shadows Power Teammates: Lukasz, Anita (his niece) and Derek.

The only place you might see aggression from Andrzej is on the racecourse. He is a Chihuahua dad for crying out loud. He

traded in German Shepherds for Chihuahuas once Paulina got her first, Escobar. It takes a secure man to have a posse of Chihuahuas. Luckily, his very supportive girlfriend, Julie has no problem vying for attention with them. The pair met at dinner once. Andrzej was immediately taken, and Julie said, and I quote, "He is not bad."

In high adrenaline sports, especially the rough and tough world of Runabout GP 1, you expect a certain amount of male bravado. He has the look; a shaved head (for aerodynamics), stout build, blazing black, red, and white boat representing Poland. While Andrzej is what you would call macho, he has zero reservations about making friends with competitors, and never says a single word to uplift his performance over theirs. This spirit of generosity is important for the sport, and it is what led Andrzej to support and contribute to the last two Aquabike tour stops in Poland.

Andrzej wants to be remembered as a kind person, with a heart of gold. He wants his kids to grow up responsible and have the right relationships. He wants his staff to have a new office, to insure their future. He wants to help his friends and make Julie happy. I asked him "What about for yourself?" He wants good health and maybe one day, once racing is done for him, get back to kite surfing.

Andrzej races the number 25 because he wants to race like he is 25 years old always. I only wish half of us had the wisdom, drive, and kindness of this Polish racer at any age, because the sport, and our world, would be the better for it; we need some of that 25 luminescence. PR



Navigation needs to be well planned for group rides; leaders should be capable of decision making, navigation of water knowledge and demonstrate safety leadership abilities. Group leaders plan the event route and know the navigational hazards and laws of the waters your trip is covering and should address issues such as:

- Pre-ride checks of oil, battery, extra fuel secure, safety equipment required
- Sea conditions, swell, wind & weather forecast and tides
- Emergency services contacts
- All group ride leaders need to have reliable communication devices such as intercoms, VHF/UHF radios and mobile phones to communicate during the ride. They should wear a work safe fluorescent colored vest over life jacket to be easily identified within the group.


























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GREENHULK NET PWC PERFORMANCE FORUM

AWARENESS

hile PWC performance is our specialty, safety is our top priority. A recent trip to the beach, countless riders were enjoying their PWCs, however, there were a few not too keen on the safety of themselves or others. Riding PWCs is fun; don't let ill safety practices ruin the experience.

For 2021, over 60 percent of PWC sales were first time buyers. The increase of new riders is terrific for the growth of the industry. New riders need to be informed on proper safety, boating laws, and general practices to ensure excellent experiences. Some may feel like wearing a personal flotation device (PFD) is common sense, but sometimes common sense isn't so common. Unfortunately, I witnessed a small group of younger riders operating their PWCs without a PFD; not only is it required by law, but wearing a PFD is designed to save your life. In the event of an accident, collision, or being thrown off, the PFD keeps you afloat; you don't look any cooler sporting around on your PWC shirtless with no personal floatation device. Another safe practice is to securely fasten the safety lanyard; the most common is a lanyard that fits snugly around your wrist or a clip fastened to your PFD. Using the safety lanyard properly will shut off the engine and allow for retrieval of your PWC if you fall off; try to swim back to a running PWC, it's nearly impossible!

Personal watercraft are low-draft machines, requiring only a few inches of water to float, but they are not shallow water friendly. PWCs are equipped with jet drives for propulsion; these jet drives act as a vacuum sucking in anything in its way and forcing it out the back of the jet nozzle. Sand, weeds, gravel, any form of debris passing through the jet pump can cause premature wear or severe damage. It's best to operate in a minimum of three feet of water; running your PWC up on a beach is not advised.

If you witness poor safety practices or someone struggling to operate their PWC, please lend a helping hand. A surplus of newer, less-experienced riders will undoubtedly cause an increase in mistakes made, individuals turned away from the sport, and unfortunately, accidents. We want nothing more than for the PWC industry to thrive. Offering advice to less experienced riders could make the difference between them deciding to list their PWC for sale or loving the sport for years to come.






Most of us only see that one great individual performance in competition that wins the event without giving thought to the thousands of hours of preparation, endless mistakes, and failures it took to reach that moment. As one of the greatest athletes in basketball history, Michael Jordon summarizes his legendary success so well. Most of us fail more than we succeed, but it's those who use failure as a motivator to keep fighting, who ultimately win. In the words of Olympic Gold Medalist Women's Soccer Goalkeeper Hope Solo, "True heroes are made of hard work and integrity." Winning comes from turning failure into success through years of hard work while learning from our mistakes.

MAINTAINING CONTROL OF PWC REQUIRES UPPER BODY STRENGTH

TRICEPS PRESS-DOWNS-WORKING THE BACK OF THE ARMS

OVERVIEW: The primary purpose of the Triceps Press-Down is to strengthen the back of the arm. This exercise requires a machine with a cable and weight-stack. It can be performed using different devices providing endless variety. For example, the straight bar, V-bar, wave bar, and ropes, allow you to change the angle of your grip and in turn provide different resistant pressure on the triceps muscle group.

BASICS: Triceps Press-Downs are a simple exercise. For this example, the demonstrator is using a rope which keeps the hands in a neutral (handshake) position. The basics described apply regardless of apparatus. Begin by maintaining a solid base with feet shoulder width. Keeping your back straight, place both hands on the ropes (Photo 1) with the arms bent (flexed) and elbows to sides. Move the rope downward keeping elbows at your side while straightening (extending) the arms (Photo 2). Once the arms are straight (Photo 3), return arms to a flexed position and begin the next repetition (Photo 1).

EXERCISE RELEVANCE TO PWC: Maintaining control of the handlebars requires upper body muscle strength and pushing on the bars during a turn requires triceps strength. Triceps are used extensively, especially in rough waters.

PRESCRIPTION: Triceps Press-Downs are typically one exercise that is completed in conjunction with other triceps exercises

DAYS OF THE WEEK: 2x a week

BEGINNERS: 2 – 3 sets of 8 – 12 repetitions

INTERMEDIATE: 3-4 sets of 8-10 repetitions (growth);

6 – 8 repetitions for added strength

ADVANCED: 4 – 5 sets of 8 – 10 repetitions one week (lighter)

and 6 – 8 repetitions (heavy)

25th Annual Tennessee River 600

Raises Funds, Promotes Safety, Portrays PWCs in Positive Light

he Tennessee River 600, which began in 1997 as a pleasure event for personal watercraft enthusiasts, has evolved into an annual event with participants representing as many as 20 states and Canada. Funds raised from participants and sponsors are divided equally among The Children's Hospital, Birmingham, AL; and Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency. The Children's Hospital, Birmingham, AL is a member of the Children's Miracle Network Hospitals, an alliance of premier hospitals for children and one of the world's leading children's charities working to save and improve the lives of millions

of children. The TWRA is an organization dedicated to the preservation, conservation, and enhancement of Tennessee's outdoors, including fostering the safe use of the state's waters. The event is designed to promote Tennessee tourism and water safety, as well as to portray PWCs in a positive light. This event is the longest running organized event in the United States for personal watercraft.

Families and support crew travel by land and meet riders at overnight stops. Events are planned for participants at each stop, and sightseeing is a priority. In the past, the event has been fortunate to have doctors, emergency medical technicians, mechanics, and other professionals riding the river to assist with any health issues or watercraft failures. Past participants have included a dog riding with his master, an 82-year-old man from Alabama, and a 4-year-old boy accompanied by his dad.


Participants locked through eight TVA dams during the week-long journey. Support services were provided by the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary, Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency, Tennessee Valley Authority, Tennessee State Parks, Tennessee Department of Tourist Development, and the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers. All these agencies help make this a safe and fun trip for everyone.

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


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
