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The World Cup (King's Cup) Jet Ski race in Pattaya, Thailand welcomed racers from around the world. Tech walked the beach performing pre-race technical inspections for safety including helmets and equipment to ensure good condition. All racers report to the technical area for watercraft inspection. Paint is applied to specific nuts and bolts so parts cannot be changed. Breaking a seal on painted parts is grounds for disqualification. Following the final moto of each class the top three are again inspected. Stock class is a class we go the furthest into. All two stroke classes pulled flywheels, cylinders, and pumps for complete inspection. Four stroke class had heads pulled and inspected. We check the cams, injectors, exhaust system, pump and intake and perform a bore and stroke to validate the CCs allowed for that class. Pro-Am Runabout Stock was the biggest class which we tore down to the crankshafts. Crankshafts, rods, and pistons were weighed to ensure within rules.

Pictures of the motors apart:

This race is the final round for the Triple Crown Championship. Racers start in Europe for round one; round two is World Finals in Lake Havasu, third stop is Thailand. Winning their classes from the United States were Tory Snyder in Pro-Am Runabout Stock, Valentina Lezcano in 1100 Runabout Stock, and Troy Snyder Veteran Expert Runabout. Other Triple Crown winners included Mohammed Burbayea from Kuwait, GP Runabout, Quinten Bossche from Belgium, Pro Ski GP, and Johichiroh Katano from Japan, Pro Sport GP. **PR**

Youngsters get the benefit from others' years of experience, newbies (no matter how old!) also get to learn. There are no egos on ride days.


That's the beauty of ride days: the club specifically states NO racing during ride events. The purpose of ride days is to tune skis, practice rounding buoys, but most of all, have fun, hang out and enjoy each other, allowing everyone from novice to grandmaster to ride, compare tips and strategies and lend a hand helping tune skis. 





I was into motorcycles, heavy equipment, anything with an engine. First time seeing a jetski in person was my high school freshman year . I didn't even know standups existed. I was introduced to the jetski world by a very memorable man/ ex-racer, the late Kris Frost. I had no idea how big an impact these machines would have on my life down the road.

My first experience was on a Kawasaki JS550. I remember how sore I was the following day. The lake life was never something my family had the opportunity to get into, but I was dead set on getting a ski! \$295 and a 45-minute drive I became the proud owner of a 1990 550SX with sweet performance goodies. It needed life breathed back into it, I undertook the task myself. I became addicted. After working a CNC job, I was no stranger to jetski mechanics and decided to make my own custom hardware from titanium and anodize it. In 2021 I made a small company and patented the head nut/bolt design.

PR: What are you most proud of regarding your business?

CC: I'm proud to offer the highest quality hardware in the world for prices average persons can afford, a product that lasts a lifetime, something people are proud to own, something 100 years from now whoever owns the machine will still be able to appreciate.

After a few rides a fire of ambition was ignited. I wanted to ride everything in the PNW, problem was I didn't know anyone with a PWC. I have experience sailing and kayaking in cold water conditions, so I know the risks and importance of riding with skilled properly equipped people. Nine months after starting the group we have 250 members and growing.

M: Not surprisingly with the types of rides we do and because of the common interest, we have become good friends that depend on each other for safety and ultimately ride the most exciting waters on the west coast:

We ride any day in almost any conditions. We prepare, practice, and have the proper gear to maintain safety. Last summer it was 120°F on the Columbia and December 15°F on Puget Sound. We are planning four Pacific Ocean rides and an inside passage ride from Alaska to Seattle.

In H: Best ride was the Pacific Ocean ride out of Westport, WA with 15 riders and family members. This was a bucket-list ride and one that tested skills and nerves. My wife and I went to the coast early to evaluate ocean conditions, wave patterns and safe zones for beaching. It was 38°F north wind 15 mph and 20-30' ocean swells. We got the machines in the water in full gear, communication, rescue lines and safety coordinators on land. Riding out, the elevation gain and descent over the giant winter swells was intimidating but easy to ride for the most part. Waves became steeper further out. A mile off the coast ended up being the sweet spot for riding big Pacific swells. Wave after wave we jumped until our arms were shot. It was a successful ride that most of us can't wait to do again!

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

since 1986, I've fished all my life mostly in the Gulf of Mexico, mostly from land. In 2000 I bought a kayak and fished from it for 15 years. NECESSITY AND SHO HISTORY OF THE ORIGINAL VERSIPLUG DRAIN SYSTEM Meet Chris Cialdella aka the PNC Poctor

















hen asked by his dad what he wanted to do when he grew up, a young Chris Cialdella replied, "I want to be an inventor and help people." His dad often let him break things on purpose and fix them laying the foundation for Chris to ultimately become an inventor, the inventor of Versiplug. Although he passed before Chris realized his dream, his dad was a strong creative force in his life.

PRO RIDER: Please tell us a little bit about yourself and your background.

CHRIS CIALDELLA: I started working when I was 14 and wound up working for 5 years in an engine shop doing cool stuff meeting cool people. I bought my first jet ski at age 18, a 1997 Yamaha GP 1200. Once I found the water that was my freedom, that's when I started making friends. Jet ski people are different, and the water is a very accepting place. At 19 I went to work with my dad as a helper in one of his businesses making dryers for printing presses. I got to travel around installing dryers and even helped design some - I made one for the Hershey Chocolate Co.

I rode like a maniac on the Delaware River. After going to the beach riding surf, I never rode anything else, it was heaven. In 2006, I consciously started doing something that brings me joy, the Daytona Freeride. I kept riding waves, the bigger the better. I worked on skis that broke, that's when PWC Doctor started. I couldn't find someone to fix my ski so had to fix it myself. People started bringing their skis for me to work on and started calling me "Doc."

PR: What motivated you to invent Versiplug?

E: It was 2006. The waves were huge. I kept trying different bilge pumps-jump and sink, jump and sink. I was getting shocked while riding resulting in the creation of the Versiplug. I made the first one out of plastic - it worked! A friend recommended I take it to Havasu where I met with Hot Products. They added it in their catalog in 2007 and have been distributing worldwide ever since.

I met Dave Bamdas at Riva and they started selling my plugs.

PR: What are you most proud of regarding vour business?

EE: I am most proud I have chased what has been calling me and it has led me to be able to help people in ways I never dreamed of.

PR: When did Ty become a part of your family?

CC: Ty was 10 weeks old when I got him in 2005. He has been around jet skis all his life.

PR: Any special plans for 2022?

CC: We have new plugs coming out and variations of new products; more travel-l've made myself mobile. Ty and I will be hitting the road soon to travel and visit people who have supported me on this journey. I would like to share more than just a product; I want people to know happiness.

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



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PR TECH TIP

2022 watercraft have begun to hit showroom floors and consumers. New watercraft come with new questions and procedures to follow; most answers can be found in your owner's manual. The most controversial topic pertaining to new watercraft is undoubtedly the break-in period. Engine builders, long time enthusiasts, new buyers, and everyone in between has an opinion on proper engine break in with no clear answer as to what is right. The best way to break in a new PWC is to follow the procedure specified in your owner's manual.

> During the break in process, countless numbers of parts are moving for the first time and meshing. Some watercraft are computer limited for an 'x' number of hours to ensure engines are broken-in properly. You can override the computer limitation through aftermarket tuning, but that's not recommended. Computer limitations were purposely set by engineers that designed these engines and know what they're doing. For example, Sea-Doo has plasma coated

cylinder bores and require a longer break in time than Yamaha and Kawasaki.

The plasma coated cylinder bores on Sea-Doo watercraft is an extremely hard surface equating for a longer time for the piston rings to seat properly to the cylinders. This plasma coating is far different from iron sleeved engines that are more commonly found on other engines therefore requiring a different break-in process. Completely bypassing engine break in or improper care of your Sea-Doo can damage the coating or not allow for properly seated rings causing excess blow-by (air and fuel slipping past the piston rings on the compression stroke). When blow-by occurs, a significant decrease in engine performance and fuel economy is expected. While immediate damage is highly unlikely, long-term durability is sacrificed when the break-in period is bypassed. In short, to avoid blow-by, or any other damage, take time to properly break in your Sea-Doo engine.

Sea-Doo recommends a 10-hour breakin period while varying engine RPM and never hold the RPM at a steady range for an extended period. It is 10 hours, you want to get out and ride your new watercraft anyways, so please take the time and follow the recommended procedure. After that break-in period, head on over to greenhulk. net. We've got most RIVA Racing, all FIZZLE Intercoolers, and all WORX products available at a 10% discount when you use coupon code 'greenhulk'.

FITNESS TIP

Physiologically, muscle cannot grow until you damage it first, hence, the pain you feel 24-48 hours after workouts. Dissipating of pain in subsequent days is from the body healing and growing. Growing is in response to the stress from exercise and preparation for future stress (workouts). This is how we get bigger, faster, stronger, and able to endure longer under stress. For those who like exercise, pain is always welcome. Regardless, pain will subside with continued exercise, and you will grow!

Keeping with the 2022 theme we'll focus on an age-old exercise we all grew up with like the last issue where we covered push-ups.

WIDE GRIP OVERHAND PULL-UPS

BASICS: The Wide Grip Overhand Pull-Up (chin up) is one of the most basic exercises. It's strengthening characteristics are applicable to most activities and especially to PWC riding/racing. You don't need any special equipment; just a bar, found on any playground, fitness center or at your home.

Simply grip a bar with your hands facing away from the body. Beginners start with hands wider than shoulder width; advanced individuals can vary width. The exercise has three parts. First, start by hanging from the bar with arms straight (Photo 1). Second, begin by pulling yourself upward (Photo 2). Third, continue to pull yourself up until your chin reaches and crosses the bar (Photo 3). If unable to pull yourself up completely, pull up as far as you can and repeat. Another option is to bend the knees to 90 degrees and have a partner cup their hands under your ankles. The exerciser can use their legs to push while they pull with their arms (Photo 4). Individuals of most any strength are typically able to perform pull-ups with an assistant. With time, less assistance is needed. This isn't just an exercise for men, women are just as capable of performing pull-ups.

EXERCISE RELEVANCE TO PWC: Mimics holding the handlebars for both standup and sitdown riding. All pulling actions require the back, rear shoulders (delts), biceps and grip.

PRESCRIPTION: Exceptional back, rear shoulders, biceps and grip exercise

DAYS OF THE WEEK:	2 – 3 days of the week
BEGINNERS:	2 – 3 sets of 5 – 10 repetitions (you may need assistance when starting)
INTERMEDIATE:	3 – 4 sets of 8 – 10 repetitions (assistance as needed)
ADVANCED:	4 – 6 sets of 6 – 8 repetitions (weighted and/or spotter for assistance)

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


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
