On a reservoir of the Llano River, beneath the historic 1935 Roy B. Inks bridge in the heart of Llano the jet ski races evolved into an IJSBA sanctioned World Qualifying event, Jettribe



Racing's Mid-America Water-X Championship Series, organized by NautiWater Racing. Beyond the thrills of racing, Rock'n Riverfest features music spun by resident DJ/emcee, three evenings of live music, dozens of vendors, from crafts to souvenirs to a plethora of food options and, at night, the Llano VFD will shoot off fireworks displays. The crown jewel this year will be a twelve-car, 45-foot-tall Ferris wheel overlooking the race area. Rock'n Riverfest, organized by the Llano Christmas Lighting Committee, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit that organizes the town's lighted Christmas park, much of the event is free including the Ferris wheel. THE 18TH ANNUAL YAMAHA IJSBA MARK HAHN MEMORIAL HAVASU 300

fter 17 years, seasoned endurance racers know racing on a 10-mile course on Lake Havasu in the middle of winter can be a humbling experience. One never knows what Mother Nature has in store. This year's 18th Annual Yamaha IJSBA Mark Hahn Memorial Havasu 300 Presented by Hot Products, Riva, Jettrim & Impros was no different. Forecasts predicted varying

degrees of wind, these predictions came true as the wind gods let loose their fury and it only got worse. Safety boats couldn't launch due to high winds therefore the race was postponed and moved to Sunday as conditions were unsafe. Due to logistical considerations the 300-mile race was shortened to 3 hours plus 1 lap.

All entered race teams stayed and at 9:30 am the shotgun finally fired sending the wave of runabouts to take on the 10-mile course! One minute later, a second shotgun blast and the standup contingent was underway. The wind whipped up, but racers knew what they were in for and deftly pushed their machines to the limits. Attrition, always a factor in endurance racing is the nemesis of even the most experienced of teams.

With a shotgun blast signifying completion of the race, the Can-Am team #212 of previous Mark Hahn winner multi IJSBA World Champion Mike Klippenstein and co-rider, Ryder Wildeboer took the top spot completing 24 laps; 2nd place and 2022 "Ironman" went to Anthony Radetic #153, Abbeville, AL; 3rd the team of #88 Arnold Martinez, Beverly

Hills, CA and Nicolas Rius, Lake Havasu City 22 laps. In standup, the rookie

team of Justin Richey, Diego
Urrea and Blake Wicklund
#209 completed 15 laps
and took home gold. Ryder
Bliss, Logan Blanchard,
and Tyler Kennedy #492
finished 2nd; #418 team
of Reese Maricich, Tyler
Shinko and Shane Fonseca
finished 3rd. Havasu's own,
Aryana Thayer #831 won the
ronwoman" trophy for standup

"Ironwoman" trophy for standup completing 13 laps.

Racers took the good with the bad to make a memorable Mark Hahn Memorial. 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THE BLACK PEARL 'Certified Ripper'

icknamed The Black Pearl this project started in April of 2020 after shipping the ski from Florida to Washington. Although a great base to build upon, this 2010 Wamilton's Platinum Edition Superjet was rough. The paint and graphics were faded from years of baking in the Florida sun; saltwater left its mark on all the hardware, and it had seen some fiberglass and gel coat damage.

As with all our projects Robert Jordan of Dugan Race Prep and I, put our own spin on a previously top-of-the-line ski and decided it was time for some much-needed updates.

We resurrected what was there and rescued the custom Wamilton's pieces. Quickly afterwards we upgraded to a fresh 760-cylinder 62T motor, coupled with a ported factory B pipe and a pair of Mikuni 44s. We ditched the previous stock 144mm pump and plastic pump shoe and crammed a massive 155mm pump and aluminum pump shoe into this hull. Hull and composite repairs from Ali G Design and paint from Screwy Designs and this boat looks almost as good as it performs. We stamped it "certified ripper" and it's been terrorizing the high seas ever since.

So, it was exciting to see them get engaged on the launch pad. We love Angelica and her family, and we are so happy to see them have a future together. They are both super intelligent kids and very driven." PR

obert Bierly got into jet skiing 6 years ago and convinced a friend to get a jet ski. Robert shared, "My first ski was a 2001 Yamaha XLT 1200 and his was a 2015 Yamaha FX Curser. I had that ski 3 years then ended up getting a 2018 Yamaha VXR. Once I got a ski I trusted, we started going on longer trips and ended up creating Maryland Waterway PWC as a local group for people to meet up and ride." The group currently has 74 members and 4 Admins that have been with Maryland Waterway PWC from the beginning: Erik Alexzander, Jesse Williams, Vince Savel and Bierly.

Favorite riding locations include Solomon's Island a main hub for ride events, where riders can experience a 'target ship' the American Mariner, currently the U.S. Navy's only active live-fire target ship in the Chesapeake Bay. When asked what has been most rewarding about organizing the group Robert said, "Seeing everyone come together and have a great time on the water. Lots of friendships are made, lots of smiles and stories told."

His most memorable ride thus far was when Jersey Shore PWC came to southern Maryland to join Maryland Waterway PWC. Jersey Shore launched from Solomon's Island and Maryland Waterway launched from Point Lookout. "We met up at Point No Point Lighthouse in the bay, rode to target ship then skipped to the eastern shore to Smith Island in the Chesapeake Bay, 12 miles off the shore of Crisfield, Maryland. There's only one way to get to Smith Island – by boat. There are no bridges to the island and no air strip. The island is the last inhabited island off the shore of Maryland.

Bierly encourages everyone to get involved in this sport. "It's relaxing and fun. Just make sure you know your limits and stay within them and keep safety first."

The group has several ride events planned for 2022:

- Target to Smith Island
- Island tours (Holland, Adam, Phon, and Northeast Island)
- Lake Anna (3 days camping and jet skiing)
- Taylor's Island Phase 3
















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Il four owners of Action Horizons (Ken Clark, Pat Millicano, Peter Nelson, and Mark Vanselow) come from a background of water sports and live performance. In 2007, they were looking at the landscape of live action shows globally. Over the decades they witnessed countless live action shows close and feared they were witnessing the death of the industry. With more than 100 years of experience combined, they saw an opportunity to do what they love and save the dying Live Action Stunt Show. With that, Action Horizons was born over a scotch and promise in Mark's living room.

PRO RIDER: What is Action Horizon's focus and specialties?

ACTION HORIZONS: While we work on film and TV projects, our focus is creating and operating live action stunt shows. We a currently operate at least one show in each Universal Studios theme park around the world (Hollywood, Orlando, Singapore, Japan, and Beijing). We cast internationally as well, with one of our biggest needs being jet skiers and water skiers willing to ride and perform for a living around the world.

PR: What are you most proud of regarding Action Horizons?

MI: We are proud to have been a stepping stone for dozens of athletes and performers into the world of TV and film. We are proud to have revitalized the Live Stunt Show genre and currently have the top guest rated stunt shows in the world.

PR: Please share with our readers what you ride and favorite riding locations.

RH KED: When we started to prepare for the Waterworld show in 1994, had 2 Kawasaki 550s. I don't currently own a jetski, but it's not unlikely to be called upon in the stunt industry to ride a wide variety of jet skis for film and TV, sometimes as a principal performer, but more often as H2O safety or production support.

MI PETER: Our family has been involved with boating, water skiing and jet skiing since the early 70's and saw the evolution of the very first Kawasaki

to what jet skiing is today. We have had several different jet skis throughout the years and still have a Yamaha Superjet. Our sons grew up on the water and both ended up performing in the Waterworld show in Singapore and Hollywood. Our youngest Kurt still has his Superjet and spends a lot of his free time in the surf. We ride socially these days and do runs over to Moreton Island from the Gold Coast, Australia.

PR: Any special plans for 2022?

III: We plan to get more involved in the water sport communities. We are sponsoring a couple athletes and plan to attend more events. We really want to make young talent aware there is a career path riding skis. For those who are interested, we have an amazing opportunity to travel the world while doing what you love.

PR: What was it like working with Action Horizons?


LR: Working with Action Horizons was the best. There's nothing like the energy of performing for a live audience. On top of



JUST PURE RIDING:

JET SKI PIONEER WAKE OF FAME INDUCTEE BOB PHARES DEMOS THE JET SKI IN the 70's!

n 1970 Bob Phares went to work for Kawasaki Motors Corp. in the parts department. Fast forward to 1975 he became District Sales Manager in Northern California. The Jet Ski released for sale nationally in 1976. His district sold more than any other in California and Bob was brought on as Jet Ski Specialist which kept him quite busy in marine industry shows. He spent 4 months promoting product from California to Boston to Miami. The following year he finished 2nd in Stock closed course, and 4th in freestyle World Finals.

He did TV promos and events across the US and helped get racing started in Minnesota and Pennsylvania. He organized demos with dealers in Oklahoma, Texas and Georgia and did TV shows including Hart to Hart, CHiPs, and Wonder Woman. There were radio promotions for ski jump contests and Playboy clubs. The list of promos goes on and on!

PRO RIDER: How did the 1979 photo shoot with Kawasaki come about?

BOB PHRRES: The photo shoot at Whiskeytown Lake in Northern California was specifically put together by Bill Grey, Manager of Jet Ski Division, to create advertising video footage for dealerships to use and for media market releases on product in 1978. The skis were for 1979 model year and the still shots were for magazine ads and posters. Bill had riders audition for the task. He told me he wanted to use me for the advertising brochures and posters with one stipulation. <mark>'Shave</mark> off that beard" he said ," I'll make you famous." Shave I did and got the nickname, 'Phamous'."

PR: Please describe the ski you restored.

BP: 1980 JS440, a year newer than the ski used in the poster of me but the exact same model and graphics. I made my living riding 440 skis teaching, demonstrating for 7 years with the Jet Ski Division.

The ski is restored to stock specs with few modifications. It has an intake grate on pump and an oil bath bearing housing.

PR: What are your favorite riding locations?

There are 8 lakes and 3 rivers within 45 minutes of my house. My favorite place to ride is the Sacramento River. I have longtime friends who have also restored '77-'81 440 skis.

We get together and ride these original stock skis. We still ride hard and put ourselves and these originals through aggressive rides. It's a blast pushing ourselves and making the skis work without bolt-ons or extensions. Just pure riding!



ro Rider Watercraft Magazine congratulates Eric Malone on his recent induction into the prestigious Blair County (PA) Sports Hall of Fame! Malone, who is also an inductee of the Jet Ski Industry's Hall of Fame, has been making his mark within the PWC/jet ski industry for many years and is well known for pioneering trademark tricks such as the no handed barrel roll, double barrel roll (flat water), 720 barrel roll (surf), the flat water back flip, no hander lander, and the initiation of the combo trick generation as well as numerous other amazing aerial moves that have become staples of freestyle routines throughout the world. He created the industry's first 'vert ramp' for WFWA stunt shows across the US and earned a movie SAG card when he stunt doubled for main actors in the movies "I Am Number 4" and "Into the Blue."

Reflected Pro Rider Magazine Publisher Michael Ratti, "When I was starting in the sport, Eric Malone was prime time, on TV, in movies, winning championships in surf and flat water, pushing the sport, especially freestyle, constantly creating new tricks, releasing videos, and performing shows with the World Freestyle Watercraft Alliance (WFWA). Freestylers idolize him, study his equipment and maneuvers. His friendship and mentorship helped me develop skills that enabled me to travel the world much like he did through the sport of jet skiing ."

Hall of Fame achievement: Winningest professional in International Jet Sports Boating Association competition with 43 titles, including eight world IJSBA championships (seven pro, one amateur) and 11 pro U.S. national championships.

Malone's pursuit of his passion on jet skis was not limited to the physical benefits he derived from other sports, though. One of the best decisions he ever made, he said, was working with sports trainer and psychologist Dr. Bill Thierfelder, who instructed Malone on the mental aspect of competing on an international stage. "Eric was one of the most gifted athletes I ever worked with," said Thierfelder, who worked with professional athletes in every sport before becoming president of Belmont Abbey College in North Carolina. "He was a motor control genius. He was remarkable. When he came to me originally, my first impression was he was a young guy that wanted to do everything he possibly could to tap out every bit of ability he was blessed with. He didn't want to leave one stone unturned."


Malone credits his hometown for helping him tap out every ounce of ability, noting that training in the relative anonymity of Pennsylvania helped him develop his equipment and new tricks because he could practice incognito as opposed to training in a hotbed like California, Florida, or Arizona where watchful eyes could have derailed the tricks he debuted at international competitions for the first time.

Today, Malone continues to support the personal watercraft industry through coaching, selling his EME product, engines and hulls, sponsoring riders, and attending events. Over the years Malone's coaching has helped numerous jet ski athletes attain national and world titles. **PR**



















PR PWC FISHING **'HOOKED' ON PWC FISHING IN** New Zealand Story and photos: Ruan Hayward riginally from the Eastern Cape, South Africa, recently I emigrated to New Zealand. Fishing has been part of my life from a young age, but I never imagined fishing from a jet ski! I purchased my first PWC 3 years ago. It completely changed my fishing game. It changed my methods of targeting fish to focusing more on lures rather than bait. It allows me to head offshore and target game fish I've been dreaming of, I'm hooked! I upgraded to a Yamaha FXHO which gives me confidence for bigger trips offshore and camping trips on local islands. My favourite location to fish hands down is the Hauraki Gulf in New Zealand. It offers a huge variety of species. Winter months the crisp clear mornings provide great opportunity to target big snapper and kingfish around deeper reefs; in spring the gulf comes alive with birds, dolphins, whales, and BIG fish! This is the perfect time of year for action-packed fishing! My favourite time of year begins as summer kicks off, not only because of the beautiful Christmas decorations in December, this is when my favourite species of fish roll into local reefs, the yellow tail kingfish, one of the hardest fighting fish I've ever had on the end of my line. Unfortunately, with the kingfish and the warm water we have another resident that comes in with vengeance, Mr. Johnny shark with big teeth! Lots of bronze whaler sharks (aka the tax man) hang around waiting for a free feed off someone's line, usually mine. I've caught many good fish from my PWC from 20-pound snappers to 30-pound kingfish. I'm still on the hunt for that 50-pound kingfish! My favourite method to target these bigger fish is with mechanical jigging, a very fast retrieving action which works a lot...on your shoulders. It works great on the fish too! The beauty is I can do all this from my PWC! If you are thinking about fishing from a ski, WHAT ARE YOU WAITING FOR? It's a complete game changer to target bigger species and gives you the ability to quickly change spots or restart short drifts over your spot. You can launch and retrieve the ski with absolutely no help required if you are keen to go for a guick solo fish. If you haven't noticed yet, I absolutely love

go for a quick solo fish.

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COMMON CAUSES OF PREMATURE CARBON SEAL WEAR


Believe it or not, not every watercraft is ready to go straight off the showroom floor. Human involvement takes place in every step of the manufacturing process; unfortunately, we are all human and make mistakes. I have personally encountered brand new PWCs with unsecured cooling lines, engine alignment far from correct, improperly sealed transom plates, the list goes on. Most recently, I had a Sea-Doo with the engine alignment so far off the carbon seal ate itself away.

All Sea-Doos are equipped with a carbon seal designed to prevent water from entering the hull around the driveshaft. Through the years, Sea-Doo has made many improvements to their carbon seal design. Unfortunately, the seal is still susceptible to premature wear. Running the engine out of water, revving the engine while on the trailer, frequent trips to rough water, wave jumping, and engine alignment issues are the most common factors leading to premature carbon seal wear. The seal was designed to be cooled by outside water to prevent it from overheating and literally turning to dust; all these cases prevent the seal from properly being cooled. Most of these scenarios, other than engine alignment, are operator error that cause the seal to fail. Thankfully, there are ways to spot premature carbon seal wear before it is too late.

The easiest way to notice premature wear is black soot coating the bottom of the hull around the pump tunnel. The black soot is carbon dust from the seal wearing away. If it happens to be engine alignment causing the issue, the top hat on the carbon ring will be off center and needs to be addressed immediately. If your watercraft is still under warranty, your local dealer should fix this free of charge as the alignment was likely off straight from the factory. Even though it is highly likely that off centered engine alignment was a manufacturing error, operator error can still cause it to be off centered.

Wave jumping puts a large amount of stress on engine mounts. Frequent wave jumping causes the engine alignment to shift from hard impacts or even break an engine mount. I highly recommend anyone who enjoys wave jumping to keep an eye on their carbon seal wear, engine alignment, and engine mounts. Keeping a close eye on these critical components could easily prevent your watercraft from taking on large amounts of water and sinking.

For buyers of a brand new PWC, it is important to ensure your dealer thoroughly inspects your Sea-Doo, or any watercraft, for possible manufacturing problems. If the engine alignment is off, it will be spotted when properly inspected and save you trouble down the line from a sinking watercraft. If you do need a replacement carbon seal, engine alignment shims, or any other OEM replacement part, the GreenHulk store has you covered. ETTNESS TIP

LET'S TIGHTEN THOSE ABS!

"I CAN'T GUARANTEE YOU'LL WIN EVERY TIME YOU TRY BUT I CAN GUARANTEE YOU'LL LOSE EVERY TIME YOU DON'T TRY." — UNKNOWN

There has been a shift in attitudes whereby promoting competition is looked down upon. Some believe 'everyone' should get a trophy for simply participating. Everything in life is a competition and we don't always win. We compete for jobs (interviews), acceptance to colleges, on grades/exams (grade school, college, heck even to get your driver's license), politics, raises, promotions, sports, and personally to better ourselves. Most successful are those who never stop fighting to improve and never allow second place to be acceptable. Every time you get on a PWC, enjoy yourself but also work on increasing your skill set. If you race, ride to win every time you grab the throttle!

Continuing focusing on body weight exercises, we'll explore the Abdominal Crunch which concentrates on the muscle group the rectus abdominus. Fitness and health connoisseurs refer to these muscles as our '6-pack'. There is nothing sexier than a nice set of abs. Let's tighten up those abs in preparation for PWC season.

CRUNCHES -TRAINING THE ABDOMINAL MUSCLES

BASICS: The Crunch is a time-tested exercise and testing platform within schools and the military. Crunches don't require special equipment or a gym: all you need is 'you.'

Lay on your back, arms crossed on the chest, knees bent 90 degrees, feet on the floor (Photo 1). It can be helpful to have someone hold your feet or place your feet under a weighted object. With arms crossed, raise upper torso moving towards knees (Photo 2). Touch elbows to knees or keep elbows against your torso (which allows you to rise higher-Photo 4). Once your elbows or arms contact your knees/legs, (Photo 3), lower yourself down until your back and shoulder blades contact the ground (original starting position-Photo 1).

PRECAUTIONS AND CONSIDERATIONS: Crunches are often done in preference to a complete situp as sit-ups place greater stress on the lower back. By performing a Crunch, the exerciser doesn't lift themselves completely off the ground and thus the lower back maintains contact with the ground, decreasing lower back stress. To perform a complete sit-up (Photo 4), always be cautious to protect your lower back.



EXERCISE RELEVANCE TO PWC: The abdominal muscles are key to all twisting and flexing between the upper body and lower body throughout any riding position. The stronger the abs, the stronger the connection between legs and upper torso. Tight strong abs look great on the water.

PRESCRIPTION: Crunches can be performed daily or every other day.

DAYS OF THE WEEK: 3-5 days of the week

BEGINNERS: 2-3 sets of 10-20

repetitions per set

INTERMEDIATE: 4-6 sets of 10-20

repetitions per set

ADVANCED: 6 or more sets of 20 or

greater repetitions per set

Holding weight plates (5, 10, or 25 lbs.) on the chest forces greater contraction of the abdominals (Always use caution as this increases stress on the lower back)









Thank you again for this feedback and this great visibility that you can bring us in your very recognized magazine in the world of jetski.
















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FIXXIE BUILD

Paul Lehr's old engine from his personal ski, a 6mm stroker with ADA cast cylinder fully ported and filled with secret sauce. Before the engine was installed it was dropped off at Paul's for a fresh rebuild. The engine was running older MSD which Paul quickly changed over to a zeel package based off the 760 electronics. Two tunes with a flip of the switch. Power goes through an Xscream 148 pump, with a 9/15 prop and the thrust trim system.

HULL:

The hull with tubbies snagged directly from Carter B. he originally planned to keep for himself. He did the front and rear rocker with heavy reinforcements then the massive wide tray.

The fix steer hood makes the ski. A lucky find online led to an original 24/7 carbon reinforced hood. The hood is off an old competition freestyle ski, the first ski to pull off a double flip by Paul. He recognized the hood by his old sticker and the 24/7 logo.



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
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




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
