

Jack Duffy-Protentis, founder and CEO of eSki, grew up in New England close to the water where he fostered a love of recreational watersports. From a young age, he had a fascination with



engineering and combined these passions to create eSki. Jack was diagnosed with Stargardt disease in 2006, a rare genetic condition affecting the eyes, causing a buildup of fatty material on the macula, resulting in majority blindness in the center of the eye. Despite the immense challenges caused by Jack's disability, he never let it get in the way of achieving his goals. In 2021, he received a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering from Worcester Polytechnic Institute.

eSki is a fully electric personal watercraft startup company redefining the recreational boating experience. A revolutionary 20 kWh battery management system allows riders to be on the water for two hours. Our watercraft brandishes groundbreaking safety features like reactive LED taillights that light up when the rider eases off the throttle. The fully electric motor system is near silent. We are creating a test prototype and production model close to our market model. Our goal is to have it ready for customers to test at the 2023 Miami Boat Show. For details

James "Bond" Munroe, who began racing in 2021, led every lap of the Beginner Class. He has a great future in racing with his natural flow riding style, netting him the top podium spot. Novice Class was tight. Josh Watler, on a Yamaha, emerged the victor

past Kawasaki pilot, Aaron Miller, who led most of the race and was passed the last lap, while Leroy Whittaker watched from the beach repairing a clutch. Whittaker returned and won the last 2 motos, but Miller was consistent placing 2-2-2 giving him the overall ahead of Whittaker; Brandon Elliot ended in 3rd. Amateur Class boasted lots of talent including Chris Bodden, sponsored by Wes-Tec, he grabbed the holeshot and never looked back, going wire to wire for the win. Cline Glidden, who injured his ankle earlier, raced through pain and continued his dominance to get the top spot for his



hris Cope, 41 from Minneapolis has been a mechanic for 21 years. Starting as an automotive mechanic he transitioned into a heavy diesel bus mechanic. In his spare time, he enjoys customizing cars and motorcycles. He never touched a jet ski until 2020 when relatives purchased a lake home. Shared Chris, "I noticed jet skis on the lake, it looked like a blast. I quickly found I was drawn to 1990's 2 stroke machines vs the giant modern machines we see today. Not only are they easier to work on and less expensive to repair but they are a lot of fun. I was lucky to find two for sale."

The skis, identical 1995 Yamaha WaveRunner III's with 650cc engines, were bought as one-owner skis, low hours, well cared for, stored indoors in winter. Chris wasn't going to restore them. He planned to ride and enjoy them for what they were and used them completely stock that first season.

became a regular in Facebook groups focused on 1990's skis and was in awe of cosmetic and performance modifications I saw. I caught the 'project bug' with a goal to have the nicest 27-year-old machines on the lake."



PROJECT MI: Black and white ski. All purple bumpers and trim pieces changed to black. Decals stripped off, parts of the hull repainted; the entire ski was wrapped in a vinyl decal kit from Wholesale Decals; traction mats and seat cover Blacktip Jetsports. The drivetrain was upgraded with an extremely rare Coffman's sizzler exhaust with water bypass and an Impros Hooker 9/15 impeller. The carburetor was re-jetted to maximize performance

with the upgraded exhaust. Installed a Yamaha extended ride plate originally offered in their accessory catalog when the machines were new.









When asked what the most challenging part of the projects was, Chris said, "Finding parts. I spent a lot of time searching eBay and jet ski salvage websites. Each project took 3 months. It was a process waiting for Minnesota's weather to cooperate for things like painting taking temperature and humidity into account. My fiancé, Liz helped. She enjoyed using the eraser wheel on the drill to remove decals and was a big help placing the new vinyl and helping with upholstery. She has an eye for detail like painting the gas caps. It was a fun thing to work on together. It was incredibly satisfying to see it all come together in the end."

For some reason, girls on a PWC seem to draw attention. Then add a whole different kind of fishing/diving set up on afore mentioned PWC, everybody has questions!

y name is Traci, President of the "Pier Pressure Boatercycle Club" a group of tight knit federal law enforcement officers in South Florida, that got together and purchased PWCs within a month of each other, hence, the twist on 'peer' pressure name. If one of us does something that seems like a great idea, the rest follow suit. We stick together through thick n' thin and knew there were bound to be some good stories from this adventure. Having the biggest attitude and the only girl, the boys named me president of our little club.

Born and raised in Florida, around water and fishing my entire life, I've owned a boat but never a PWC. I was extremely hesitant when this idea came into fruition. I had very limited PWC experience and the little I had was riding with a friend, being flung through the air, jumping waves, trying desperately to hold on and attempting to drag myself up on a very unstable ski. None of this was done gracefully and I was a lot younger, how could I possibly manage one of these contraptions at this age? I couldn't have been more wrong!

I didn't set out to buy the Sea-Doo Fish Pro but when I saw the size, stability and that it came with a Garmin fish finder and a cooler, I knew the Fish Pro was it for me and have not regretted that decision.

We travel with our PWCs quite a bit exploring areas like Marco Island, Tampa Bay Area, all over Florida but some of the best areas are right here in our backyard in the Ft. Lauderdale/ Miami area.


While I like traditional pole fishing, I love getting in the water, finding fish, lobstering, and crabbing a lot more which required a different set up with my ski. I figured out a way

> to set up a SNUBA (Surface Nexus Breathing Apparatus) a cross between diving and snorkeling on my Fish Pro. My set up includes a dive tank, 1st stage regulator, one splitter and 2 regulators. This supports up to 2 divers at once. Air goes directly from tank, no need for an air compressor. With southern inspired engineering, I

took a foam dive tank rack, cut it down to fit, strapped it to the back of the cooler on the fishing pole holders and bungee' d the SNUBA bag between the cooler and seat and voilà, a dive ready vessel!

My first trip out, we had 3-5 ft. seas, and everything stayed put exactly how it was intended, other than my nerves. I was a hot mess thinking I might lose this brand-new contraption. That's how my PWC got her name, "The Hot Mess Express."

I encourage everyone to get out of your comfort zone and go play! You might just have the time of your life like I am!



or the past couple years, Kawasaki has been working on upgrades to their flagship 310 series top of the line watercraft. Pro Rider Watercraft Magazine was invited to Las Vegas to see these new for 2022 upgrades. It's been a long time since I've seen any watercraft from Kawasaki with so many upgrades, many of which have never been done on any factory-built watercraft.

Kawasaki always brings a knowledgeable team that genuinely loves riding jetskis and are all about good times. Test riders included multiple media outlets, Kawasaki R&D legend, racer, and designer of this new ski Minoru Kanamori, multi world champion jet ski legend Mark Gomez, Jon Rall and Bobbi Kerns from Kawasaki, photographer Wayne Smith and me.

We launched on Lake Meade and headed to the iconic Hoover Dam. The lake is surrounded by huge, jagged granite, schist and gneiss rocks which makes for a picturesque ride. Hot and sunny I got a much-needed dose of vitamin D in the desert sun.

NEW UPGRADES AND FEATURES:

Ultra 310LX Ebony / Gold Edition: this package has the most bells and whistles in the 310 lineup. The 310 series already had a winning motor and pump package (still the most horsepower of any factory watercraft). The drive train was left the same for good reason. All upgrades can be seen above the bond line, except for the new KSRD (Kawasaki Smart Reverse with Deceleration) which works incredibly well and is very user

friendly. Even novice riders should have no problem docking or trailering with the KSRD system, a welcome upgrade compared to the previous lever style manual reverse system.

As a music lover, the first thing I did was Bluetooth my phone to the Jetsound 4 Speaker Audio System which sounds great! The top speakers make it easy to hear even at 65 mph, not the case for other competing watercraft sound systems. The system is integrated with a new 7-inch full color LCD dash screen with multiple options, I'll highlight what I liked best. It has a back-up camera, great for backing off a trailer or leaving on while towing, a great safety upgrade. I love the overall look of the screen which you can see in any weather conditions including direct sunlight. The screen provides oodles of data and information you can scroll through and monitor.









cruise control. The top deck of the ski has been completely redesigned, restyled, looks great and has water deflection functionality. Two new side compartments are easily accessible from the rider position, one has a waterproof case with USB charging port. The rear of the ski features a new track style rack mounting system on a 7.9 inch longer rear deck with available accessories. The seats have been redesigned to be narrower with a high back, ultra-plush comfort seat, deeper foot wells, a fully adjustable seat system with 3 settings for an ergonomically correct ride experience. Kawasaki added cool headlight style LED marker lights. I asked Kanamori what the lights were for, and he said, "because they look cool," I fully agree.

Upgrades to the Jetski were well thought out, innovative, highly functional and a design that looks amazing, everything I hoped it would be and more. The all-new Kawasaki Ultra 310LX Jetski screams high end luxury, comfort, good times, and functionality with a bit of Supercar sprinkled in.

I saw many kids without vests, and even saved a few kids. I went on

> a mission to teach everyone I could about water safety and was recognized by FOX 12 news. With their help I give life vests to kids. Blake Corning taught



me about safety. It started with racing, then promoting, trickling into working for IJSBA, it's part of all we do with racing." Kim has worked for the IJSBA for 22 years, works with Pro Watercross and plans to put on race clinics. From gear, rec-riding, racing, planning and promoting, Kim can get you dialed in for safety.

When asked what one piece of advice she'd like to convey Kim said, "Always wear a helmet whether racing or riding recreationally. Once you get used to it you feel naked without it, and you won't ride as hard without it. I work in dentistry and have ridden the surf. I hit a huge wave and put my head into the bars. My helmet saved my face, teeth, and brain."

CONSIDER THIS CHECKLIST FOR PWC RENTALS*

- Rent from a well-established rental company. Typically, these companies have a designated rental location, and multiple staff members experienced in providing safety training for renters. They have life jackets of all sizes, and a staffed motorboat available for emergency situations.
- If you plan to bring your cell phone keep it in a waterproof bag. It can be difficult to operate a phone while on a jetski, and even worse if you're in the water with a capsized ski. If you're not careful, the phone may end up at the bottom of the sea. Some rentals use GPS trackers on their skis which provides an additional layer of safety to indicate your whereabouts in an emergency.
- Reserve ahead of time. Due to a worldwide shortage of PWCs, some rentals don't have enough equipment to meet demand. If you arrive to a rental place without a reservation, be prepared to wait. Availability is better early in the morning.
- · Fill out rental forms online, ahead of time. During the peak of Covid, jet skiing exploded in popularity as a fun and social activity -- the perfect cure for cabin fever. To avoid the crowds around the rental office, fill out all paperwork online before
- · Wear sunscreen. Few activities provide more sun exposure than jet skiing. This might be great if you're looking for the perfect tan but can also be very dangerous if you don't take care.














PR TECH TIP

CAPTURE THE MOMENT WITH A BITE MOUNT CAMERA

iding personal watercraft is one of the most enjoyable experiences on the planet. Exploring lakes, rivers, oceans, and uncharted waterways on a PWC is an experience like no other; the only issue is it is literally "personal." A PWC can carry an extra passenger comfortably, maybe two, so sharing this passion with friends and family is challenging. How do we share the love for riding and exploring new areas with people around the world?

With technology, it's easy to take others along even if not physically present. The best way to accomplish this is taking an action camera on rides. I use four GoPro cameras to capture every angle, moment, and fun-filled memory possible. My setup may be a bit overkill; one camera would work fine, but filming my rides is part of my job and every angle matters!

I don't have enough hands to hold four GoPro action cameras and safely operate my PWC. Mounting cameras to watercraft or your body is almost necessary! Hand filming is possible but remember you still must safely operate a vessel that requires your full attention. My preferred mounting system is the GoPro suction cup mount. I've filmed countless hours on my PWC at over 90 mph and these mounts have not failed

once; to ensure you still have your camera at the end of the day, stick the suction cup mount to a clean, flat surface - do not stick over decals or textured surfaces.

The mount that gets my absolute favorite camera angle is, without a doubt, a "bite" mount. A bite mount literally allows your camera to be held with your mouth; it may look silly and fatigue your jaw over long periods of filming, but this angle captures the moment and allows the watcher to feel like they are right there with you!

There's no right or wrong way to make videos on your PWC. It's important to find a camera and mount you like to capture experiences to share with the world. We don't sell camera gear, but we have plenty of parts to make your ride, and videos, great! Visit the GreenHulk Store to purchase the best aftermarket parts and OEM parts. 

he Liqui Moly Pro Watercross National Tour kicked off with back-to-back rounds in sunny Florida, the perfect excuse for this northerner to take an extended road trip with our new Team Twangled race hauler packed with salty and freshwater skis for the adventure.

Avon Park, Florida hosted round 1 at Lake Verona. Only 41-acres in size, 30,000 years old and 80 feet deep, this natural sinkhole is the deepest and one of the oldest lakes in Florida. The small flat supercross inspired course spanned the lake where spectators had great views of the action! The fun track with fast lap times included a joker buoy.

The biggest class was Sport Spec where Blasters and HXs thrived on the tight curvy course. The entire field remained within half a lap of each other showing how competitive the Stock classes are. Sea-Doos dominated the podium with Tom Keller going 2-1-1 for the overall over Team Ruthless teammate Matt Johnson. Dustin Bury finished a close third.

Pro-Am Ski GP had friends and teammates competing with Callaway Turner and Jeb Zarzour battling. Callaway swept all motos claiming his first PWX National Pro win. Zarzour finished second, Luis Velay third.

Other notable classes included AM Ski Stock where Joe Surette took the win over Kiersin Frost through a tiebreaker. Jax Hayden took third. In Novice Sport Stock Nick Gebhardt emerged with the overall while Jessica Burtka used the tiebreaker to edge Jeovanni Tejeda for second overall.

After enjoying golf and beaches, we headed west to Sharky's Bar Panama City Beach. Having competed in Freestyle in PCB in 2005 and 2010, I thought I knew what to expect. A stormfront blew through leaving high winds and huge waves meaning the entire "Pro Show" would be under proper surf conditions with a double red-flag riptide warning.

Pro-Am Ski GP was a show on its own with a full line of K1s ready to rail in the surf. Jimmy Wilson grabbed a win and battled with Matthew Richuk who took the overall. Wilson finished second, Deven Farthing 3rd.

Am Ski Stock showed up in force as the largest class of the weekend. Kevin Rowe dominated taking the overall; Kiersin Frost finished second and Jax Hayden third, both on the box for the second week in a row.

THE POWER OF PROPERLY WARMING UP **QUICK 5 MINUTE ROUTINE**

lite athletes understand the power of a good warm-up routine, and you should too. A quick warm-up before you ride makes a big difference in how you ride. You'll be more focused, comfortable, and relaxed reducing risk of injury. This swift, time-effective program is a way to prepare for your ride at all levels.

We will focus on dynamic movement-based stretching using fluid movement to warm up the muscle and surrounding tissue. Dynamic stretching is a moving stretch. Perform each exercise with an appropriate level of comfort. During each movement, breathe deeply. After this 3-5-minute warm-up, you'll be fully charged ready to hit the water.

HIGH KNEE MARCHING:

To get the heart rate up and open hips and glutes, lift right knee with flexed foot while lifting opposite arm with a 90-degree elbow bend; march for 30 seconds.

With hands on your ski, car, or wall for balance, swing your leg forward and back 4-6 times and side to side 4-6 times each leg in a fluid, controlled motion.

LUNGE AND TWISTS:

Step forward in a lunging motion, twist the upper body, repeating 4-6 times. Go slow, don't push too deeply; remember you are warming up.

FRANKENSTEIN LEG KICKS:

Kick your leg in front of you, using opposite hand or elbow to reach toward your toe or knee, 4-6 times, repeating side to side.

HIPS TWISTS:

Hands on hips slowly move hips in a 360° circle. Perform 4-6 rotations clockwise; switch directions, do 4-6 cycles.

ARM SWINGS & CIRCLES:

This stretch warms the shoulders, arms, chest, and upper back preparing muscles, tendons, and joints for your ride. Move arms in small or big circular motion, 4-6 repetitions both directions. Next, do a few arm swings by crossing the arms in a front and back motion.

NECK ROLLS:

Slowly roll the neck clockwise then counterclockwise. Combine arm swings and neck rolls to save time.

WRIST AND ANKLE STRETCHES:

Open and close fingers, roll wrists in clockwise then counterclockwise ten times. Do same with ankles.

Now, take a deep breath and ride!



PRO RIDER: Please tell us about yourself and what motivated you to establish Watcon.

JOHN ZIGLER: I've had many jobs over my working lifetime. As a teen, I worked at our local Schwinn bike shop repairing and racing bikes. Then, an auto parts store I managed for 8 years. I've worked at a large truck modification shop responsible for 11 employees and worked at General Motors until it closed in 2008, and I retired. Riding watercraft since the 80's, starting on a 1982 550, I was immediately hooked. We rode dirt bikes, 3-wheelers, and jet skiing fit right in. Back in the day, nothing was fast enough for me; we were always tinkering, tuning, and trying to improve. I friended the guys at a little shop in Michigan, Butch's, and worked on watercraft on the side for buddies, it snowballed from there. In 1995 I opened my own business "Rad Racing" and in the early 2000's changed the name to "Rock County Jet Ski." Our Watcon website business was acquired from longtime friend Randy Jungwirth. Randy, in our industry since the 80's, had his own shop, "Watercraft Connection" shortened to Watcon. I'm fortunate and honored to continue with the Watcon name and parts line. I'm still Rock County Jet Ski to locals but due to the website people all over the country know us as "Watcon."

PR: Please describe what is offered.

JZ: I used to say "All things for all watercraft" but that has become difficult. I no longer have parts, or service for Polaris Watercraft, and some older 2-strokes we no longer service due to costs and parts availability. We try to keep everyone on the water as best we can, supplying parts, tech help, and servicing / building machines, from Sea-Doo Sparks, to Dasa Rickters, and everything in between. We offer machine shop services and our own line of parts, under RCJS and Watcon.

PR: You started a YouTube channel 'Watercraft Talk' a year ago. How do you determine topics and how has the channel been received?

JZ: I hear from customers daily about our YouTube channel. I didn't want to do another "how to" channel. We show what's going on in the shop; testing, product showcasing, answering emails and taking viewers along

on adventures picking up skis. Feedback has been excellent! I love hearing from viewers and will continue the channel as long as everyone likes it. Please keep the ideas coming! Look us up Watercraft Talk on YouTube.



PR: What is most satisfying regarding your business?

JZ: I feel very fortunate to be able to do what I'm passionate about every day. I've made so many great friends over the years in this sport; amazing people I interact with daily.

PR: What is your best advice to jet ski owners/ riders/racers?

It's simple, take care of your craft, and it will take care of you. A little preventative maintenance goes a long way. If you are new to the sport welcome! Look to veterans in your region for advice. Be safe and have fun.

PR: Are you currently sponsoring racers?

JZ: We have quite a long list of sponsored riders, local and all over the country.

PR: Please share what you and your family members ride and favorite riding locations. What do you like to do when not working?

JZ: We live, and ride on our local river in southern Wisconsin. I have guite a collection of vintage skis, but the main 2 I ride are a 2003 SXR 800 our old lites class ski and a 2021 Gen 4 Superjet. My 2 sons ride Superjets, my wife and daughter ride a Sea-Doo 4-tech GTX. I enjoy spending time with family and cherish every moment whether riding or hanging out in our back yard.






FROM FT. LAUDERDALE TO BIMINI




