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

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



DEAR PRO RIDER WATERCRAFT MAGAZINE,

I've been fascinated with jet skis and Havasu a long time. I remember being a teenager working at a motorcycle shop, seeing images of Fischetti, Rippenkroeger, Carlson, and others on posters, in magazines, reading articles and seeing grandstands filled watching the best battle at World Finals. The colors, sights, sounds, I imagined I was there.

I bought my first ski at 20, a 2000 Superjet and imagined ripping around buoys, chasing wins and world titles. Sponsons on the shopping list, knowledge gained, ready for second moto. More spills and fun, the weekend ends with two 3rd overalls.

We raced the rest of the season. Some say it's a lot of effort for a piece of plastic, but I gained experience, drove many miles, had great times, and the memories made — that's the good stuff. First holeshot, meeting my heroes and fellow racers, making friends, those are what makes racing and the jet ski community so great.

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

ake Charles, Louisiana was host to the fourth and final race of the 2022 Pro Watercross National Tour.*

The city of Lake Charles pulled out all the stops to make riders feel welcome. From a rider hospitality tent and grandstands to an array of local food vendors and a flush out area, local officials made us feel warm and welcome.

The racecourse was a right hander with a right-side split and an advantage joker buoy. CBS was on hand to capture all the action and emotions.

With double points on the line, the Pro Sport Championship was down to literally a one position difference (a nine-point spread) between Billy Dearman and me. While I was able to slide past Billy in the first two rounds of the series, he got me for the win in Racine and closed the gap to an uncomfortable distance. We battled all day and after three grueling motos totaling 43 laps, Dearman emerged the Pro Sport Spec National Tour Champion finishing with a second overall. I finished one point behind Billy for the Tour Championship while celebrating consecutive podiums in this class. Wyatt Hayes on his Polaris Hurricane swept all motos en route to the win and third overall for the Tour Championship.

In Pro-Am Ski GP Jimmy Wilson won his second National in a row sweeping all motos winning the National Tour Championship over top rival, Jules Hopkins. Jules finished second overall on the National Tour. Rounding out the top 3 Tour Champions in Ski GP was Taylor Stewart who also won the Tour Championship in Pro-Am Ski Stock.

Intense battles, amazing sportsmanship and camaraderie abounded. Special thanks to the Pro Watercross crew for an amazing year. I'm proud to say we are on tour with some of the best course marshals, announcers, video streamers and officials jet ski life has to offer. Rip hard, be safe and see you at the next race!

After slow riding for years, we wanted a more exciting platform to get offshore faster and cover distances outside the range of kayaks. Our group is based mostly out of Texas although we have members across the globe and growing at a steady pace.

Tournament Director, Nam "Namasteak" Nguyen determined we needed an event to build the sport and get more people interested in this new and extreme style of offshore fishing, thus, in 2018 the Texas Jet Ski Fishing "King of Summer" Tournament was born. Rules are basic. Fish must be caught from a PWC while using a rod and reel, contestants can launch from any boat ramp in

the state of Texas and fish

within state or federal water. Contestants must make a video stating date of the catch while on their PWC. Once back on land they must video their catch with measurements and post to the official King of Summer Tournament page on the TJSF Facebook Group. Everything else is based on the honor system and it's a winner takes all tournament with entry at \$20 per person.

During the first couple of years, we had very few contestants, but the community grew and so have the winnings! TJSF has over 4,600 members and gaining more interest daily. In 2022 we had our largest winnings to date and hopefully can continue to see

more interest in the sport

and the tournament. King Mackerel, aka "Kingfish" is the target species as they are abundant during summer months within the Gulf of Mexico, hence the name, "King of Summer." Fish are measured in length only; weight is not considered. This year, I was fortunate to recapture the title of "King of Summer" since winning the first tournament in 2018.

We look forward to the sport and tournament growing each year! PR

Our focus is to provide our community with parts, knowledge, and service needed to hit those target top speeds and maintain a healthy ski.

PR: What are you most proud of regarding your business?

BR: We are proud of how fast we've grown in a short amount of time. Seems like yesterday we had our first customer wanting to go faster. We're also proud of helping our sponsored P1AquaX racer Matt Smith with his racing career. We owe it all to our loyal customers and hardworking employees.

PR: What is your best advice to jet ski owners?

B1: Do your research and listen to reviews when choosing which mechanic or shop to work on your PWC. Some of our most time consuming and costly jobs have been correcting mistakes of other mechanics and fly-by-night shops.

PR: Please share what you and your family members ride and favorite riding location.

Eff: I ride a 2016 Yamaha FX SVHO fully built 1.8L strapped with a 6466 Boostlabs Turbo 100+mph. Mike (lead tech) rides a 2015 FX SVHO with a custom Stage 3+ setup 95mph. Shop skis include a 2020 Sea-Doo RXTX full JP Racing stage three 90mph, and 2014 Sea-Doo Spark for the heck of it. Our favorite place to ride is Jet Tek Performance Point, a shallow water area great for hitting high speeds and hanging out on the island.

PR: Any special plans for the remainder of 2022 and 2023?

BR: We are working on fulfilling a few amazing contract builds, introducing new products, and participating more in P1AquaX.








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he 41st anniversary of the IJSBA was a success. Lake Havasu City. a pilgrimage place of sorts for many racers, was home to 32 countries, 700 entrants and their crews. After the isolation of Covid-19, energy, and excitement permeated Body Beach from the first race until the last. Like every momentous occasion, this second stop of the Jet Ski World Series was filled with mixed emotions.

> Early on, tremendous, surprising firsts were achieved. Cambodia's seasoned Ou Mouet Saly took the Novice Ski Stock title, restoring much needed confidence. Havasu's Sebastien Girello was the spoiler in the coveted Amateur (aka Expert) Ski GP class, trumping Europe Round 1 champion, Lucy Gadsby, and runner up, Phil Segers for the title. Corban Farnley, New Zealand, secured a two-moto win in the 20-rider strong Pro-Am Ski Lites; no small feat considering the lineup consisted of great young upcomers. Paul Del Rosario of the Philippines had a world title on his bucket list and got one in Ski Modified Lites. Tory Snyder not only took the world title in Amateur Runabout 1100 Limited, but the Sport Spec class, a class he entered on the day of the competition. That gamble paid off!

> > The Thai Six and Sense twins, Tanawin and Tanawid Molee, made Havasu their stop, sharing the podium in Amateur Ski GP behind Girello, the first-time twins have been on the podium together in Havasu. Tanawid won Pro Am Ski Stock. Speaking of siblings, we can't discount the breakout performances of Thai duo, Keeratikorn and Sasina Phiwngam. They popped up on our radars in Poland with dominant performances in Runabout 1100. Sasina won Amateur Women's Runabout 1100 Stock. Keeratikorn took Amateur Runabout 1100 Stock win, his sister 3rd. He also won Novice Runabout 1100 Stock.

> > > Not to be outdone, the Juniors put on an excellent show. Most sensational was a three moto win by Thai celebrity, Nakara Orca' Silachai in the Junior 10-12

Stock category. Teammate, Natannan 'Otto' Keenapan took the title in Junior 13-15 Stock, Tanner Wright from Havasu is one to watch, taking the 13-15 4 Stroke Lites title, with another hometown product, Ty Smith, becoming world champion in 10-12 4 Stroke Lites.

For the Pros, it was a case of clouds with silver linings. Endurance ran one moto overall with multiple world champion, Jean Bruno Pastorello, adding another world title to his belt. Lee Stone came out of his short hiatus to claim a 10th Freestyle world title, a stupendous achievement against fellow competitors who all put on a great show. Emma-Nellie Ortendahl pipped Lucy Gadsby and Jasmiin Ypraus in Pro Am Women's Ski stock proving her racing pedigree. Suphathat Footrakul nabbed three moto wins in RA 1100 Open despite injury. Veteran racer, Tammy Rarick, took Pro Women's Runabout in a strong, growing class.

In Pro Sport, Deven 'I-can-do-multipleclasses-in-one-day-and-still-win' Farthing beat his rivals in a class his father previously dominated. In Pro Runabout GP, holeshot king, Mohammad Albaz took the world championship title, fending off teammate, Skinny Mo Burbayea by a narrow margin. This result was still a redemptive effort for Mo after a rough start in Poland. We are hoping for one hell of a showdown in Thailand.

> Pro Ski, the ultimate crowd drawer, was one that was tainted by tragedy from the first moto. During the very first lap of moto 1, a fateful collision between Tyron Motzouris and Jeremy Poret forced race officials to delay the race to ensure the safety of riders. Tyron suffered a serious head injury and had to be rushed to hospital where he underwent surgery and is fighting on with his trademark determination and will. Since so many riders in the class had their boats touched by Tyron at some point in their careers, it was a miracle these Pros were able to keep their heads for the rest of the motos. Pro Ski ran three motos, Marten Manni and Kevin Reiterer tying for points, Manni taking a much-deserved world title. Poland winner, Raphael Maurin joined Reiterer on the podium with Quinten Bossche i4th and Jimmy Wilson 5th.

> > Tyron's exit cast a cloud in the mind of every racer that weekend. It is something rarely acknowledged in our sport, the speed, the risk, and the consequences on the water. It was the right call for the race organizers to end racing before sunset. We might not have seen a second moto for Endurance or a fourth for Ski, but there was a lot more at risk if races continued. We send light and strength to the Motzouris clan and rally our positive thoughts for them during this trying time.

> > > The third and final stop of the Jet Ski World Series continues in Pattaya, Thailand in December. For all of us, it's going to be the bombastic closure to a full year of incredible racing in 2022.

"IJSBA had our first World Finals following restrictions placed by the pandemic. The 2022 Jettrim WGP#1 World Finals had great racing, solid vendor participation, and the highest number of competitors and spectators since 2016. IJSBA made deep sacrifices when we produced the 2020 and 2021 World Finals to keep the continuity of the event ensuring World Finals could be produced in difficult circumstances. While we are proud of the accomplishments, there is clearly a need to do more to have the appearance of the World Finals match the hard work that goes into the production of BAILING DRAIN the event. Meeting this challenge will be our development priority for 2023, IJSBA thanks all sponsors, industry professionals, racers, and pubic for the support; we will continue to deliver for you. Finally, we send our thoughts and prayers to Tyron Motzouris who suffered a serious injury in Pro Ski GP, the only serious injury of the event. We hope all racers will keep him and his family in their thoughts."

A 2nd generation racer, Jayden, under dad's watchful eye, rode the number 111 Superjet to 2 world titles coming 1st in Junior Ski 13–15 Lites and Amateur Ski Lites whilst finishing a creditable 3rd in Pro Am Ski Lites.

A merica's Great Loop is a 5,500-mile water trail around the eastern third of the U.S. Mike Straub started in Omaha, Nebraska (not on the Loop), and added 1,250 miles to the trip. Typically, it's travelled in one year in 25-50 foot live-on boats/yachts. It's common for people to ride it in segments over many years. Straub chose to do it on a 2022 Sea-Doo Fish Pro Trophy in the span of 3 months. "This was my Mount Everest," shared Straub.

The hero of the trip was Brett Zelenak, Service Manager, Distinctive Cycles, Freeport, Florida.

From Omaha to Florida, my machine developed an issue requiring several minutes of off-and-on cranking to fire on cold starts. At Brett's shop, we ruled out numerous things. The starting issues continued as I rounded Key West, but Brett stuck with me and was always a text message away. Through Brett's troubleshooting, we discovered leaving too much weight on the back of the machine overnight caused an exhaust back-pressure issue where water vapors entered the cylinders and fouled the spark plugs. The solution was simple, fill fuel jugs in the AM, instead of PM. From then on, the machine started every time, without incident. That was the only major, unexpected mechanical issue. And all I had to do was replace the spark plugs between scheduled service stops to fix it. I replaced the carbon seal at 300-engine-hours. Those seals are generally good for 150-250 hours, so I felt great getting 300 hours out of mine.



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I'm thrilled how well my aluminum fuel rack held up. We built it to hold four 6-gallon jugs, with a range of 180-280 miles, depending on water conditions. I had a ¾" jiggler siphon hose and could drain one 6-gallon jug into the main tank in 100 seconds and could refuel in

rough waters with relative ease.

On shorter days, I filled two jugs, leaving the outside two empty. This still provided plenty of fuel reserve, and I didn't have to worry about finding a marina midday. The longest stretch without fuel, besides the Missouri River, was from Hoppie's Marina on the Mississippi River to Paducah, Kentucky, 205 miles; made that stretch with 12 gallons to spare.

Every day, I edited and published a YouTube video. While they didn't go viral, a couple thousand people followed along. At night stops, there was usually someone waiting at the dock for me, or who would recognize me. "Hey – you're that Sea-Doo Looper guy, aren't you?" Or "We've been waiting for you to arrive!"

With this trip, I endeavored to inspire others through my personal message of 'Y WAIT' to live your passions, stop waiting for that perfect moment. If I could get just a few people to do that, mission accomplished. Based on messages in social media I think that happened.

VENTURE OF EPIG PROPORTIONS: **BIG WAVE RIDING NAZARÉ** n January 8, 2022, the largest

swell of the season hit Praia do Norte in Nazaré, Portugal, producing 60-80-foot waves.

Sky high energy buzzed wildly through town as spectators crowded the cliffs while jet skis zipped through the lineup. Focused tension charged the air as surfers, rescue teams and videographers geared-up. Like warriors preparing for battle they launched towards the massive waves rising on the horizon.

> The waves build power traveling through the Atlantic. Just before they reach shore, the swell sinks 16,000 feet deep into the undersea Nazaré Canyon. When waves hit the canyon's wall, they get funneled towards the massive sandbar and shoot back up wedging with the waves still coming from the northwest generating record breaking wave heights. On big days, waves crest over 100 feet tall. Most days, Nazare can only be surfed with the aid of a PWC.

> > The PWC tows surfers into waves and pulls them from the surf after the ride or wipe out. None of this could be done without the best jet-ski pilots. The pilot and PWC are like a horse and cowboy, and for this rodeo, gear must be in top shape. The PWC is adapted with a sled and special tow ropes so the surfer can hold on and get retrieved swiftly.

> > > It was part of the plan to ride the PWC on the big waves, but not while the swell was raging. I felt confident and safe going with Dave Langer, a big wave surfer and one of Nazaré's top rescue drivers with a board shrine at the "Faro" museum.

We waited three days until the waves went down. It was nothing short of an epic adventure. The team consisted of Dave Langer, Crusty Demons of Dirt motocross alumni Rusty Setser, pioneer adaptive sports big wave pilot Kyle Richardson and me.

> Geared up in a 5mm wetsuit, I rode the back of the PWC driven by Rusty, who was charging Nazaré for the first time. His motocross driving skills kicked in and it was as close as I'd gotten to a freestyle jump.

Dave rode with Kyle Richardson who drove his PWC on the Nazaré waves for his first time. Kyle suffered a spinal cord injury a decade ago and lost all movement beneath his arms. He is a pioneer in his field and thanks to Langer is now the first adaptive sports pilot to test the mecca of the big wave tow-in scene.

> Riding back to the marina, we cheered like pirates catching air when Kyle and Rusty sped full throttle. In the end, towing into a giant wave is an experience beyond life and death, it's a slice of eternity requiring mind-blowing devotion.

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AIR: MORE IS BETTER! By: Greg Gaddis Aka "Hulk Junior"

A n engine is essentially an air pump. The more air an engine can process the more power the engine has the potential to make. Starving an engine for air is only hurting performance and efficiency. Air circulation is a big issue for personal watercraft; the engine compartment is tightly sealed with minimal air ducts to keep as much water out as possible. The lack of air circulation results in the engine breathing hot, oxygen-deficient air preventing it from operating at peak performance.

There's a reason many individuals and performance shops do top speed runs with the seat off: air circulation. Getting fresh air to the engine keeps the engine compartment temps low, engine temps low, and intake air temps low. The combination of the three results in a 2-3 mph gain just from getting more air flow and better air quality. Unfortunately, 99 percent of people ride with their seats on and are missing out on higher speeds. The answer to this problem is simple: add as many air ducts as you feel comfortable!

I recently did a little experiment to see just how much speed I'd gain from adding a few vents. I didn't go overboard with a hole saw resulting in a chopped up Sea-Doo RXP-X! Most people would never even notice the vents I added simply because I transformed the fake air ducts on the front of the ski into full functioning ones. Utilizing the factory cosmetic design keeps the look clean, keeps water out, and adds plenty of airflow. Just from removing the factory cowl pieces, drilling two 2.5 inch holes, and reinstalling the cowls I gained a sustained 200 RPM and 2 MPH. I certainly can't complain about gaining 2 MPH for <u>free!</u>

Obviously, not everyone is thrilled with the idea of drilling holes in their PWC, but if peak performance is your top priority, then it is necessary. I've never had a single issue caused from modified air ducts on the many skis I've added them to. If done right there will be no water intrusion, look factory, and significantly increase engine performance.

INJURY PREVENTION THROUGH YOGA

igh level athletes LeBron James and Tom Brady added yoga to extend their careers. Yoga strengthens the tiny stabilizing muscles often missed by conventional workouts. These stabilizer muscles add strength and flexibility and prevent injury by supporting larger muscle groups. Yoga stretches the entire body. Yoga combines breath with movement to build 'prana' or life force energy.

The sun salutations sequence is at the heart of any yoga practice. Sun salutations or 'Surya

I. LUNGE - From standing, bring hands to the ground, step right leg back lowering knee to floor. Keep the front (left) knee over the front (left) foot. Allow back leg to slide back as far as comfortable. Bring both hands to front knee to create length in the spine; take three deep breaths. Notice how the hip flexor starts to release. Add dragon pose by dropping one hand to the ground and lifting the other toward to sky.



Namaskar' honors the sun. In traditional yoga, the sun is considered the source of all life. As watersports athletes, the sun is crucial to us, so let's dive into this process that positively affects body, mind, and spirit.

It starts with the excellent posture of the mountain or prayer pose and ends in the same position while going through a series of postures linking breathing with movement. This article focuses on the low lunge, cobra, and downward-facing dog poses.

2. COBRA – Begin lying on your stomach; bring hands underneath shoulders. Pull elbows in toward body. Keep elbows bent, press feet, legs, and hips into floor, lift chest upward to the sky on an inhale. Open the chest, relax shoulders, breathe deeply.





3. DOWNWARD DDG - Begin on hands and knees, feet hip distance apart, tuck toes under, slowly lift your knees and straighten your legs. Reach upward with your hips as you simultaneously shift your weight back, sharing the effort between upper and lower body. Breathe deeply, keep knees bent



eaving through queued boats in the shallows waiting for Mother Nature to play nice, I squeeze the trigger and clinically slice between the set waves heading for my favourite mark, lures in fishing before most have made it out of the surf zone. I love fishing off a WaveRunner!

Since 15 years old I've owned a jet ski, my first being a Yamaha GP1200r, which I'd have to throttle the heck out of to turn over. Eventually, she'd come to life with a chainsaw-like growl waking half the neighbourhood. That little 2-stroke served me well a couple-hundred hours, but finally, I saved enough money for the Holy Grail – a Yamaha FX HO.

The new-found reliability in the silky smooth 4-stroke engine allowed me to explore what I could never before. I could venture further offshore on a more stable vessel, use less fuel, all while trusting Yamaha's MR1 engine. Fast forward, I've clocked over 1,000 hours on the same Yamaha FX HO.

There's something special about landing a big fish off a PWC. Marlin, Wahoo, and big King Mackerel rank at the top of my hit list.

In a session earlier this year, I perfectly lined up my troll run to hit my favourite mark. As I closed in the distance lessened, anticipation building. Ten meters, five meters, two meters, over the mark, nothing. As I accept my losses and loop around to repeat the run, both rods fold over, reels begin screaming and line is disappearing fast! Reels make a unique sound when attached to one of the quickest fish in the sea, and this noise was textbook – a Wahoo double! Both fish dumped a heap of line, the one about 80m and the other about 160m. Fighting the fish closer to me, I noticed a sudden jerk on the stowed rod (the much bigger fish). In typical Wahoo fashion, another Wahoo thug set his mate free by snipping the swivel connection. Refocussing my attention toward the fish I was fighting, I looked down and saw a long silver fish on it's flank with iridescent blue stripes. No matter how many times you see it, it never gets any less impressive. I sink the gaff into what becomes my personal best Wahoo and head back to the ramp.

At the ramp I feel eyes burning the back of my head. One guy is nice enough to come over for a chat. "Mate, that is ridiculous! Did you really catch that from a jet ski?!" I love hearing the disbelief, it pushes me to keep doing what I do - targeting big fish off a PWC. It's nearly as motivating as the thought "if the Wahoo I landed was my biggest yet, how big was the other one?"

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

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WATER RESCUE CRAFT VITAL PART OF KIRKLAND FIRE DEPARTMENT






for the City of Kirkland in Washington state. Kirkland is nestled on the east side of Lake Washington, a 22-mile-long lake, which offers a plethora of water recreation opportunities for residents. Shared Doug, 'In 2015, our fire department purchased two PWCs to be used to improve rescue capabilities. As a member of our water rescue team, I began training, responding, and eventually teaching others, on our water rescue craft (WRC)." Doug continued, "Our original WRC were Sea-Doo SARs, a specialized Sea-Doo made by BRP to address search and rescue needs. First and foremost, it created a platform to provide immense safety to our rescue swimmers during training and rescue operations. It allowed us to expand our rescue efforts further offshore, and greatly improved communication among everyone involved throughout an incident.


We recently acquired new WRC, but since BRP no longer offered the SAR variant, we upfitted some Sea-Doo GTI 170 SEs with inflatable sponsons, heavy duty bumpers, GPS, lights, rescue sleds, helmets with built in communication and more. While these handle like any PWC, additional training is given to ensure competency in maneuvering safely around rescue swimmers and victims, using the rescue sled, searches at night, and preparing for operations in any challenging environment."

When asked about challenges, Doug said, "The biggest challenge is trying to hide your smile while training. Next would be issues such as maintaining positive communication with all resources involved during a rescue, adapting to the wide variety of calls, and dealing with elemental factors such as nighttime operations, high winds, and freezing temperatures. A rescue operation begins when the alert tones go off at the station, followed by qualified drivers responding to the dock to deploy the WRC. The most common response usually involves victims overwhelmed while recreating on the lake, such as a kiteboarder being overcome by conditions. Rescue crews have also responded to boat collisions, seaplane crashes, derelict vessels, motorcycles off bridges, boat fires, and much more.

In closing Doug shared this advice: Please be safe out there, wear a lifejacket, know the weather before heading out, and always be attentive — if you see someone in distress, help them out!

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
