

## IGNITE RACING FUEL

ecently, we had the opportunity to catch up with Matt Stover, VP of Operations at Ignite Racing Fuel where we learned about this unique business and their mission to provide high quality ethanol fuel to the race industry.

**PRO RIDER:** Please share the history of Ignite Racing Fuel.

MATT STOWER: Ignite is the original highperformance ethanol. Before E85 was widely available at the pump, Ignite was paving the way for ethanol in the performance world. We have a unique view of the market due to this. Unlike other companies that just blend chemicals without knowledge of the fuel, we are involved from the very beginning. Ignite is proud to be farmer owned and operated. We plant and harvest corn every year, which is then taken to the local ethanol plant (started by the owner of Ignite) to be converted to fuel grade ethanol, and finally brought to our shop where we blend the fuel with high quality denaturants to create the fuel you know and love!

**PR:** What is your relationship with the jet ski industry and jet ski riders?

MS: We got started in the industry with a couple of local father/son riders that were looking to get a little more out of their skis. From there it branched out to their friends and competitors within the industry as they started to see massive improvements in performance. Now we are working

with teams all over the country as they continue to push the limit and chase championships.

**FR:** What is your focus and what keeps you going?

Our focus and the thing we are most proud of go hand-in-hand-- the personal touch we offer that most companies do not. 



#### Sophie Francis As she reflects on the tragedy of losing her beloved husband Champion Racer Eric Francis, Champion Jet Ski Racer Sophie Francis, originally from the UK, shares her emotional journey and fierce determination.

PRO RIDER: Please share how you became involved with jet skis and racing.

**SOPHIE FRANCIS:** I started riding at 7. My parents bought an SXR 800 for the family for fun. Within a week they bought another because I kept riding laps, never stopping which meant no one else could ride. By 8 my parents approached a race team asking if they would take me on, train me to the next level. Garry Smith, APS Racing offered to pay my entry fees and gas for the first race of the JSRA British Championships. But first I had to show him I was worthy. You had to be 9 to race, just shy of my 9th birthday, they allowed me to enter. I won my first ever race in the Junior Class and later that year became the British Champion. Shortly after I won European and World titles, travelled around England, Europe and America winning many titles and championships. Since then, I've never looked back.

#### PR: How do you balance being a mother and competing at a high level in racing?

**SF:** I'm extremely grateful to have so much support and help. My parents, mother and fatherin-law have been there from day one. They look after the girls so I can continue doing what I love. Competing at a high level is very demanding. When not traveling I'm training. Fortunately, I can work, train, race and spend quality time with my family. It's crazy at times but I wouldn't have it any other way.

**PR:** Please speak to the physical demands of racing and how you maintain peak fitness. **SF:** Jet ski racing is very physical. Without a good training regimen, it's hard to compete at the top level. I CrossFit six times a week, on the other day I ride. Nutrition plays a huge part. Your body is like a ski. If you don't fuel it properly, you can't perform. I have the best nutrition coach, Reggie Biegler. He pushes me and keeps me on the path to achieving my goals.

**PR:** How have you coped with the loss of Eric and how has it affected your approach to racing? Can you share with readers anything about the accident?

**SF:** Losing Eric crushed us as a family, mentally and physically. Eric was our whole world. He was the rock to our family. The day we lost him, we lost ourselves. June 25th, 2022 was the worst day of our lives. It was and will be the hardest thing we will ever go through. I was 8 months pregnant at the time and had our 1-year-old with us. We were on a small island, Marie-Galante next to Guadeloupe. Eric would still be here today if proper safety measures were put in place. His death could have been prevented. Eric pressed his emergency GPS at 2:28pm asking for help. The organization decided to wait until 6pm to send someone out to look for him, even after other racers notified the race director he had not come back to shore. Eric was found 1 mile away from the finish line after an 80-mile offshore endurance race. The day before Eric's tragic incident another racer nearly lost his life after being left in the water. He was fortunate to have been seen by a racer and was picked up on the way to the finish line. Results later showed Eric suffered severe heat exhaustion after being left in the water for so long which then resulted to drowning. I told myself I never wanted to ride or race again. It was hard to even look at a jet ski. Within a few weeks I had this crazy feeling. I wanted to ride again. I gave birth to our beautiful baby girl, Bimini. Two weeks later I raced the last round of P1 Aqua X. I loved it! But even more so when I felt Eric riding beside me.

**PR:** What is your advice for parents and athletes who may be facing similar challenges?

> **SF:** Don't stop doing what you love. Find a good routine and stick to it. It makes things less stressful and easier. When you want something badly enough, you make it work. The biggest thing for

me after everything is caring what people thought, especially with my decision to continue racing. It's what keeps me focused, keeps me going. The amazing thing is we have received nothing but love and support from so many which has helped push us through the hardest time of our lives.

#### **PR:** What motivates you to continue racing?

**SF:** Eric and our beautiful baby girls motivate me. Even though Eric is not here in person he's forever in my heart. Both girls will forever be looking to me as a role model. For them to see their mom continue doing what their dad loved will mean the world to me. Maybe one day my girls will be little racers themselves and follow in their mommy and daddy's footsteps. Jet ski racing has always been in mine and Eric's blood so no doubt it will be in our girls too. Willow is already riding standups at the age of 2.

PR: Please share safety measures you take while competing, and what you think should be done to make the sport safe for all.

**SF:** The biggest safety measure I believe is safety crew-having enough qualified safety marshals at all times to keep a close eye on every individual. Also, for offshore racing it is extremely important to make sure all emergency transponders are working, to know where everyone is at all times. Organizations need to do what's best for the riders and not for themselves. Throughout the years I've also seen things being done to make it "more exciting for the audience." To me safety is more important than putting on a show.

#### PR: What are your plans for 2023?

**SF:** I'll be racing both sitdown and standup. I plan to race P1 Aqua X, Pro Watercross, World Finals and if all goes well, we will throw another few races into the mix. It's going to be a busy year racing and traveling, but we're all about winning races and making memories.

# CUSTOM K TOP PROVIDES SHADE TROMY TEXAS SELLI-

i, my name is Chris and I'm addicted to PWC fishing! Glad that's off my chest. My love for PWC fishing goes back before people really started getting into it. I remember going to the lake on holidays spending time with friends, family, and my love for fishing. If you've ever tried to launch a large boat by yourself, you know how difficult it is. I thought why can't I fish off a jet ski? So began my journey.

I started my PWC fishing adventures in small lakes knowing I would be fishing offshore soon. I grew up fishing the Gulf of Mexico from Freeport, Texas to Corpus Christi, Texas at an early age with my parents. The Gulf has always been home and will always be in my blood and my heart.

My PWC is an attention getter. However, it has also been criticized. Have you ever tried fishing in Texas mid-summer on a PWC and wished you had shade? I had a custom k-top made for those hot summer days. Custom fit

fishing rack to hold extra gas and all my rods with a large cooler was a must. We travel 30-50 miles out and you never want to run out of gas.

Let's not forget the music aspect for long rides. I preferred to take care of this one versus the dealer option, more bang for my buck.

Weather can be very limiting in the Gulf of Mexico, so targeting fish is weather specific some days. I can count on a large variety like KingFish, Shark, Cobia, Mahi Mahi, Snapper, Grouper and more. I wish I could say I always catch but we've all had the dreaded Skunk Day. Summer months are great for many species in Texas. However, I really look forward to winter Snapper fishing.

Facebook group Texas Jet Ski Fishing introduced me to many great people who share a passion for PWC fishing. One thing I never thought of was the dangers of fishing

alone on a PWC. Members Wesley Stillman, Hung So Lo, and my wife all talk about the danger. We preach it to the newer PWC fishing men and women who join us on these trips — Buddy system, you never know what can happen.

For those new to PWC fishing my best advice is take all the safety precautions you can. Get a VHF radio, an EPIRB, and other safety items. Never go offshore alone and always tell someone your plans. Ask questions, learn, and pass on your knowledge. Be safe out there and keep those LINES TIGHT!

ith the adrenaline-fueled thrills of racing comes a responsibility to prioritize safety. Course Marshal Craig Johnson shares his insights and experience in this interview.

From Northern California, Craig has worked in pre-hospital medicine/rescue for over a decade as an EMT, paramedic, firefighter and holds 4 degrees within the Fire and Emergency Medical Services field. His motto is: SKI — safety, kindness, integrity.

**PRO RIDER:** Please share how you became involved with course marshaling.

**CRAIG JOHNSON:** As a kid I lacked interest during family boat trips until a friend came out with 2 standup jet skis and this wild looking thing called an X2. PWC became very interesting after that. Watching our friend do tricks on skis and his abundance of racing trophies was interesting, but something I never thought I'd be involved with 20 years later.

As an EMT and looking for new experiences, I responded to a Jet Jam Racing ad looking for help. I watched course marshal John Bonkowski and told Kary Austin I wanted that job. With his decades of experience, John taught me more than I can describe in words.

### **PR:** Please describe the duties of the course marshal.

**Ed:** Above all, riders are our top priority. Our goal is to ensure riders grow, build confidence, and enjoy what the sport has to offer in a safe manner.

A course marshal ensures the safety of all while enforcing rules and regulations set forth by race and tech directors. Our job begins before we get to the race site with track preparations. Understanding the race location and planning

for track layout, hazards, egress points, pits, practice areas, environmental preservation and ambulance placement is crucial.

There's no job we won't do.

Setting up, rigging, track layout and setup, helps us understand our surroundings. Prior to racing, we ensure our gear and boats are prepped and ready beginning with a boat inspection. I created laminated cards and kept them in boats to ensure anyone can follow the same safety checks regardless of the operator. Must have tools on my boat include pliers, knife, extra band, extra rope, duct tape, zip tires and water bottles empty and full; on my person, life jacket, helmet, high visible cover, rash guards, lace up shoes, glasses, sealed radio, and rescue knife.

A successful course marshal exhibits preparedness, thoroughness, situational awareness, forward thinking, strong communication, kindness and understanding and never breaks safety standards like always having safety gear on and a finger on the throttle. Trust is a major component. We put ourselves in risky situations and must trust riders and their abilities to work around us knowing our teammates will be watching our backs.

What recommendations do you have to improve safety in the sport?

**Ed:** Keys to improving sport safety, in my opinion, include the following:

- A beginner rider training course all leagues use as a baseline for new riders prior to ever entering a racetrack.
- Provide riders practice time on the track to apply what they've learned prior to entering a race
- 3. Course Marshals need to maintain a set of safety checks for themselves and their boats while working for the race director and tech directors' expectations. Track design can make or break an injury free race day. For example, we never create a figure 8 or make splits too close together.
- 4. Personally, I think riders should be required to maintain high visibility colors on their helmets or person as being seen is the best way to avoid a major disaster. This also goes for buoys. No cutting corners with faded buoys or different colors.









5. A course marshal training course that is a standard nationwide. When watching course marshals in Thailand and how they work together it proves a solid foundation of knowledge across the board can support overall safety.


**PR:** Please share advice for racers, riders, and parents.

Racers, the sport would be nothing without you. Come ready to learn, make mistakes and have fun. Promoters, race directors, tech directors, staff and course marshals are there for you. We want you to be safe and gain confidence.

Parents, support your rider in gaining as much knowledge as possible prior to race day. Support them, encourage them, and give the sport an honest try. With confidence, I assure you all staff want a successful day.

ow do we ride?!" Joe Cornett shouts at the top of his lungs. "Ahhooot, ahhhoot!" is the group response, the team chant signaling the journey has begun. Making lifetime friends and dreams of adventure come true is the theme of the Great Lakes Ski Riders. The Great Lakes Ski Riders' 4th Annual Florida Invasion was two weeks of nonstop excitement and fun, no laptops, office meetings or deadlines, just good friends, great fun, and jet skiing. Starting in Branford, Florida, we rode the Santa Fe and Suwannee Rivers traveling over 1,200

The trip began during a polar vortex, bringing record low temperatures to Florida. Luckily the Great Lakes Ski Riders are built differently. ## **INTAKE MANIFOLD UPGRADES – 101**

ntake manifolds are an integral engine component located between the throttle body and cylinder head. They regulate the flow and distribution of air to the engine. Today's 4-stroke watercraft are equipped with intake manifolds that are uniquely designed for each engine. The most common intake upgrade is an aftermarket air intake system designed to deliver more air to the engine to produce more power. Unfortunately, the volume of air that can reach the engine's combustion chambers is restricted by a mesh element the manufacturers install in the inlet of the intake manifold.

The solution is removal of the restrictive mesh element to allow additional air flow to the engine. These mesh elements are encapsulated in the intake manifold on newer Yamaha & Sea-Doo watercraft making them difficult to remove if you don't have the proper parts and guidance. That's where aftermarket companies like RIVA Racing come in. They offer Intake Manifold Upgrade Kits for both brands that make the removal process easier and the intake manifold more efficient. The kits include special tools and fixtures that allow precision removal of the mesh element from inside the intake manifold. Yamaha Kits include a tapered, billet aluminum sleeve that you install to create a smooth transition from the throttle body to the intake manifold chamber for undisturbed air flow. The Sea-Doo kits include a billet aluminum block-off that fills the opening created to remove the mesh element. Viton o-rings and a billet clamp seal the block-off into the manifold and there are integrated ports that can be used for vacuum and boost operated accessories such as a MAP sensor or Blow-Off Valve.

When installing an Intake Manifold Upgrade Kit, you should always install an aftermarket air intake system to take full advantage of the improved efficiency of your intake manifold. When choosing an air intake system, make sure the filter element is certified to meet U.S. Coast Guard 'SAE-J1928' requirements for safety and reliability. RIVA Racing is one of the few aftermarket companies in our industry to obtain this special certification for their Power Filter Kits.



# ONE OF A KIND SUPERSX

MAKES MAIDEN SURF SESSION

### AT DAYTONA FREERIDE

hen local powersports technician and custom fabricator, Chance Jones, pitched me and the Virginia Beach Wavejunkies his latest idea, we were skeptical at best. "You're going to do what!?"

What happened next was several long nights many counseling sessions between a 1988 Kawasaki 300sx and a 1993 Yamaha Superjet, resulting in a one of a kind "SuperSX". With assistance of Wavejunkie legend, Craig "Zimmy" Hammond, Chance created a new beast which looks like a 300 but has the power and reliability of a surf built Superjet.

Much to our surprise, the chines on the 300sx hull and Superjet hull match extremely well, stock width of both are identical; 3 inches were chopped from the transom and from there to just forward of the motor mounts, the bottom deck is all Superjet. From that point forward and up, the hull is 300sx. This may not be easily noticeable to even a well-trained eye due to the heavily rockered nose with the bond line being kept intact as a splash guard. After endless hours of chopping and mating work, the result is a hull that retains stock 300sx length.

Built from parts laying around amongst Chance, Craig,

Charlie Wilson, Torr Lillard, and various locals, no detail was overlooked. The ski features a Yamaha 718 engine

that contains Paul Lehr "Shredder" ported cylinders and cases with a PFM lightened flywheel. Also included: PWC Doctor Versiplug, Solas Mag pump with a 9/15 Hooker, Thrustone trim system, HSI rear tow hook, SNL Industries driveshaft, Jetmaniac midshaft assembly covered by Diabolical Composites, SBT Crankshaft courtesy of the WaveDaze raffle, B-Pipe, PFP water box, HappenStance Performance Coil, Aura handle pole, NOS PJS bling, a completely unique tray area and the coolest part in my opinion, the Happenstance

Performance custom E-Box. If only everyone's electrical parts were as easily accessible, I think we all would spend more time riding and less time wrenching, especially in salty environments.

While at the Daytona Freeride, Joe Johnston, Liquid

Khaos, finished his turf job on the beach and last-minute vendor purchases allowed the SuperSX to make her maiden surf session, all held together with OEM Sea-Doo hardware!

Great job Chance! It's awesome to see creativity at work.


t all started for me when I was 11, in 1972. We were at the right place growing up when Kawasaki Motor Corporation rolled down the hill at the Carlsbad Lagoon looking for test riders for their prototype Jet Ski. Along with brother David, Rusty Sharman, and a few others, we got paid "lunch" to ride.

Riding all the while, a few years later I competed in my first race in 1977 on a yellow 400cc Jet Ski and raced professionally until 1983. (Did you know? In the beginning, we raced on our knees, not standing up.) I was a team member with 3-time National Champions

Doug Silverstein and my brother, "Tuner Dave". We participated in IJSBA's first World Final event in 1982 at Lake Havasu, competing in Pro-Modified and Slalom event finals. In 1979 John Vaughan-Chaldy and I started one of the first Jet Ski Rental businesses.

In 1985, I happened again to be at the Carlsbad Lagoon when another major manufacturer rolled down that same hill looking for a qualified test rider for their prototypes. After learning basic Japanese, I traveled to Okinawa and Hamamatsu, Japan, where I was contracted by Yamaha to help develop the WaveRunner and WaveJammer. Side note: During a test session I gashed my leg on a jagged launch ramp. Yamaha wanted to immediately end testing to get me medical attention but in a very tactful way, I said; "I didn't travel all this way to not test". So, they bandaged me up as best they could, and I went back out. Imagine the scene: It's pouring rain, you're injured, pushing the limits of a prototype with the Yamaha Development team staring out at you under their umbrellas from the shoreline. It was quite a moment. I felt very honored to spend time with the development team, and early on was even compensated for teaching a few of them how to ride. At the end of my development contract, Yamaha presented me with an incredible oneoff Yamaha Race Team jacket — sadly, stolen shortly after returning to the US.






In 1986, I was hired as Yamaha's first Marketing Coordinator in the newly formed Water Vehicle Department in the Marine Division and had the pleasure of working directly with mentor Lee Werner, Product Manager, and key personnel instrumental in Yamaha's first-generation personal watercraft product lines and US sales success. We suggested to Yamaha they would "need to win on Sunday to sell more on Monday" and at the time, they said they would never be involved in racing!

We first introduced Yamaha products to SeaWorld for their shows and helped develop the safety description for the Visibility Spout. I was featured on Yamaha's first apparel line for both the WaveRunner and WaveJammer. In 1987, I stepped down from R&D to concentrate on my full-time job at Yamaha, and recommended Larry Rippenkroeger to develop the "Superjet".
















To me, the most gratifying and important part of the evolution of the WaveRunner and similar PWCs is its versatility, in large part due to what Shawn Alladio, founder of K38, has done by revolutionizing lifesaving around the world, training public and federal safety agencies worldwide.

In 2016 I was honored to be inducted into the Wake of Fame for Lifetime Achievement. Now 62, I'm back on the water thanks to John, David, Sam, Rusty, the GOAT, and others. I'm still heavily involved in this industry along with my business partner, legend and founder of Baron Custom Accessories, John "Baron" Vaughan-Chaldy, with our digital marketing and advertising company, MaxOpp Marketing.
