

FREESTYLE PRODIGY IN THE MAKING: BROCK DOBERSTEIN

When Brock Doberstein was 2 weeks old, his family travelled to WV for the 2018 Pro Watercross Nationals. At 1 month old, they drove from NC to Arizona for the IJSBA World Finals. Brock's dad, Freestyle Champion Ryan 'flyin Ryan' Doberstein said, "He napped alongside the action. When he was 3, we did a backflip on my ski! Brock learned to ride alone at 4. He used my old Kawasaki 650SX I acquired at age 13, Yamaha Superjets, and his fav - my 'old school' freestyle ski. Our ski is a Wamilton SJ hull with an Erik Brigham 735 61x engine, tuned by Paul Lehr, Full Spectrum 49cc carb, and my TNT pipe from my 900cc freestyle class.

Brock's favorite tricks are side rail riding with no hands, a one-footed "scarecrow," and riding backward.

He's an entertainer, engaging with the crowd. For safety, Brock rides at idle speed, wearing a tether and life jacket. We practice stopping with the kill switch and red button. He knows these skis lack brakes like his bike. Hand signals are practiced. I monitor surroundings; if I tap my head, he returns. As he learns throttle, I aim to modify it for safety. Sharing the ski poses a power challenge, needing it powerful and barely powerful.

The AJSA and Junior Stars program had me teach Juniors freestyle moves on their race skis. We love what AJSA does. Recently, Brock earned 2nd place at age 5 among 6 Junior Freestylers. At this rate, I see Brock being the youngest kid to flip a standup, but I'm not rushing it. Our focus remains on enjoying these young years as a family, traveling."

HOW TO DOCK A PERSONAL WATERCRAFT

Even if you keep your personal watercraft (PWC) on a trailer, your day on the water aboard a Sea-Doo, WaveRunner or Jet Ski is likely to begin and end at a dock, and may include tying up at a gas dock, restaurant, or other dock. Knowing how to successfully approach a dock will make you look like a pro and help avoid damage to your PWC, and injury to you and your passenger. Here's how to dock a PWC the right way:

7 Steps for Docking a PWC, Jet Ski, WaveRunner or Sea-Doo

- Study the situation—approach into the wind or current, if possible.
- 2. Be aware of other nearby boat traffic.
- 3. Think about where you'll tie up to secure your dock line.
- 4. Tell any passengers to sit tight and have dock lines ready.
- Approach the dock slowly
 come in at idle.
- 6. Use short blips of throttle to help with steering control.
- If applicable to your craft, use attached cleats, or loop the line around the base of your handlebars.

Whether you're a seasoned explorer or a newbie seeking aquatic escapades, PWC Trail Finder is your compass to uncharted waters, ensuring your every journey is as informed as it is exhilarating.

was born and raised in south Louisiana an hour from the Atchafalaya Spillway. With a million acres of swamp, rivers, bayous, and lakes, the Atchafalaya is the nation's largest river swamp. My father was an avid bass fisherman; as his only son, he was intent on me learning my way around by boat. Fast forward to 2006 I acquired a pair of new Sea-Doos RXTs. I spent a lot of time exploring the Atchafalaya and other area waters near my home.

During my first Mudbug (Greenhulk's annual PWC rally in Morgan City, Louisiana) I realized most visiting PWC riders hardly knew their way around the area. I and a few other locals took it upon ourselves to guide organized tours off the beaten path. Soon I received emails and calls inquiring about trail data. Eventually I considered it might be easier if there was a central location where GPS data could be shared/stored/retrieved.

How does PWC Trail Finder work? Easy! Go to the website www.pwctrailfinder.com agree to the T&Cs, simply pick a state, and scroll through the available routes. Each route includes a brief description of the trail, number of round-trip miles and a view of the area in

Google Maps with the GPS route overlayed. Click the download button and a GDB (Garmin Data Base) file will download to your PC. From there you can load the trail directly to your GPS unit (or to an SD card or other external drive). The site also works in mobile although steps may vary by phone type.

All data is free! No login required and we record nor store personal user data. As of 2023, there are over 20,000 miles of trails from 24 states and the District of Columbia. Every trail was previously recorded by GPS on a PWC ride before being added to the site. Whenever possible, each trail is supplemented with pertinent waypoints such as marinas, ramps, fuel, food, local island/sandbar hangout, etc. Additionally, whenever possible each trail will display a "Report" or "Video" button (written, pictorial, video, or combination) of what to expect on your ride based on another's previous experience. Nearly half the trails on the site contain some version of a report and I've always felt, especially riding somewhere new for the first time — the ability to know what's around the corner, before you get there, is a valuable tool. PR

L5: Having created a brand that's known globally and seeing consumers around the world progress their skills on our products.


PR: How do you stay current on the latest industry trends and developments?

he factory steering and controls on your PWC consist of the steering system, handlebars, control pods and grips. Most of these original components provide little adjustment or customization for rider comfort and control.

Most of the materials that make up the stock steering system are plastic to save production costs. This includes critical items such as the steering column and control levers. Wear on the original plastic materials quickly causes the tolerances between them to loosen up, resulting in a sloppy or disconnected riding experience. That's not the feeling you want when you're navigating busy waterways or competing on a racecourse.

Recognizing the importance of a solid connection between rider and craft, RIVA Racing offers upgraded steering and control components with superior functionality and high-strength aluminum construction. Billet steering columns, billet control levers, and proprietary aluminum handlebars are engineered to optimize reliability and

rider comfort through advanced design and ergonomics. The aftermarket steering systems accept motocross style bars available in different widths, heights and bends that accommodate a variety of aftermarket grips. The versatile clamping mechanism on the billet steering columns provides added adjustability to match the rider's bar position preference. Most factory grips now feature a flat "winged" design that limits the rider from changing hand positions when sitting or standing. This issue is resolved by installing aftermarket grips such as ODI lock-on grips for maximum control. Once the steering system, bars and grips are upgraded, the plastic control levers are next. I'm proud all my customers are happy with the results they get and I'm proud of the team riders. We're getting wins in the USA and recently in the UK just had two wins in a row since our rider over there joined the team through our UK supplier. The achievements wouldn't happen without all of them behind me.

PR: What is your personal preference when it comes to riding PWC and where do you enjoy riding?

I like going out, data logging and tuning to find new tricks, what works and what doesn't. All testing is done on my own machine. When I'm not on the river doing that then it's out cruising and chilling with whoever is out on a ride, maybe look for some drag races for a bit of fun, always pushing the business though. Getting my name out there.

PR: Looking ahead, what are your plans, any new projects on the horizon you are excited about?

If: New projects, well that's a secret so watch this space. Can't give those away, never know who's reading ha ha. Obviously with the launch of the new engine from Rotax there will be a lot of research and development going into that and seeing where we can go with it which is exciting. Other than that, just got to keep pushing for Team Ruthless and everyone that's part of it.

I'd like to thank everyone that's believed in me and stuck by me, you know who you are, and I appreciate every one of you. Let's Go!



My van is a 1970 Ford Econoline Supervan. It has the original motor and transmission, a 302 Ford v8, 3 speed automatic. I did an exhaust, intake, and bigger carburetor to wake it up. It has no power steering or power brakes so it's a bit of a handful to drive. Being such a simple machine is why it's been so reliable. Less to go wrong.

A friend snagged it off eBay, stashed in an Indiana hangar with a busted transmission. He got it to Illinois, fixed the transmission, and 3 years later, we struck a deal. I'd handle rust repair and paint on his truck, and in return, I'd get the van. I was pumped - it seemed like the ultimate jet ski and dirt bike hauler!

First was a tune up and updated carb and exhaust. The back was totally bare. I put a subfloor down then laminate wood flooring and new carpet up front. Got it done just in time for the 2013 Wisconsin Dells Freeride. It worked great as a shuttle bus into town with all my buds at night.

The next year I got a deal on Cragar wheels and got them on right before the Dells ride. The year after I fixed what little rust it had and repainted it. The roof is still original paint! It's been to WaveDaze in Virginia Beach, a 2,000mile round trip and WaveRave in Michigan a

It's my most dependable ride, though it's almost comical — cruising around becomes a story-sharing session. Every gas stop turns into a trip down memory lane with folks sharing their van experiences. And that's why I cherish it. I restore cars professionally, and the monotony of working on muscle cars gets old. What excites me is sparking memories in non-car enthusiasts, just through the vehicle I'm driving. My '64 bug gets a similar reaction — stories and attention that make it all worth it. PR














The event introduces riders to racing with Pro Watercross and includes a rec ride, a great raffle with items from vendors across the community, and a BBQ rib cookoff.



aised on the Tennessee River, boating became a family tradition since I was 2 months old. Our journeys ranged from camping in a 17-foot Sea Ray Bowrider to owning 35-to-38-foot Sea Rays on the same dock today. As a teen, I had a modified Yamaha WaveRaider 760. College took me away from boating, but I returned with a 25-foot Baja 252, then a 342 Baja "Two OBNOXIOUS." Our friends' boating group inspired us to explore more with 2-stroke skis - I got a GP1200 named "Slightly OBNOXIOUS." As our group grew, I upgraded to a 2009 FZR for the speed and adventure.

Upon acquiring the 2009 model, constant clutch replacements prompted me to opt for a Turbo swap. With multiple clutch replacements in two years, I sought a 2016 FZS with the right specs: white on black, SVHO motor, and a solid starting point. After a search, I found a suitable ski in Arizona with only 19 hours. Crucially, my build required a bolt-on system without altering the mid wall or factory electronics and aimed to preserve the rear storage bucket, serving as my cooler.

I designed a distinct turbo system for my ski, deviating from the conventional turbo modifications seen in South Florida. Using a 1/2" thick 304 stainless flange inspired by a factory exhaust gasket, the setup situates the turbo above the tunnel and behind the midwall. This innovation maintains consistent cooling, upholding the typical ski functionalities. With a 2.5" inner pipe and a 3.0" outer pipe/jacket, featuring a V-band flange for the Borg Warner turbine housing, the system efficiently handles temperatures — peak recording at 137°F after a full pull. My downpipe, with a 3" inner pipe and a 3.5" outer pipe/jacket, integrates a wideband bung for water splash prevention and redirects water into the exhaust for cooling. The kit is designed for SVHO models with Riva through-hull exhaust, carefully not affecting storage or oil drainage. The polished aluminum cold side is connected to a Fizzle intercooler, catering to those with common mods.

Tuning for the turbo setup, executed by Deans Team, guarantees top-notch performance. Even under loaded storage and a full tank, the ski maintains consistent speeds, consistently pulling 92-93 mph and occasionally hitting 94 mph.

Ski runs 94 MPH @ 9360 RPMS and is set at 20 lbs of boost (93 pump gas). On low boost it runs 88mph, and spins 8850 RPMS and set to 15 lbs of boost. There is a waterproof switch on the handlebars to flip from high or low boost anytime. I keep the ski around 11.7 Air Fuel Ratio (49 to 54 psi fuel pressure weather depending). Richer than most like on these motors but safer too.

Hosts Queensland State Titles, Showcasing Intense Racing and Trans-Tasman Spirit



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Compliments of Gulf Streamers Members

aul De La Melena, originally from New York, made his way to Florida and in 2014 purchased his first skis, a 2000 Sea-Doo GTX Millennium Edition and a 2001 Polaris, learning all he could about the engineering aspects of the vessel, hull, mechanics, electrical, everything that made up a PWC settling with a 2016 Sea-Doo RXT 260. When asked about the Gulf Streamers, Raul shared this story with Pro Rider.

The Gulf Streamers group emerged in 2017 out of a need for comprehensive information on crossing to the Bahamas via a PWC. Navigating details like entry requirements, emergency protocols, US re-entry, customs, immigration, international law, and safety was challenging due to limited resources. The group's mission was to compile all this vital information in a centralized and easily accessible platform for the benefit of others.

In 2017, our inaugural trip brought like-minded individuals together for a group crossing, each watching out for the other. This tradition grew with each year, except for the pandemicinduced hiatus that saw borders closed. Our post-pandemic comeback in 2022 marked a memorable event, with 26 jetskis, including my 2-year-old's first Bahamas experience as a Gulf Streamers member. In 2023, as Covid restrictions eased, we crossed with 17 jetskis and 9 boats, totaling 51 riders.

The inspiration for this year's route was motivated by a fellow group member, Elias Nasseh, who tragically passed away in 2021. Elias always dreamed of crossing to Bimini. In conversations with Elias's family, the idea struck me that his last name, Nasseh, bears a resemblance to "Nassau."



This gave rise to the idea of commemorating Elias with a trip to Nassau, leading to the creation of the event name "Nasseh to Nassau."

This year's Bimini/Nassau run was without a doubt one of the most interesting and adventurous trips to date. With 15 PWCs and 9 boats, 3 major manufacturers were represented by several Yamahas, Sea-Doos, and 1 Kawasaki, all made the trip without incident.

Crossing conditions could not have been better as most PWCs kept pace even loaded down with extra fuel and a week's worth of supplies. We crossed as 1 big group but once reaching Bimini the novice riders stayed at Bimini while a smaller group of 5 boats and 4 skis (1 Kawasaki, 2 Yamahas, and 1 Sea-Doo) continued the more difficult journey to Chub and then Nassau.

We faced challenging conditions during our journey to Nassau, overcoming fuel shortages, tough waters, and unexpected delays. Despite these trials, our resilient group made the call to prioritize safety and return a day early, demonstrating our unity and ensuring a safe trip home.

Entering Bimini, encountering the Mackie Shoal, the joy of Nassau's main channel, waterfalls at Atlantis, swimming with pigs, meeting local Gulf Streamer members - these were all fantastic moments. However, the ultimate highlight is the quality time spent with family and friends, building lasting bonds, creating memorable stories for generations to come.

Our heartfelt gratitude goes to the Gulf Streamers admin group and every member for making these experiences truly extraordinary! **PR**

























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
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JSRA-British Jetsport Championships

he best riders in the UK gathered for Round 3 of JSRA racing at Crosby Lakeside, just north of Liverpool and home of the Beetles and from where the RMS Titanic was registered. There is a huge amount of sea fairing heritage in the area, making it a great place for race weekend.

The British race scene is growing, numbers are the highest in 20 years with big international racing personalities, James Bushell, Simon Belcher, Alfie Fenwich and Johnathan Kavanah (the latter switched from freestyle to racing) and numerous up and coming internationally strong competitors. Many UK racers have their eye on the Euros, and a few on the World Finals in Havasu. 
Sport Stock class was won by Deven Farthing, followed by Kayden Baldwin 2nd and Wyatt Hayes 3rd place.






