

#### A RISING STAR IN JET SKI RACING — CAROLINE MAAS, HENDERSONVILLE, TN

**PRO RIDER:** Your rapid rise in the jet ski racing scene is impressive. You've only raced 3 times.

**CAROLINE MAAS:** I have 3 races under my belt so far. I started riding as a teenager, though only recently had the courage to pursue racing after attending Pro Watercross Nashville Invitational as a spectator. While sitting in the pits, I learned everything I could. After my first race in Chattanooga, I was hooked! My inspiration in short — my family and friends!

PR: Taking on top female competitor Sophie Francis in Spindale and securing a victory is a remarkable achievement. Can you describe the strategies that fueled your success in that race?

I rode as hard and fast as I could, paid attention to the buoys without keeping track of Sophie's position on the course.

PR: Racing your 1100cc runabout in the 1800 open class securing a 2<sup>nd</sup> overall and 1st in class is a testament to your skill and determination. Walk us through the challenges you faced and how you managed to excel despite the odds.

**Em:** Racing against larger machines was intimidating and if I got stuck in their pump wash, I'd be toast. I did my best to avoid getting fire-hosed and keep them behind me in the turns. It took a lot of strength on the corners to edge out the bigger skis, but I concentrate on my breathing while racing, to maintain my stamina throughout and ride hard until the finish line.

PR: Beyond the racetrack, what are your favorite activities?

I love being on the water and spend a lot of time leisure riding my Sea-Doo Wake Pro 230 on Old Hickory Lake.

I am a classically trained dancer, and dance for fun all the time. I enjoy SxS off-roading in the winter.

PR: Race preparation is key to success in any sport. Please share some insights into your race-day routine.

**Em:** Race day is still new to me; I'm still honing my pre-race routine. So far, it starts with meditation, a protein shake, pre-workout, music, and a little jumping around and dancing. Dancing gets my body loose and warmed up, enhances focus, and boosts energy levels for the race.



I plan on practicing and running buoys and am eager to get to as many races as possible and securing sponsors to be able to do so and expand my presence in the jet sport racing community.





In speaking with the leadership of the different clubs, they expressed a common message for the need of quality apparel for their membership but did not want the hassle of managing the process. it seemed to be a perfect match. The RevdUp Apparel line was created. RevdUp Apparel currently provides design, creation, hosting, and fulfillment for four (4) jet ski clubs in the United States.

Sonja shared, "the growth since we started has been at a pace that has really allowed us to refine our process. We want to provide a quality product that is customized to the customers vision, not ours."

Sonja, no stranger to the jet ski community, living in Middleburg, Florida, is an active member of the Ski Riders of North Florida and the owner of Alpha Dawg, a specialty products company specializing in apparel, engraving and embroidery products. She has a background in art and graphic design and heads up all interactions between customer, artist, and printer to ensure the customer's vision is brought to print.

When asked about the inspiration behind the designs, Don said, "the RevdUp Apparel process is a personal experience from start to completion. We meet one on one with the customer to get their ideas and then we work between the customer and the art team until the

the customer and the art team until the customer is happy. Our printing process bucks the traditional restrictions. Silkscreen and heat transfer methods are limited to specific locations (chest, back, sleeve), but printing 360 we can take your custom high-resolution design and place it all over the shirt. We call it 360-degree printing. Add spf protection and moisture wicking technology and you have that quality, professional RevdUp apparel."

Sonja and her husband love riding their Sea-Doo GTX 230 and her favorite place to ride is anywhere on the St. Johns River. On her bucket list is the ride to the Bahamas, and no doubt one day she will make it happen!

RevdUp Apparel will be a lot more visible in the 2024 season. They are in the process of designing and printing brand banners and tents and plan to attend as many events as possible to provide a more visible presence and support for the jet ski community.

## 2023 PI AQUA X CHAMPION - PRO ENDURO 300

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




he 2023 Fizzle Racing HydroDrags World Finals were a record setting affair! What a storybook beginning for new Race Director, Billy Tew and new Title Sponsor, Fizzle Racing, with Jose Luis Hernandez making history again. What began 15 years ago as a grassroots movement in the tiny C-54 Canal in Sebastian, Florida, has turned into a full-blown drag racing spectacle drawing spectators and racers from around the globe!

In 2008 when Tim McKercher first created the concept, later passing the torch to Mikey Young in an era that lasted a full decade, this level of evolution in the sport would have been unfathomable. The top speeds and pure acceleration these watercraft are achieving, along with cutting-edge industry-leading innovation available for spectators to take in are truly a sight to behold.

Roaming the pits had us close and personal with BK Built's World's Fastest Personal Watercraft, the FuelTech compound supercharged and turbocharged PWC, the 1-week-old 2024 Fizzle

The two-day HydroDrags event unfolded at Lions Park, Lake Alfred, Florida. With an unexpected cold front brewing, weather conditions took a turn for the worse, turning the event into a battle of rider skill and rapid last minute mechanical adjustments. With parts being swapped through the night in hotel parking lots and tuners dialing in setups minutes before the race, the action did not disappoint. As the wind blew harder and the waves rolled in higher by the minute, the crowd watched eagerly as four classes of watercraft and their riders (Pro Stock, Pro Spec, SuperStock and Unlimited) battled it out for all the glory, earning the title and exclusive spot at the top of the podium along with cash prizes and prizes from companies including FuelTech, Riva Racing, WaveDek Miami, Broward Motorsports Racing, Jettribe Racing, and Millennium Custom Wheels.

Pro Stock Class kicked off with strong competition from familiar faces and newcomers. After running up and down through the winner's and loser's brackets, the final race came down to two young guns lining up on the launchpad to go head-tohead - HydroDrag rookie, World Champion closed course racer from Kuwait, Rashed Aldawas, on his Fizzle Racing Sea-Doo RXP 300 built by Calas Performance, versus the 5-time HydroDrags World Champion Angelica Gonzalez on her Angelica Racing Yamaha FZR. After a tough battle and mechanical issues on both skis, Rashed edged a narrow victory undefeated on his way to his first HydroDrags Championship trophy!

Spec Class was next with a Calas built Sea-Doo RXP, driven by Harold Ramos, racing to the top of the competition. Later the ski was disqualified for a throttle body rules violation allowing Omar Maldonado to elevate to the top of podium after a fierce showing of mechanical talent and rider ability aboard his supercharged Yamaha FZS.







Second place went to HydroDrags rookie Carlos Perez of CP Racing in South Florida, a top builder in his own right, with multiple recreational turbocharged watercraft coming from his shop exceeding the 120+ MPH barrier.

The Speed Alley competition was one for the record books! As 15 MPH winds caused waves to crescendo into white caps. Jose Luis Hernandez of BK Built risked life and limb to go full send mode with more than 65 PSI of boost plus nitrous on the way to one-upping himself in a big way. Jose blazed across the water full throttle for 4 seconds, long enough to stamp a new Official World Record at 142 MPH aboard his turbo nitrous equipped Yamaha GP1800R, obliterating his previous World Record of 135 MPH. Joel Villa, CRT Racing followed next with a solid showing at 132 MPH - also on a Yamaha GP1800R. Drama ensued following Speed Alley as the top two teams called each other out to an anytime, anywhere Street Grudge Race. Eventually CRT Racing forfeited the race to BK Built unable to get their watercraft properly prepared for the showdown. Enthusiasts are eagerly waiting to see if the race will happen in the future. Once cooler heads prevailed, HydroDrags Speed Alley rounded out with Carlito Del Valle, owner at CRT Racing, achieving 105 MPH on a Spec Class Yamaha GP1800R, just shy of the 106 MPH record held by Cuco Performance.

Drag racing continued with the SuperStock Class, where racers are allowed to do nearly any modifications to their watercraft other than turbocharging or nitrous injection. In the end, most of the horsepower proved counterproductive due to water conditions. Reliability and rough water hookup became the recipe for success as Harold Ramos avenged his earlier disqualification by taking the SuperStock title on his Sea-Doo RXP! In true Cinderella story fashion, rookie Rashed Aldawas drove the Fizzle Racing Pro Stock RXP to second, solidifying a one-two finish at the top of the SuperStock Class podium for the two Calas built Sea-Doo RXPs.

"I personally want to say "thank you" for everyone that came and supported the event. Big thanks to Fizzle Racing, FuelTech, DDR Performance, Pro Valve Racing, Riva Racing, AquaSport Performance, Racer H2O, and the City of Lake Alfred for having us. Would like to shoutout my other half, KD Eastridge, for being there countless hours before and during the race to make it run successfully. 

# UNDERDOG

n an industry dominated by major shops with lengthy lists of clientele and seemingly endless bankrolls, led by alpha male personalities who are driven by competition and the spoils that come from victory, one speed king has risen to the top of the game. Brian Kirchberger of BK Built is that man, AC technician by day, jetski superhero by night, Brian has been the brains and magic behind the World's Fastest PWC since 2016 and continues to accomplish the impossible out of his humble 2-car garage. His tuning ability and mechanical knowledge are responsible for the last 7 consecutive World Records for Fastest Personal Watercraft in the World.

While naysayers were calling the current World's Fastest Ski a "one-hit-wonder" that would never reach the 135 MPH record speed again achieved in the summer of 2020, BK had already secretly consulted on a Cuco Performance street race build

that also reached the 135 MPH mark in testing. More than two years later, with rumors of other shops aiming at a chance to beat the record, it was time to dust off the World's Fastest Ski. It was time to shock the world again. This time owner/driver Jose Luis Hernandez a.k.a. World's Fastest Man on Water and builder/tuner Brian a.k.a. BK Built locked in on a new goal — breaking the 140 MPH barrier!

Fast forward to October 15th, 2023, Lions Park, Lake Alfred, Florida. With an unfortunate turn in the weather and 15 MPH winds kicking up waves into white caps, Jose Luis Hernandez of BK Built risked life and limb to go 'full send mode' with more than 65 PSI of boost plus nitrous on the way to one-upping himself in a big way. Jose blazed across the water at full throttle for around 4 seconds, just long enough to stamp a new Official World Record at 142 MPH. The run obliterated his previous World Record of 135 MPH. Not only that, the sheer acceleration of this beastly machine had people in disbelief, starting to doubt their own eyes and in shock of what they just witnessed.

This watercraft is truly on a level above anything else ever created.





Here's a rundown of what has changed since the 135 MPH run in 2020:

- The stock exhaust manifold was swapped out for a dry exhaust header.
- The stock cast intake manifold was changed to a billet intake manifold, capable of running dual injectors per cylinder to keep up with the demands of the new methanol fuel setup that replaced the old E-85 setup.
- The turbo size was upped from the previous 72mm turbo that was rated for 1200 HP to one that is now rated for 1300+ HP.
- The oil pan was changed to the high-volume billet aluminum oil pan created by Anderson Dick at FuelTech and a FuelTech ECU replaced the outgoing MoTeC ECU.

What hasn't changed is the hull which is still untouched as far as any weight reduction, still running the factory cast cylinder head, engine block, crankshaft, and oil pump, plus the large Fizzle SuperCooler intercooler, mechanical fuel pump and custom pitched jet pump impeller.

Keep a lookout for this ski because, rumor has it, the BK Built team has their eye on a new goal! PR

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# **INTAKE GRATES -101**

ater, by way of jet thrust, is what propels your personal watercraft. The jet drive draws water into a large inlet underneath your craft and forces it out at high speed through the nozzle at the rear. When the first Jet Ski was produced in 1976, the primary purpose of the intake grate was to protect the jet pump components from large debris entering and damaging them. A few metal bars were secured across the length of the opening. Even today, most OEM intake grates still share the same general design and functionality. For a craft that hasn't been modified, the stock intake grate works well enough to provide protection from debris. But they are barely acceptable from a performance point of view. In fact, some intake grates that come standard on PWC have been designed to reduce performance and limit top speed to help the manufacturers meet their top speed limitation agreement with the U.S. Coast Guard.

When a watercraft is modified to produce more engine power and top speed, the stock intake grate becomes inefficient. As engine power is increased so too is the rate at which the pump impeller spins, drawing more water into the pump. Restrictions in the OEM intake grate can limit the amount of water that enters the pump and prevent it from distributing water evenly to the pump impeller of a modified craft. Excessive turbulence at the top of the pump tunnel induces cavitation that causes the impeller to slip resulting in poor acceleration and a loss of top speed, much like the tires on your car when running on wet pavement. RIVA has developed a line of intake grates with redesigned ramps and wings that deliver water more evenly and efficiently into the pump. This reduces the turbulence before the pump impeller enabling it to process water in a more solid state producing more thrust and higher top speed. Their angle and shape, as well as the configuration of the intake grate's opening, improve hook-up enabling you to maintain more speed in rough, choppy conditions. On some units the increase in performance has been so effective that aluminum and other

soft alloys can't take the stress, and for those models RIVA produces intake grates made of solid cast stainless steel. This ultrastrong material allows thinner bars and larger openings to feed even more water into your jet pump at all speeds.

Aftermarket intake grates aren't the only option to improve jet pump performance. In the case of Yamaha WaveRunners, and others where the tunnel ramp is built into the intake grate, the OEM grates and transom plate they are secured to have voids to reduce weight and save material. For most users, these voids don't necessarily affect performance on a stock craft. But for those interested in performance, and

especially maximum acceleration, they adversely affect modified craft. The voids trap air that gets sucked into the pump amplifying the amount of air bubbles, or cavitation, created when you accelerate. They lower the density of the water in the jet pump making it more compressible costing thrust at the nozzle. This results in a quick jump in engine acceleration but only a very slow increase in vehicle speed. To counteract this RIVA Racing offers Pump Seal Kits that consist of polymer pieces molded to precisely fill the voids. With the voids in the intake grate properly sealed, cavitation is minimized. This translates to vastly improved acceleration. It also reduces

the likelihood of damage to your jet pump components caused by excessive cavitation. Left unchecked, excessive cavitation will eat away the surfaces and edges of your pump impeller, wear ring and pump stator vanes which will lead to even more cavitation.

Performance isn't just about getting the most horsepower out of your engine. It also requires improving jet pump efficiency. Optimizing your jet pump components will allow you to get the most out of the aftermarket modifications to your craft's engine. PR





SIDE-BY-SIDE COMPARISON OF STOCK INTAKE GRATE AND AFTERMARKET INTAKE GRATE







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
CAPTURING THE ACTION ONE CLICK AT A TIME

le knew we were in for a show in this year's Virtual Freestyle Championships, however we could not have known at the time we were in the presence of both the 2023 AM and Pro IJSBA World Champions, crowned the following month at Lake Havasu City.

This was not the only thing special about Virtual Freestyle this year. Blowsion, taking the headline sponsor spot, elevated the competition still further, and allowed us to offer a prize purse for the first time.



university, is an up-and-coming freestyler and racer who enjoys water skiing and windsurfing and is part of a circus group.

**PRO RIDER:** When did you get involved with jet skis and specifically when did you start doing freestyle?

CLAIRE HARTUNG: I've always been part of this scene through my father, Marc Sickerling. Growing up, I attended numerous jet ski events and had chances to ride. In 2021, luck led us to a 25-year-old Superjet, my first ski, allowing me to learn from scratch — a feat not possible with my father's highly modified jet ski. Having obtained my motorboat license at 16 in Germany, we enjoyed jet skiing together. I honed my skills on rivers in our region and a private jet ski lake in the Netherlands, where we continue training today.

### **EQUIPMENT:**

1997 Yamaha Superjet, which was only slightly modified with a different cylinder head and exhaust. We made hull modifications including footholds, a lowered carbon hood, new drain system and tubbies . Norbert Weber from Lightweight helped with this process.

Last winter I had the opportunity to paint my ski with my own design and my crankshaft was rebuilt.

#### **PR:** Who inspires you?

**CH:** My greatest inspiration is my father, who, thanks to his many years of experience, has mastered numerous tricks you don't see anywhere else these days. I'd like to master them too as I've seen how these tricks impress the audiences.

For freeriding I find Abraham Hochstrasser

Regarding freestyle, Lee Stone inspired me even before I had my own ski. I saw him ride at a European Championship in 2018 and the double backflip stayed in my memory.

### PR: Where do you practice?

**Ch:** We train near Eindhoven (Netherlands) on a jet ski lake (stand-up only), a 2h drive while I sleep in the car. We meet our freestyle friends and spend one day a week jet skiing. In Germany, there is no opportunity to ride like this.

#### **PR:** In which events have you participated?

CH: My first was 2022 Virtual Freestyle a great introduction competition as we were able to film my 2-minute routine until we were happy with the result. I took 2nd place in the 800cc Novice class.

We joined the European Freestyle Championships in Paris, as my father was supposed to be a judge. Thomas Wolf, another German rider in the 800cc class, persuaded me to take part and 30 minutes later I performed my routine and to my surprise became European vice-champion.

I raced the final round of the Belgian championship, which provided insight into racing, and I got to see Quinten Bossche.



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# OIL PAN UPGRADE: PREVENTING CATASTROPHE

The Yamaha 1800CC engine is one of the most capable watercraft engines out there. It has set numerous records and is top choice amongst most racers and builders. Aside from the engine's proven power capabilities, the engine is fairly reliable. As with anything mechanical, there are flaws that can be addressed to improve reliability.

One of the newest components available for this engine, and now the 1900CC variant, is the FuelTech billet oil pan. The oil pan addresses major issues that will ultimately cause severe engine damage.

From the factory, the Yamaha engines come with a small, poorly designed oil pan. The oil pan features a pickup tube and baffling that is far from ideal. The factory oil pan is so bad that oil starvation and cavitation occurs when decelerating. This scenario is literally starving engine components of oil resulting in temporary metal-on-metal contact. Oil starvation causes many engine component failures. In fact, the oil starvation issues have probably caused many failures in the past that were dismissed.

One of the most common failures on the SVHO engine is the supercharger clutch. This has always been labeled as a "wear item" and is expected to go out. Hard riding, racing, and riding in rough water conditions have proven to decrease clutch life. These riding conditions increase the chance of oil starvation with the stock oil pan. I would not be surprised if most of these clutch failures can be traced back to oil starvation issues. The supercharger clutch is very dependent on oil and starving the clutch of oil will result in a failure. The supercharger clutch experiences the most stress when rapidly letting off the throttle; rapidly letting off the throttle translates to decelerating and, ultimately, oil starvation. When the supercharger clutch is under extreme stress in need of oil the most, it is being starved of oil due to the factory oil pan design.

The second most common issue is the supercharger shaft and bearing failing. The supercharger shaft has a journal bearing that is very dependent on a constant oil supply. No oil means no lubrication and the supercharger will end in a catastrophic failure. While supercharger failures are few and far between, it is more common than I would like to see.

The bearing, step collar, and thrust plate get wiped out which allows for the supercharger shaft and impeller to push into the front housing. This destroys the entire supercharger, not a cheap fix. Even aftermarket supercharger shaft and bearing kits proven to be a much stronger alternative have failed. Maintaining the proper oil pressure is key for the supercharger to survive.

Worst case scenario, oil starvation will damage the engine internally. Every rotating part of the engine depends heavily on oil pressure and oil supply to avoid damage. Bearing failures and engine damage is rare, but it does happen on high performance applications.

While I would not consider any of these issues to be common, the issues are certainly something to take note of. I am not the type of person to stand by for a "what if" scenario. I would rather address the issues before a problem occurs. The FuelTech oil pan will prevent any issues related to oil starvation as it has eliminated the oil starvation problem.

The FuelTech oil pan features a larger sump, improved baffling, and an improved pickup tube to eliminate oil starvation entirely. The pan is nearly double in capacity at 10 quarts; having the extra oil capacity will increase the oil life and oil change interval. The pickup tube is located within a chamber with trap doors. The trap doors allow for oil to flow into the chamber during acceleration and deceleration while retaining the oil near the pickup tube. Being that the pan is made from billet aluminum, it adds structural rigidity to the cast aluminum engine block.

The FuelTech oil pan although a bit pricy, is far cheaper than what a failure due to oil starvation would cost; it is cheap insurance to protect costly engine and supercharger components. You can purchase the FuelTech oil pan in the GreenHulk store along with other performance parts from FuelTech, RIVA Racing, FIZZLE Intercoolers, and WORX Racing. The 2023 WGP#1 Jet Ski World Cup in Pattaya, Thailand

he penultimate round of an intense year of racing culminated in explosions on the water in Pattaya as Jomtien Beach played host to spectacles of speed, skill, and controversy as competitors vied for the coveted Jet Ski World Cup trophy and the title of World Series champion. The Jet Ski World Cup, the finale of a four round tour this year, attracted thousands of spectators and media attention from around the world as 300 riders from 40 countries participated in this global event.

Racing in Thailand is unique and is much like the people from the land of smiles. You look at these pristine blue waters, friendly and welcoming and you think "Ah, this will be easy." But no. The water, like the people, is complex and ever changing. It is tough to maneuver a sharp course with winds that change the directions of the waves every few minutes. Your body must constantly adjust itself to the way the boat cuts through the water multiple times... not to mention those who had the rigor of having to ride a ski that is not their own. Case in point: Moto 2 Pro Runabout GP saw 6 boats break, including Skinny Mo and Gyorgy Kasza. Another case in point: it was not a foregone conclusion that the one who gets the holeshot keeps the lead, as was perfectly demonstrated in Pro Runabout 1100 Open and Pro Sport. The water was the ultimate wildcard for this stop.

In Pro Women Ski GP, Jasmiin Ypraus was looking to keep her overall World Series points



lead, but took a risk on borrowed property, thanks to Nacho Armillas' and his team. While she was not able to podium for this round, she took the World Series title, just 10 points ahead of Jet Ski World Cup winner, Emma-Nellie Ortendahl. Emma took her World Series tour stop win fresh off her Havasu victory and came in second in World Series points in Pro Am Ski Stock behind Mattias Reinaas. River Varner came in third in World Series points and second in the Jet Ski World Cup just ahead of comeback kid, Sofie Borgstrom.

Pro Am Endurance Open belonged to French conquistador, Jean-Bruno Pastorello. The Humble Hulk capped off his year with a fourfor-four Series win, with Tory Snyder second overall in points, followed by Anthony Radetic who is having one of his best racing years.





Another veteran who nabbed a four-for-four victory was UK's perfectionist, Simon Belcher. Simon was close to a World Cup win in 2022 but was outpaced by the strong cohort of Thai riders. This year, fate was in his favor as he took not just the World Cup win, but the World Series title ahead of riding buddy, James Bushell. Young gun, Keeratikorn Phiwngam, came in third in points for the World Series podium.

Louie Buhisan was one of the poster riders for the Philippines' monumental rise to the top in 2023. Louie won the Pro Runabout 1100 Open World Series title, a source of great pride for the entire team. Suphathat Footrakul was the winner of the Jet Ski World Cup, fighting off stiff competition in Kasidit Teeraprateep and Ou Mouet Saly.

Pro Runabout GP was a class of shock and

awe, with Mohammad Albaz holding his World

Series lead to win the overall followed by

consistent champion and fellow countryman,

Mohammad Burbayea. Albaz's position was

not a given as Easy Rider Francois Medori

came into Moto 3 in the point lead, but had to

settle for second overall for the Jet Ski World

Cup and fourth overall for the World Series as teammate, Jeremy Perez, took third place

on the World Series podium. This is Albaz's first World Series victory, but certainly not his

first World Cup title.

Turns out, he absolutely could. Jeremy Poret, who came into the round in the lead, replicated his 2019 performance and won the entire World Series title despite setbacks in Pattaya. Kevin Reiterer gave us his best as usual, showing that starting at the back of the pack is just a state of mind, and passing is always possible. Toshi Samurai Ohara was the quintessential renegade cowboy fully willing to put himself out there to stay ahead of a strong pack. Anders Keller and Raphael Maurin were consistent performers and could not be ruled out in the points race for the World Cup and the World Series. It was Kevin Reiterer who took his second World Cup title this year and second on the World Series podium, with Mickael Poret who is enjoyed a phenomenal racing year in 2023, coming in third, tied in points with Quinten Bossche.

There is a lot to be said about fame and the rise to the top. Our sport is at a pivotal moment where stakes have never been higher, and publicity is increasing more than ever. In these moments, we get to show the world who we are and why we deserve to be admired. Each of our riders have shown they are wonderfully human and care deeply about doing well, and at the end of the day, that's what makes great stories, and great role models for the world to look up to and cheer for. I cannot wait to see what 2024 will bring and how much further, if you pardon the pun, we can push this boat out. **PR**

**PRO RIDER:** Please describe your personal fitness routine and how it specifically complements your performance as a world champion racer.


# FUELING VICTORY: A CHAMPION RACER'S FITNESS AND NUTRITION REGIMEN

## A CONVERSATION WITH TORY SNYDER











**IORY SINDER:** For example, getting ready for a P1 AquaX season. I try to do something like a professional fighter would do before a fight. About 5 weeks out I start on a strict meal plan and training routine. During the offseason I watch what I eat and train and ride multiple times a week.

**PR:** What are some key exercises you perform and why those particular exercises?

**75:** Nothing is better than training on the ski. Racing a jet ski works muscles that you can't work any other way than on the ski itself. Just up the road from me I have one of the best places to ride, right off the Sunshine Skyway bridge in Florida's Tampa Bay. For endurance training I do one lap from the bridge and around Egmont Key, a small Island in the middle of the bay. This simulates the closest thing to a P1 AquaX moto. I run, road bike and ride the Peloton as my exercise off the water.

**PR:** In the world of watercraft racing as well as recreational riding, how important is overall fitness?

**15:** It's everything. Some of these popular rec riders will go over a 100 miles in one trip with gas cans on the back of the ski. Many people think of jet skis as something to do on vacation for an hour. Every time I take my buddies on the skis all day they always end up sore in the lower back and forearms the next day.

**PR:** Can you share any nutrition or dietary tips that have contributed to your success; do you have a go-to pre-race meal or routine that you swear by?

**15:** Having Tim Judge in my corner has been a huge advantage when it comes to giving me diet tips, especially since I started to be a top guy in runabout racing. He has always preached pasta and grilled chicken the night before the race. Then during the week, I either do ground beef or grilled chicken with some type of small carb. I will have that for lunch and dinner every day.









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






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**PRO RIDER:** Please share your journey from Morocco to the USA.

MOURD SALHI: In 2002, I began training in Morocco and started professional racing in 2003. During a trip to Europe, I won a jet ski race in Portugal, becoming the first Moroccan to win the European championship in 2003. I continued training with the best jet ski coaches and racers (Steven Dauliach / Yves Van Heers / Laurent Boucher and others) from 2003-2008 and went on to win several championships in Europe, Morocco, and USA. Because of my huge success in Morocco, the association I was attached to was upgraded to a federation. By 2008, I was facing challenges in Morocco by way of misuse of sponsorship funds being funneled to the government federation instead of us athletes, so I decided to pursue my career in racing in the US. I was done being taken advantage of and feared for my future. Wearing a dark hoodie, I escaped my country in the night to Europe then on to America. I began racing again in 2018, achieved success, and established myself in the US.

**PR:** After a decade-long hiatus from racing, what inspired you to return?

m5: I am very competitive and had it in my blood and my mind to return. I started in the US in Pennsylvania and wasn't the right connections. After becoming homeless moving to Florida was key to my return to jet skiing. Working hard to build a life and make enough money to fund myself, I was able to get back in the game in 2018.

In a remarkable journey from Morocco to the USA, Mouad Salhi has become a formidable force in the jet ski racing world. Returning in 2018, he overcame personal challenges and became the first Moroccan, Arab, and African with multiple international titles. Serving as a beacon of inspiration, he embodies the resilience and triumph embedded in the American Dream.

**PR:** Please list the specific classes you race and provide insights into the equipment and modifications you've made.

**PR:** As the first Moroccan, Arab, and African with multiple international titles in the jet ski industry, how do you see your role in inspiring others to pursue their dreams in water sports?

**PR:** Describe the challenges you faced in your jet ski racing career and how you overcame them.

**m5:** Overcoming challenges defines my racing career. From facing homelessness, technical and monetary setbacks to enduring fierce competition, each hurdle fueled my determination to succeed. Funding everything myself has presented many challenges. I am currently looking for a sponsor as I continue to work hard to perfect my craft.

**FR:** You often refer to yourself as an "American Dream Story." How has the American dream played a role in your personal and professional life?

The American dream resonates in my journey, symbolizing opportunity, resilience, and triumph—integral elements in shaping my personal and professional identity. I couldn't let my dreams go and with hard work and determination, I was able to accomplish my dreams.

**PR:** Throughout your jet ski racing journey, who has been a significant source of inspiration?

m5: Chris MacClugage's aggressive skills and Brice Lopez's style that I trained with in France and the guidance of Laurent Boucher in France, were pivotal in fine tuning my skills while navigating the waters of competition and self-discovery. I am my own biggest competitor and I've used my difficult life experiences to fuel my passion for success and inspire growth within myself.

**PR:** Looking ahead, what are your plans and goals for 2024?

**Inf:** 2024 holds exciting prospects. My goals include further triumphs on the international stage by racing in the Pro Class in the P1 Aqua X, the WGP1 in France, Poland, Lake Havasu, and then Thailand, pending I find sponsors. I aim to continue pushing boundaries, leaving an indelible mark in the jet ski racing realm.
