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# UNUSHED THE SEA-DOO RXPX 325

n October 26, 2023, I acquired my 2024 Sea-Doo RXPX 325 and was thrilled to start modifying it. November 2, 2023, we started with the speed limiter removal and reached 80 mph, which was very impressive. After adding a Solas 14/19, we achieved 83 mph on the dash and 82 mph on GPS. I wanted to customize the electronic control unit (ECU), so I swapped the full harness and ECU with a 2022 model, allowing me to edit and log data using HP Tuners RTD. After extensive research and development, I installed various upgrades, including a Ruthless Racing billet racing camshaft, titanium valve retainers, carbon fiber cold air intake, a Solas custom pitch propeller, power launch pump seal, and a pump wedge.

I fine-tuned the modifications on November 8<sup>th</sup>, 2023, achieving impressive results of 92 mph on the dashboard and 90.8 mph according to GPS, at 9200 rpms and 20 psi of boost with the stock supercharger.

Later, November 23, I switched to a Solas 13/17.5 propeller and reached speeds of 89–90 mph on the dashboard and 88.4 mph according to GPS, at 8900 rpms. Not satisfied with this, on January 31, 2024, I began using the FuelTech EFI system and a plug-and-play harness. I added 170 lb ft injectors and a Ruthless Racing E85 fuel system. After hours of tuning, I achieved 9500 rpms at 21.5 psi of boost with the OEM supercharger, reaching 93 mph on the dashboard and 92.6 mph according to GPS. This made the Ruthless Racing team the first in the world to reach 93 mph on an OEM supercharger, proving the impressive potential of the 325 platform.

Excited by this success, we began developing a turbo kit for the platform in hopes of reaching 100 mph on the OEM engine at 30+ psi of boost. We look forward to sharing the results soon. **PR**

#### TEEN NAVIGATES EXCURSION ON PERCY PRIEST LAKE



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#### CLOCKWORK RACING PRESENTS LIGHT START SYSTEM ALTERNATIVE TO BAND SNAP

Clockwork Racing Team is composed of two coworkers whose talents in building automation during the day spill into the race world by night. Daniel Mulcahy and I teamed up in 2017 to prepare to race Great Lakes Watercross in 2018. Sharing the same love for film and comedy, Clockwork Racing was named in respect to Stanley Kubrick and how 'The Simpsons' parodied his movie. Together we have brought to the pits custom sponsons, drop trim nozzle systems, turbo charged engines, trailers with sound systems with theater capabilities, and most recently a portable slot car racetrack. Sometimes we race.

In 2023, I raced in the IJSBA World Finals, which used a light start system instead of a band start. Inspired, I developed a light start model and shared it with Brad Bohat of Great Lakes Watercross. After researching global systems from France, Thailand, Czech Republic and Brazil, we aimed for a standard start procedure across IJSBA events.

Our system prioritizes safety and convenience, using low voltage similar to cordless power tools, making it safe for marine environments. It features waterproof components, a four-pin wiring harness, and familiar red and green LED lights. The flashing red light cadence follows USA roadway standards for staging, and manual switches control the sequence.

Unlike traditional band starts that snap a rubber band to initiate a race start and the tower marshal uses a 1-2 card to stage for the band drop, our Light Start System (LSS) eliminates risks from snapping bands. The marshal uses a whistle and flashing red lights for staging, switches to solid red for readiness, and then manually triggers green lights for the start. This system minimizes red flag starts and ensures smooth races.

IJSBA Region 8 first used the LSS, receiving rave reviews for its efficiency and spectatorfriendly operation. We hope other promoters adopt this system for safer and more consistent race starts.












### AJ PERFORMANCE RACING TEAM BELGIUM










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### DEAR PRO RIDER WATERCRAFT MAGAZINE,

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### **VALVE TRAIN UPGRADES** –101

he cylinder head on an engine is subjected to a significant amount of stress under normal operating conditions. When you modify your watercraft to increase top speed engine rpm is increased as well.

Eventually you reach a point where it becomes necessary to upgrade the valve train components in your engine's cylinder head to maintain reliability for higher levels of performance.

Typically, the first upgrade involves swapping out the stock steel valve retainers with lightweight titanium retainers that utilize a different profile. RIVA Racing offers Stock Retainer Upgrade Kits consisting of lightweight titanium retainers with a modified shape that preloads the stock valve springs. Both features optimize efficiency and reduce the likelihood of valve float, which can occur when valves aren't able to close completely due to lack of spring pressure when engine rpm is increased. Higher levels of modification such as Stage 3 and above that also include a racing camshaft require a more robust valve train upgrade. RIVA Racing's Valve Train Upgrade Kits include new lightweight titanium retainers and high-performance valve springs that are stronger than stock, providing a higher tension rate that further reduces the chance of coil bind and valve float on highly modified engines.

Installing these valve train upgrades with standard tools is time consuming and cumbersome. RIVA Racing makes quick and easy work of it by offering specialized Valve Compression Tools that don't require removal of the cylinder head. Instead, the cylinder being serviced is pressurized with air to prevent the valve from dropping. A fixture is bolted to the top of the cylinder head that enables you to compress the valve springs enough to remove the keepers. These unique tools simplify the process and reduce job time significantly making them a must have for every do-ityourselfer and dealership's service department.

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
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### MANGROVES TO MEMORIES

he "SuperSX" featured in the 2023 Swimsuit Edition of Pro Rider Magazine wasn't enough, so Chance Jones of Happenstance Performance, is back at it again with a new custom build, dubbed the "HX-R". Joe Johnston delivered the 1 of 1 Carter Brackett rockered Sea-Doo HX from Tampa to the Daytona Freeride in January. The hull, rockered in 2012, had not been wet until this build was complete!

Once back home in Virginia, Chance immediately started cutting and glassing. The Sea-Doo 787 mounts were ripped out and a Yamaha 701/760 foundation was fiberglassed in with custom pieces fabricated from aluminum. Along with this change came heavy reinforcement to withstand surf assaults from the Atlantic Ocean. The new power plant is a Yamaha 701-62T pulled from a Wave Raider.

Mods include a R&D head and a Pro Tec Exhaust with jetting specs set by Paul Lehr, Lehr Performance (LPW). The exhaust travels through a stock WaveBlaster hose into a stock Sea-Doo waterbox and exits the rear of the hull.

The "HX-R" really shines in its intended element, surf! This is largely due to the V-hull design and an insanely custom driveline that travels through the center mounted fuel tank. The engine turns an ADA conversion coupler with a Kawasaki dampener > Sea-Doo XPL intermediate shaft > HX brass vein pump with a machined 951 impeller shaft, which spins a Sea-Doo Spark 12/17 impeller. The Spark impeller acts like an equivalent to a big hub Hooker impeller used on more traditional Yamaha freeride skis. All machine work on the shafts and couplers was meticulously done by Alex Karacsonyi at PFM Industries.

Up top, Chance utilized a UMI Steering setup with a High Speed Industries finger throttle, which he hasn't stopped raving about. Back under the hood, is a modified Sea-Doo electronics box that houses mostly Yamaha components, save for an LPW-tuned 62T Zeel ignition system. Sea-Doo electronics boxes are notoriously easy to use and may be the driest available from any big manufacturer. Keeping the hull dry and free of water is a set of Versiplugs from PWCDoctor.com.

Manpower hours have surpassed hundreds at this point, but Chance still has future plans. Now that the "HX-R" has passed "the Surf Test" at the Topsail Beach Freeride in May 2024, paint and new turf is on the way, including possibilities of tubbies and a lowered superfly style seat. Whatever is next will be determined by Happenstance. PR

The West Coast Watercraft Club puts on the Yuma ride once a year during the irrigation times. The WCWCC is an adventure driven destination club catering to riders who want to ride the distance. The best time to run this river is March to June, to achieve the highest water levels possible. The lower Colorado River is all sand and the deepest water levels are on the banks of the river. Guides are well-seasoned riders and must stand while riding to navigate the river in a single file formation. This is crucial so no one gets stuck on a sandbar. When we started this trip in 2012 many riders got stuck and imagine pulling a 950 lb. PWC off a sandbar!

> We recommend carrying at least 10 to 15 gallons of fuel, depending on your ski you can determine what you will consume.


The two day 90-mile roundtrip ride starts at T.K. Jones Campground in Winterhaven. Arizona to Walter's Camp Riders line up their vehicles and prep their skis before launching. After all members are launched, a mandatory safety meeting is held pointing out what you might encounter on our ride. At Walter's Camp, we take the long half mile no wake to the beach, our lunch stop for this leg of the trip where we hang out and enjoy the scenery. The area consists primarily of protected military land, where occasional activity may be observed.

The second day's ride is like the first except we pass Walter's Camp to our halfway point to McIntyre Park in Blythe, where we will fill our tanks with the fuel we have been carrying and then walk to the on land fueling station to fill our empty cans. Once we leave here there is no more fuel available. It is crucial to maintain a safe speed of 45 MPH to conserve fuel. Our destination was Blythe Dam 90 miles one way; roundtrip ride was 180 miles returning to T.K. Jones Campground.

The West Coast Watercraft Club is the only Jet Ski adventure club in California!

he site for round two of the Waterjet Thailand Pro Tour was the beach city of Rayong, a perfect location to witness great racing in the ocean with waves that continuously altered the racetrack while athletes showed what they learned from round one's large swells throughout the race.

This year with the amount of the junior class entries and the one lap slalom event we started on Friday to get 60 runs achieved with 5 classes consisting of Sea-Doo Spark, Women Sea-Doo Spark, 4 stroke Yamaha Superjet and Kawasaki 1500 restrictor plate watercrafts. Each competitor gets two runs, and the best time gets the overall win.

**SPARK CLASS:** Tanatham Kulkumthorn with a time of 144.17, Patee Bhirombhakdi 148.73 and rounding off the top three Phabodin Sukprasert with a time of 149.22.

The next largest class was Novice 1100 Stock which had to qualify to get to the main but after 3 motos of fierce battles we had a victor. Runabout GP class is the highest level of craft you can build, and spectators were awed by the high horsepower watercraft as they raced to the checkered flag. This highly modified class sees the most breakdowns. Moto one had 6 crafts towed in forcing racers to scramble to repair the craft or use their backups. **PR** 

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# CATCHING UP WITH PROFESSIONAL STUNTMAN HARRISON HARBER

arry Harber's professional waterskiing journey began when he was 13 competing in three event water skiing with his family. Rising before dawn, he devoted himself to training 3–4 times weekly, instilling a deep love for the sport. His dedication bore fruit, clinching numerous Australian and state championships, and participating in world titles before turning 18. Balancing studies for a bachelor's in architectural science online, he transitioned into a professional water skier and coach on the Sunshine Coast, Australia, in his late teens, all while traversing the globe.

Competing internationally and holding Queensland records, he had the privilege of coaching some of the best junior water skiers in Australia and the world. Growing up, he loved acting and drama, participating in school plays and training

in Shotokan karate for 12 years. These experiences sparked his interest in stunts, leading to a life-changing opportunity in 2018 when Matthew May scouted him to work for Action Horizons as a stunt water skier at WaterWorld Universal Studios, Singapore which opened many doors.

PRO RIDER:

Your journey from professional athlete to stunt performer at renowned venues WaterWorld in China and Universal Studios is incredibly inspiring. Please share some memorable experiences from performing at these iconic locations.

HARRY HARBER: During my first year at WaterWorld, I learned various roles, including the #8 waterski role, the #6 enforcer role, and by the end of the year, the #1 lead role as the Mariner on a standup, although I had never ridden a jetski! Learning in the pool at WaterWorld was an amazing experience and I can't thank Action Horizons enough for taking a punt on me and now, I can confidently say I can shred on a standup. Being scouted as a three-event waterskier and transitioning into stunt performing ranks among my most cherished experiences. As the #8 waterskier and multiple swing performer in my inaugural year, I embraced various roles within shows. Over the last five years with AH, I've expanded my repertoire to include piloting a jet-powered boat, mastering high diving and stunt fighting, and overseeing a 30-member stunt team, all while contributing to casting decisions. These endeavors led me to remarkable destinations across Asia, from the awe-inspiring "Avatar Mountains" in China to the pristine slopes of Niseko, Japan, and serene landscapes of Indonesia. Camping beside the Great Wall of China and bathing elephants in Thailand stand out as

unforgettable moments.

**PR:** How do you prepare mentally before stepping into the spotlight, and what advice would you give to aspiring stunt performers looking to make their mark in the industry?

**We**: Mentally, I prepare by getting excited for each show and envisioning it going perfectly, which puts me in a relaxed and motivated state. Performing for a huge crowd drives me to give 120%, thinking about that one person who saved their money to come and watch our show, pushes me to exceed my limits each time.

For aspiring stunt performers, I advise learning basic skills in rolling, falling, flipping, and getting used to moving your body and body awareness on and off the ground. Martial arts training is invaluable. For WaterWorld specifically, learning to drive a jetski, boat and high diving is great; also, to overcome fear of heights and get used to body awareness when falling.

## **PR:** Amidst your busy schedule what do you enjoy doing in your spare time?

**III:** I enjoy going to the gym, training, practicing stunts, traveling, and exploring with my girlfriend. Playing guitar and relaxing with a day in bed chilling, watching movies also helps me unwind.

**PR:** What's next in 2024 and beyond?

W: I'm pursuing my lifelong dream of being an actor and stuntman in film. I've chosen to finish my era with Action Horizons at WaterWorld and signed with Cozmikk Talent Agency in China. My plan is to break into the film industry here and then move to LA or Australia. My ultimate dream is to be a lead actor in a Marvel movie, a goal I've had since childhood.



# **UKS JOE LEEMING PROFESSIONAL PWC OFFSHORE RACER** shares rigorous training regimen for jet ski racing glory

Joe Leeming's journey into the world of fitness and jet ski racing is a testament to resilience and passion. From early days playing soccer and riding trail bikes, Joe's path was altered by a severe injury at age 12, sparking his interest in strength and conditioning. This curiosity led him to pursue a degree in Sports Therapy and eventually become a personal trainer, where he works with a diverse range of clients facing physical challenges and professional athletes.

His introduction to jet ski racing came at the age of 14, on the shores of Anglesey at Trearddur Bay, where he encountered Dale Williams, Team Manager of MES Racing. Dale's invitation to race in Torquay marked the beginning of Joe's journey into Aqua Adrenaline racing, a journey that would see him excel in the sport.

Training for jet ski racing is not easy, especially considering the unpredictable nature of offshore racing. Joe's training regimen is rigorous and tailored to the demands of the sport. Each race weekend consists of four grueling 25-minute races, pushing his body to its limits. His training plan spans four weeks leading up to a race, focusing on strength, endurance, and cardio.

#### **TRAINING REGIMEN:**

I train on the coast of Trearddur Bay on the Irish Sea. Bad weather and rough water conditions hinder training. Aqua Adrenaline is an offshore racing club, meaning I must be prepared for all conditions. Rough water is better for training.

If you haven't raced before I can safely say from experience, you cannot move for the next 3 days as your body will be aching all over!

However, the human body is amazing, it will adapt to the demands you place on it.

#### **MY TRAINING PLAN:**

I start 4 weeks out of my first race and progress by adding weights, increasing reps, and cardio.

MONDAY: Upper Body — Flat Bench Press — Barbell bent over row — Incline Bench Press — Lat pull down — cable flys — Max press ups — Rope triceps pushdown (4x 8–10 reps each )

TUESDAY: Lower Body — Barbell back squat — Barbell Romanian deadlift — Bulgarian split squat — Leg Press — Glute adductor machine — Box Jumps (4x 10–15 reps) — Jump Lunges (4x 40 reps) (4x 8–10 reps on each)

WEDNESDAY: Cardio 60 min steady state cardio on a bike keeping heart rate at 140– 150bpm, known as zone 2. Zone 2 training or aerobic base training, done at a moderate intensity is key for improving aerobic capacity vital for racing.

THURSDAY: Full Body — Barbell overhead press — Dumbbell walking lunges — Max chin ups — Kettlebell Cossack squat — Dumbbell flat press — Dumbbell Farmer's walk 20 meters — Max time hang on bar (4x 1 min rest between) (4x 8–10 reps each)

FRIDAY: Core + 30 min Cardio Core Workout Max Plank x3 — V sits 3x 20 — Russian twist 3x 30 Cardio section 30-minute bike — 5 min warm up — 4 min hard push 1 min steady spin x4 — 5 min cool down

**SATURDAY:** Jet ski training on the water

Beyond physical training, Joe emphasizes the importance of preparation and consistency in fitness and racing. Setting achievable goals and maintaining a balanced diet rich in protein are key components of his philosophy.

#### JET SKI RACING ADVICE FOR BEGINNERS:

- 1. Practice on calm waters to get comfortable with controlling the jet ski.
- 2. Invest in quality safety gear, including a life jacket, gloves, and a wetsuit or drysuit.
- Practice Regularly
- Learn from others, join a local jet ski group, watch racing videos.
- 5. Familiarise yourself with the rules and regulations of racing.
- 6. Always prioritize safety. Know your limits and don't push beyond them, especially in the beginning.
- 7. Maintain your ski. Regular maintenance is crucial to ensure your ski runs smoothly and safely.

Joe has ambitious plans for the future, including completing world records and achieving top rankings in the Aqua Adrenaline tour as part of the MES Yamaha supported Race Team. His dedication and determination continue to drive him towards new heights in jet ski racing. **PR**

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

he opening round of OCRDA's Aqua Adrenaline in Torquay UK, resulted in spectacular racing and two new 16-yearold riders joining the ranks of the hardy.

Torquay, better known as the English Riviera hosts some of the best watersports racing in the UK due to it's unique positioning, great weather and the harbour wall which acts as dry pits for the boats and skis, and a great walkway and viewpoint for thousands of spectators.

16-year-old newcomer Owen Campbell took 3x 2<sup>nd</sup> place podium positions and win in his first weekend of racing in the J3 class, a race inspired by his dad Martin Campbell who races in J1. Owen, riding a Yamaha FX HO shared, "I only had 11 hours of training before my first race and training is so different than racing because I'm not being pushed, racing is really tough!"

Owen's dad Martin in the J1 class riding a supercharged Yamaha took it slightly easier than he is known for racing 3 out of the 4 races giving him a 6<sup>th</sup> overall in this first event. Martin is the current XCat Powerboat World Champion alongside Scott Williams, and these 120mph catamarans are shipped all over the world with Martin telling me, he is playing safe to avoid injuries giving the best chance of retaining their title heading into the 2<sup>nd</sup> round in Italy.

Daniel Fellows another 16-year-old in his first race of his career in J3 pipped Owen to the post on points taking 3x 1<sup>st</sup> place podiums and a single 2<sup>nd</sup>. Daniel's dad Andrew Fellows races in J1 just pipping Martin Campbell to the post putting him 5<sup>th</sup> overall.

These aren't the only father and son duos.
