

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

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uly 21-22 in Sparks, Nevada, eight adventurous women competed in the inaugural Women's WaveBlaster class as part of Wild West Watercross's race series fourmoto format, with two motos on Saturday, two on Sunday scored together for the overall. The class featured Waveblaster 1 hulls with builds limited to the rules of Sport Spec Waveblasters.

The idea emerged organically when some women with WaveBlasters wanted to race but preferred not to compete in the highly competitive Sport Spec class with the guys. Wild West embraced the idea and introduced a Women's WaveBlaster class for the final round of their 2024 NorCal and Nevada tour.

Saturday morning, the women lined up to race, split between those with WaveBlasters at home but no racing experience and those who raced before but were on borrowed WaveBlasters, all beginners at racing or beginners on the WaveBlaster platform. Understandably, the first moto was raced cautiously as everyone adjusted to the ski and competition.

As the intensity ramped up, confidence soared with each moto, and everyone was determined to win! Watching the racers' progress over the weekend was incredible. All but one completed all four motos and each earned a \$100 payout for their efforts.\* The racer who missed some motos battled hard to fix her ski but could not get it running in time.

The placings varied considerably, showing it was anybody's game and consistency was key. Podium finishers, first through third respectively, were Arianna Chen, Lainey Garrett, and Jamie Que.

The class was a resounding success, with participants eager to return next year and many others looking to join in 2025.

Interest has been sparked at Sparks, and this exciting class is sure to explode next year!



Riders ventured through ancient submarine tunnels and navigated the crystalline waters between four stunning Croatian islands: Molat, Sestrunj, Dugi Otok, and Olib.

Olib's sandy beach was perfect for socializing as riders exchanged stories. The event was not just about the thrill of the ride; it was about building community and celebrating shared passions.

This year's ride marked a significant milestone, showcasing its evolution into an international European event. Participants came from Austria, Germany, Italy, Hungary, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Serbia, Sweden, the Czech Republic, Slovakia, and, of course, Croatia.


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### A Work of Arth

The Ultimate X2 Project with Iconic Paint Job

his adventure began a year and a half ago with a call from dear friend and longtime jet ski fan, Mark Bove, aka "the Pasta Man." He loved my R&R JetTech 550s with their amazing paint jobs and asked if I could replicate the "fruit stripe" design on a vintage X2 which had never been done but he didn't budge.

First call was to legendary painter Don Serrano, motorsports icon known for phenomenal work. Jerry Ham of M&M Marine had a cream puff vintage X2 ready for the right buyer.

A local mechanic stripped and prepped it for paint. Craig Campbell, X2 advocate, fiberglassed the holes, relocated the stock exhaust outlet, and installed front sponsons.

Time to kick off the motor build with Monte Hughes of Montster Watercraft, who did a fantastic job on my wife's X2 mod. He sent the crank and cylinder to Christopher Steenbock of C57, and the project began! Mark wanted "10/10 bling," so Monte had all parts epoxypainted and chrome-polished.

We deal a lot with Jared Martin, Wax Racing of Australia and purchased his new complete exhaust system. Charlie Sims directed us to David Stewart of Leading Edge Impellers who crafted a totally

custom impeller.

After six months of magic, Serrano finished this one-

of-a-kind work of art. Good friend and sponsor Joel Jaye of Air Ads Worldwide transported the ski wrapped in blankets to protect it on the roadtrip as we met in Bakersfield, CA. Frank Walsh and fantastic staff at Jettrim used the last of the vintage Naugahyde stock from Jettrim's original creator Gary Hart's private stash. RIP in Gary. They delivered an awesome custom seat and mat kit. Icing on the cake included super trick titanium rainbow head nuts, bolts, and washers from Luke Crane at Powernuts.

Monte put everything together, like a surgeon performing heart surgery, time for her big reveal. Team Goatcher called in the troops! Leading the charge was Greg Cobb — junior racer Jack 'the Ripper' Cobb's dad and my right-hand man — who is breaking into cinematography and we created an 18-minute tell-all video.

We can't thank Mark enough for this once in a lifetime opportunity to recreate history!

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# JUNIOR RACER'S JET SKI RACING JOURNEY TO POLAND

he WGP#1 Grand Prix is the pinnacle of jet ski racing, with three rounds: Poland, Lake Havasu City Arizona, and the finals in Pattaya, Thailand. Andrew Vo, Jettribe's Junior racer, and his family spent two weeks in Poland for the WGP#1 World Grand Prix / Jettribe European Championship Jet Ski Race. Competing against riders from 35 countries, Andrew felt the pressure, especially with sponsors BNJ, Peter De Smet, Kylie Elmers, and Team Flamingo of Thailand watching from the shore. The event was televised to 800 million households, adding to the intensity.

Racing was only part of the Vo family's adventure in Poland. They arrived six days early to explore Warsaw, immersing themselves in local culture and history. The family visited non-tourist spots, interacted with locals, and toured Kozminski International University, which Andrew might attend for a semester.

When race week arrived, the Vo's faced the challenge of competing halfway around the world with minimal gear. However, their international racing "family" was there to support them. Peter DeSmet, close friend and IJSBA Europe race organizer, sponsored Andrew with a Yamaha 4-stroke Superjet, while the BNJ race team handled everything from ECU tuning to pit support. The Flamingo Thai Team provided encouragement and help from the shore.

Andrew's strategy was simple: race his best and avoid finishing last. Competing in the stacked Junior 4-Stroke Lites class, Andrew held his own against strong competitors from Estonia, UAE, and Latvia. Despite his ski being stock, he managed to stay ahead in the races, thanks to determination and skill.


In three motos, Andrew consistently placed third, securing an overall third-place finish on the podium — his most significant achievement yet. One of the highlights was when Andrew and Ali Alalii from the UAE, finished second and third, their proud dads shaking hands on the shore.

The Vo family values the experiences and friendships gained from this journey more than the racing itself. Racing jet skis is a platform for them to explore the world, meet new people, and create lasting memories. The Vos believe while racing titles and trophies fade, the memories and friendships made along the journey last a lifetime. **PR**



he Westcoast Surf Riders were invited back to entertain the crowds at the American Spring Boat Racing Championships half time show. As the jet sprint sport grows and we continue to provide the half time show, it's great exposure for the jet ski industry. Spectators love watching the skis as they can envision themselves riding a jet ski on the track.

Building and racing a sprint boat is a much taller order due to their higher cost, limited availability, the need for a full pit crew and all that goes with having a sprint boat racing team.

What's it like to ride a sprint boat track on a jet ski? It is a lot different than riding on a lake! The track is 12-14 ft wide and 2-3 ft deep. This creates a push back effect when the water is compressed against the mud surfaces below and on the sides of the slough. The shallow water push back helps in the corners. Precision driving is crucial to staying on the track. A slight bump can easily send a rider sliding onto land, a common occurrence for both jet skis and sprint boats.

We had an amazing weekend at Extreme Sports Park in Port Angeles, Washington! Big thanks to Jim Flynn for capturing the action, HenRy Li for backflip entertainment, all the riders, and ASBR for including us in their incredible event. Don't miss the next race after Labor Day — it's a must-see for jet boat and jet ski enthusiasts! PR









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






# RACING RETURNS TO THIE GOLD GOASTH 2024 AUSWCR National Watercross Championships


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



Belgian Yoni Hamelin (#99) won the Ski GP3 title after three moto wins, while Estonian Mattias Reinaas (#32) clinched both Ski GP2 and GP4 titles. Karl Keskula (#7) of Estonia won the Runabout GP4 title, with Alejandro Prats-Palau (#1) taking the final moto win. French racer Cyrielle Bramm (#43) claimed the Runabout GP4 Ladies title, and Hungarian Csongor Jászai (#60) won the final moto in Ski GP2 but lost the overall to Reinaas. Estonian Mattias Siimann (#71) secured the Runabout GP2 title with a commanding final moto victory.

Siimann continued his streak by taking the coveted Runabout GP1 title, an honor earned in a difficult stacked class. Defending GP winner Samuel Johansson (#4) took the win in moto 2, with Siimann in second, playing a smart game preserving his resources while holding off serial passer Francois Medori (#41). Medori rounded out the podium in third, behind Johansson. Early favorite and multiple world champion Jeremy Perez (#86) was unfortunately plagued by boat difficulties in both motos. Gyorgy Kasza (#5) broke down but led a respectable redemption charge in moto 2, finishing 4th.

In Ski GP1, Quinten Bossche (#98) swept the weekend with a GP victory, triple holeshots, moto wins, and best lap times in free practice, qualifying, and motos. This was a flooded class, with 39 talented riders but only 30 made it through. Morgan Poret (#7) had an excellent weekend, consistently posting the second-fastest lap times finishing third. Morgan and brother Jeremy were thwarted in most motos by Kevin Reiterer (#90), who took any opportunity to pass the Poret brothers. Kevin finished in second.

Other notable performances came from Toshi Ohara (#37), who came in third in Moto 2, and Jeremy Poret (#96) who made a strong comeback after recovering from serious shoulder trouble.

Jessica Chavanne (#99) achieved hardearned victory in Ski Ladies GP1 despite sickness and a new boat setup. Estelle Poret (#96), after a brief hiatus for injury rehab, made a strong comeback finishing second just two points behind Chavanne. Emma-Nellie Ortendahl (#98) proved her point by taking third place finishes in motos 1 and 2, securing third on the podium. Jasmiin Ypraus (#64), eager to maintain her red bib from the GP of Vietnam, battled technical difficulties in the first two motos but redeemed herself in moto 3 with the win. 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### FLEXIBILITY AND MOBILITY FOR JET SKIERS

## NO EQUIPMENT NEEDED!

et ski riders know the importance of fullbody strength to stay on board and avoid an unexpected swim! Legs, hips, arms, shoulders, core, and spine endure constant strain while riding, but proper stretching can prevent injuries, strains, and sprains.

Daily flexibility exercises are essential. With a background in gymnastics, soccer, competitive cheer, and motocross, I've learned many techniques and developed a stretching routine tailored specifically for jet ski riding.

Stretching and strength training are key for control and stability on a jet ski. The impact of waves can quickly exhaust unprepared muscles, risking fatigue and accidents. A consistent training regimen boosts endurance, improves balance, ensuring a safe, enjoyable ride.

#### FIVE-MINUTE, NO-EQUIPMENT. PRE-RIDE WARM-UP ROUTINE:

Sky reach toe touches: Stand tall, arms up, bend forward to touch your toes. This stretches your back and hamstrings, elongating the spine.

Torso twists: Feet shoulder-width apart, hands on hips, twist torso gently side to side to warm up your core and enhance spinal flexibility.

Leg swings: Hold onto a stable surface, swing one leg forward and backward, then switch legs. This stretch targets hip flexors and hamstrings.

Hip openers/closers: Stand tall lift one knee to hip height, open out to the side and bring back in. Repeat other side. This loosens hip joints and improves mobility.

Quadriceps stretch: Stand on one leg, pull the other foot towards your buttock with your hand, keeping knees close together. This stretches the front thigh and improves quadriceps flexibility.

Arm circles: Arms extended, make small circles, gradually increase size. This warms up your shoulders for the demands of jet skiing.

Neck rolls: Gently roll your head in a circular motion, clockwise then counterclockwise, releasing tension in neck and upper shoulders.

Wrist rolls: Extend arms make circular motions with your wrists. This loosens joints and preps them for gripping handlebars.

Ankle rolls: Lift one foot, rotate your ankle clockwise, then counterclockwise. Repeat with other ankle. This prevents injuries and improves balance.

Jump squats: Stand with feet shoulder-width apart, lower into a squat, then jump up explosively. Land softly and repeat. This activates leg muscles, enhances explosive power, and elevates your heart rate.

Incorporate this quick effective warm-up routine into your pre-ride preparation to enhance flexibility, reduce risk of injury, and ensure your body is ready for the physical demands of jet skiing. PR
