R ickter RRP has returned to hull production after a temporary pause, aiming to meet demand and reestablish its place in the industry. Founder Rick Roy explains the reasons behind halt, challenges they faced, and upgrades planned for their 2025 lineup.

PRO RIDER: Please tell us about the journey leading to Rickter RRP's decision to return to hull production.

RIGK ROU: Our return to hull production comes from a strong commitment to the Rickter owners, team, distributors, dealers, customers, sport and industry. After a temporary halt, we were driven by the demand from everyone who missed the Rickter quality and performance. Acknowledging this legacy, we aimed to relaunch with the same standards and passion that have defined Rickter over the years.

PR: What circumstances led to the temporary pause in hull production?

R: The production pause was a result of serious management issues with a former partner in Thailand, where our relationship deteriorated to the point of losing control over production and finances. Our ex-partner collaborated with an ex-Rickter distributor to release a product resembling ours, made with original Rickter designs using former Rickter factory employees. Many customers mistakenly thought this was Rickter rebranded, but we are not associated with them.

This challenging period allowed us to refocus on our commitment to quality and performance. We addressed the previous partner's internal issues and strengthened our processes. We restarted production with a new factory partner in Thailand. The Rickter name is built on quality and performance, and we're here to stay.

PR: How is Rickter planning its comeback?

R: For our product re-launch, we made these Rickters our priority: Rickter Edge (freeride), Rickter XFS Ninja Competition G2 (freestyle) and Rickter Ninja Pro V2 (freestyle), each model upgraded for 2025 with enhanced manufacturing and construction, featuring all-new graphics. This includes the XFS Ninja Competition G2 and Ninja Pro V2 now available in full carbon with visual outside carbon styles: 420 or Hexagon Carbon finish.

These key models are available now with the rest of the Rickter lineup on the way.





We've lowered retail costs while raising quality standards. Additionally, we are building an inventory in 2025 for both the U.S. and Thailand to reduce delivery times.

Rickter will be offering custom units for specific rider needs as part of the new business plan.

Our 2024 launch at the IJSBA World Finals received overwhelmingly positive feedback from the community, inspiring us as we move forward.

PR: Have RRP products been affected by this situation?

R: Despite recent challenges, the RRP side of our business has remained strong. We continue providing top-quality products to distributors and clients and are developing new offerings for 2025.



PR: Looking ahead, what are your goals for Rickter RRP in 2025 and beyond? Any exciting projects fans and customers should watch for?

RR: Looking ahead our goals include expanding the Rickter brand's reach and innovating hull design/functionality. Our legendary design team, Rick Roy and Hiroyuki Ogino(Ninja) is working tirelessly to expand our designs and product line. Also, the 2025 sponsorship program is here to support both pro and amateur riders, and we're committed to continuing this effort. Riders and fans can follow us on our website and social media as we build new partnerships and improve global availability.

We'd like to recognize RRP riders Jeremy Poret, Raphael Maurin, Estelle Poret, Valentin Dardillat, Matteo Benini, Mike Klippenstein and Coy Curtis for their achievements.

JET SKS TO THE RESCU

How Emergency Responders Are Using Jet Skis for Disaster Relief

et skis have evolved from recreational watercraft to critical life-saving tools. Increasingly, emergency responders are using them for disaster relief, especially during hurricanes and flooding. In addition, jet skis are indispensable for lifeguards in rip current-prone areas and for rescues in surf-heavy regions.

JET SKIS IN DISASTER RESPONSE

When Hurricanes Helene and Milton struck, bringing severe flooding, traditional rescue vehicles struggled to operate in debris-filled waters. Jet skis, with their speed and agility, became essential tools for emergency responders.

In both urban and rural areas affected by the storms, jet skis were used to evacuate stranded people, deliver supplies, and perform emergency medical evacuations. Their ability to maneuver in shallow, debris-ridden areas gave them an edge over larger boats and trucks. In Florida, responders found jet skis to be one of the only vehicles capable of moving through heavily flooded streets where larger boats couldn't operate. Quick to deploy and able to reach people in tight spaces, jet skis were vital in these time-sensitive rescues.

LIFEGUARDS AND RIP **CURRENT RESCUES**

Outside of disaster zones, jet skis play a crucial role in day-to-day lifeguard operations, especially in areas known for dangerous rip currents. Rip currents are responsible for numerous drownings each year, but lifeguards using jet skis can now respond to incidents faster than ever.

Jet skis allow lifequards to reach swimmers in distress more quickly than traditional methods. They also enable rescues in rough waters where swimming alone might be too dangerous. Lifeguards use rescue sleds attached to the back of jet skis to pull victims from dangerous waters and bring them safely to shore. Their use in high-risk areas has saved countless lives, allowing for faster, safer rescues.

SURF RESCUE OPERATIONS

Jet skis are also used in surf rescue operations at popular surfing spots. Big-wave surf locations, such as Hawaii's North Shore and California's Mavericks, can produce dangerous conditions for surfers. When a wipeout occurs in massive waves, jet skis are often the fastest and safest way to reach a surfer in distress.

During large surf competitions and on highsurf days, rescue teams on jet skis patrol the waters, ready to intervene. These personal watercraft allow responders to navigate through treacherous surf and pull downed surfers to safety using attached rescue sleds. Jet skis have become standard equipment for ensuring the safety of surfers in extreme wave environments.

WHY JET SKIS ARE ESSENTIAL

Jet skis provide emergency responders with several key advantages. Their speed, agility, and ability to navigate tight, debris-filled spaces make them ideal for disaster scenarios where larger rescue vehicles may struggle. They can also be deployed quickly, making them perfect for time-critical situations.

In coastal environments, jet skis allow lifeguards and surf rescue teams to act fast in dangerous conditions. Their ability to handle rough waves and currents is invaluable for beach rescues, whether it's swimmers caught in rip currents or surfers wiped out by massive waves.

CONCLUSION

Jet skis have become indispensable tools in emergency response, far beyond their recreational origins. Whether deployed in disaster areas during hurricanes or as part of everyday beach lifequard operations, these watercraft have proven their value as fast, flexible, and life-saving machines. For J3, MES Racing's Owen Campbell #303 came in 80 points ahead in P1, but his teammate Dan Fellows #16 and Sub3racing's Sammie Covington #89 had everything to fight for. Fellows, a skilled rough-water rider, swept all three races, clinching the J3 Naturally Aspirated championship. PR



UNIABPAquabike European Champtonship Grand Dikoof Vid Concludes With Record-Breaking Success

The second round of the European Aquabike Championship in Vichy was a huge success, attracting a record 122 riders. Due to the high number of participants, Ski GP1 saw pre-qualifications with 24 competitors. The event also hosted the European Endurance Championship, featuring 16 riders in the strength and endurance category.

French racers Pierre-François Savelli#112 and François Medori #41, along with Estonia's Jasmiin Ypraus and Dane Oliver Koch Hansen, secured victories in Runabout GP2, Runabout GP1, Ski Ladies GP1, and Ski GP1, respectively.

Fresh off his European Endurance GP1 title, Medori entered the final race of the Grand Prix leading by eight points. Despite intense competition from Jérémy Perez #86 and a close battle for third between Lino Araújo #27 and Linus Lindberg #63, Medori secured the overall win with a third-place finish in Moto 3. Perez, the Moto 2 winner, finished second, and Lindberg took third on a tie-breaker.

In Ski GP1, Oliver Koch Hansen's Moto 2 win put him in pole position for the final heat, where he held off pressure from Quinten Bossche. Bossche #98 won Moto 3, but Koch Hansen's second-place finish was enough for the Grand Prix victory. Estonia's Jasmiin Ypraus #64 won the Ski Ladies GP1 title after a close battle with Benedicte Drange #10, securing both the Grand Prix win and a lead in the European Championship. Pierre-François Savelli swept the Runabout GP2 Motos, increasing his lead in the European Championship.

VICHY

In the European Endurance Championship, Serbian Slobodan Sobic #39 claimed the GP2 title, while Frenchman Pierre-Marie Vincentelli took the GP3 crown. Additional Grand Prix victories were claimed by Belgian Yoni Hamelin #99 (Ski GP3), Czech Petr Dryjak #11 (Runabout GP4), and Italy's Roberto Mariani, who triumphed in the Freestyle category.

Following the success of the first round in Hungary, Vichy further solidified the European Aquabike Championship's reputation. n the final day of the Grand Prix of Mira in Portugal, three French riders-Pierre-François Savelli, Valentin Dardillat, and Jérémy Perezclaimed European Championship titles in the Runabout GP2, Ski Division GP1, and Runabout GP1 categories, respectively. Daan Hoeke secured the Ski GP2 European title, with Marlon Tiik, Petr Dryjak, and Sofie Borgström winning their respective Grand Prix events. SKI GPZ: Although Daan Hoeke had already claimed the European Ski GP2 title, Estonia's Marlon Tilk stole the spotlight with a win in the Grand Prix. Tilk, starting from pole, built a commanding lead to take victory. Hoeke's second-place finish secured his championship, Matteo Valente took third in the European standings.

RUNABOUT GP2: Pierre-François Savelli entered the Runabout GP2 finale with a 12-point lead over pole-sitter Petr Dryjak. Although Dryjak clinched the Grand Prix win with a flawless ride, Savelli's second-place finish was enough to secure the European Championship. Tom Claerhout took third.

SKI LADIES GP1: Sofie Borgström of Sweden captured her first moto win of the weekend in Ski Ladies GP1, leading start to finish. Norway's Benedicte Drange, the newly crowned European champion, was docked a lap, giving Borgström the Grand Prix victory.

SKI DIWISION GP1: Valentin Dardillat confirmed his European Championship and Grand Prix victory in Ski GP1 with a calculated fourthplace finish. Felix Helgeson won the final moto, but it wasn't enough to unseat Dardillat from the top of the standings.

RUNABOUT GP1: Jérémy Perez dominated Runabout GP1 securing both the European title and Grand Prix win. The Frenchman finished the season with a commanding 13.67-second win, cementing his place as the European champion.

FREESTYLE: Roberto Mariani claimed the European Freestyle Championship showcasing his acrobatic prowess. Massimo Accumolo finished second. PR

Moto 3 was taken by American Jean Marie Garcia who was not in the overall point hunt, so the top riders were Hamelin 1st, Tyler Ward 2nd and Tanner Wright snuck into 3rd.

Pro-Am Runabout Super Stock: Dominated by international racers, Kasidit Teeraprateep of Thailand rode his way to the top spot overall, just ahead of Khalid Al Mohannadi of the UAE and Fahad Al-Reyes.

Pro-Am Runabout 1100 Stock: Anton Ignacio of the Philippines and Finn Sjöly of Colombia battled ahead of Germany's Nils Wittling. This is exactly the way they would finish 1st, 2nd and 3rd when the pump wash cleared!

"Things got hot at IJSBA's 43rd World Finals brought to the world by Short Block Technologies and the WGP-1 World Series. We did not have any weekday where the temperature dropped below 105° and if it dropped below 100° during the weekend, it sure wasn't felt by anyone. This did not stop the event from producing exciting competition including the fastest ski racing the sport has seen to date. SBT brought enthusiasm and new technology inspiring visions of the future while providing the infrastructure for the current event to have what it needed to deliver for attendees.

The event started with IJSBA's annual youth program. This year showed the largest participation rate, ever, with 70 kids getting pointers on how to advance in the sport of Personal Watercraft Racing. Provocatively called the Young Guns, this year, perhaps invoking the romantic nostalgia of the Arizona western backdrop- not a stretch, after all, a town named after Wyatt Earp is just down the river and the organizers of the Young Guns organize in Texas and hail from Kansas. Indeed, NautiWater Racing promoted the 2024 Junior Nationals and were well prepared to handle the growing population of youth racers interested in doing their best at World Finals. Young Guns included course training, technical information, sportsmanship guidance, and more. During racing, the Junior 13-15 categories showed speeds expert level riders were achieving just a few years ago.

World Finals is part of a World Series called WGP-1. This series has three stops: Europe, USA, and Thailand. This series is a high points championship in the sense that World Finals is a single round, winner take all, world championship. After a soft start at Round 1 in Poland, World Finals significantly picked up participation- not guite as high as our normal year but a respectable turnout given the conditions both economic and environmental. The series will conclude at the annual Kings Cup in Pattaya City, Thailand a renowned tourist destination which has been famous for east to approach, affordability, comfortable beach environment and a very robust nightlife (for lack of a better way to describe it in this publication). WGP-1 also handles the live streaming of World Finals and offers production quality not normally available to others. It has been a good pairing with racers building up for a grand finale of big celebrations, giant payouts, and all the glitter and gold racers dream for.

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This event was a tough one. Stuck in the final weeks of a presidential election year, which always has us down slightly, in an economically difficult environment (with very high inflation), and temperatures that we have never braved before. It cannot be said enough that there are incredible financial constraints on producing an event of this size in this location. Fortunately, World Finals had a great staff seasoned and capable of enduring heat related equipment failures and conditions that were physically and mentally straining. We put a few stress tests on how to shape the event for the leaders of tomorrow and, even where we failed some of these tests, we learned where we can and cannot make changes to a system and budget that sustains the event which is the nucleus of the sport. There is always room for improvement and we think the conditions will be present next

conditions will be present next year for us to implement what we have learned and show a good road ahead. Thanks for all the support, the patience, and extra thanks to the hard-working staff. We will see you next year October 4–12 for the next one."

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
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




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ADAPTIVE THROTTLE

LETS BEAUDEN RIDE JET SKI WITH EASE

Beauden was born a healthy boy, but at age 3, while on a family vacation in October 2020, he fell off his bike and scraped his knee. Within 48 hours, he was admitted to the ICU at Rady Children's in San Diego, where he spent nearly three months. Beauden had contracted a rare staph infection (MSSA acting like MRSA), which led to septic shock. The infection was severe, resulting in a bilateral leg amputation and the loss of two fingers. To date, he has undergone 20 surgeries. Despite these challenges, Beauden at 7 years of age remains positive and is a source of inspiration to many, showing that amidst hardships, blessings can be found.

Pro Rider recently spoke with Beauden's mom, Juliana Baumkirchner, to discuss his journey and newfound love for jet skiing.

PRO RIDER: Can you share Beauden's journey since his illness and how he became interested in jet skiing?





JULIANA BRUMKIRCHNER: After septic shock, Beauden's recovery has been long. He's been in physical and occupational therapy for 3.5 years, working hard to heal. It wasn't until this past spring that he was able to play his first sport — baseball. Not all sports are accommodating to his limb differences, but when he discovered jet skiing, we saw how it welcomed him with open arms. His dad was a jet skier, and many of our friends are too.

It's Ryder Bliss I credit for Beauden's love of jet skis. Beauden fell in love with the sport after watching Ryder Bliss race. Now, he wants to ride every day! Ryder has been a trailblazer we love and admire. The day Beauden can keep up with Ryder will be a day to celebrate!

R: How did Taylor Curtis come to create a custom throttle for Beauden?

JB: This summer, we bought two Yamaha Superjets. My husband met Taylor Curtis of TC Freeride, who offered to build a race ski for us and then a ski that could handle all 3 of our kids. Since Beauden could ride a Kawasaki mini quad with a thumb throttle, we wondered if Taylor could adapt a thumb throttle for the jet ski.

PR: Has this made a difference in how Beauden rides?

B: Absolutely! Due to keloid scarring, Beauden's fingers are contracted, so using a finger throttle would have been difficult. The thumb throttle made all the difference, giving him the control to ride on his own.

R: Please describe the custom equipment Taylor installed.

JB: Taylor modified an old Kawasaki thumb throttle and brought it closer to the handle for Beauden's smaller hands.

PR: What impact has this had on Beauden's riding?

B: It gave him the ability to actually ride and hold on with control all by himself.

PR: What's been Beauden's favorite part about jet skiing?

J: At his age, he wears 'cuppies', which keep him low to the ground instead of prosthetics. His physical therapist's mother even made jetski-themed fabric for this year's prosthetics and cuppies. When Beauden wears them, he feels like a real jetskier, especially when riding with his sisters.

PR: We hear Beauden's father, Brian Baumkirchner raced jet skis competitively. Can you tell us more?

JB: Brian, born and raised in Havasu, raced from 1991–1995. In 1992, he got 2nd in Novice 750 Limited world finals. In 1994, he went on the IJSBA national tour with 10 stops across the USA. He traveled in a box van with pro racer Jason Schultz and fellow expert rider, Max Miller. Brian was an expert 750 modified.

PR: How do you and his dad feel about Beauden's involvement in the sport, and do you hope it might turn into a "like father, like son" journey toward jet ski racing in the future?

W: We certainly hope it ends up a father like son thing! It's fun to watch Brian in the water giving Beauden a start. To see a once lifeless, intubated child get knocked out every couple days for surgeries for 2 months, lose his legs and a few fingers and now just be unstoppable with a sunshine disposition pangs my heart with absolute indescribable joy. It's like watching a baby walk for the first time every time he conquers something new. Beauden went from zero to hero!


Round 4 of the SBT P1 AquaX National Championship in St. Cloud, Florida produced some of the most exciting racing so far this season!

The venue for the eleventh time, East Lake Tohopekaliga, nestled quietly just south of Orlando International Airport, is a short distance from tourist attractions and worldfamous theme parks in Kissimmee. The Experience Kissimmee-presented event proved to be a challenge for even experienced racers. "A lake race tends to lull the mind into thinking flat, calm water will mean fast and easy racing, but the lake is large with no shelter so when a rainstorm arrives the water can be very aggressive and unpredictable," said P1 USA Director of Operations, Michelle Petro. "Several new racers joined the AquaX series for this event, which was great to see," she added.

The AM 200 class saw Cooper Caldwell continue his dominance with Cayman rider, James Monroe clinching 2nd and Peruvian rider Enrique Chia picking up 3rd.

Todd Czarcinski took the top spot in race 1 for AM 300. However, races 2 and 3 were dominated by new rider Fedrico Hochman from Uruguay who showed blistering pace. Cayman Island rider, Cline Glidden took second overall with Ian Smith rounding out the top 3.

Pro Enduro kept the excitement high, with positions shifting throughout the weekend. Monster Energy athletes dominated the PRO Enduro podium, with Dustin Farthing taking 1st, followed by Chris MacClugage and Deven Farthing.







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Pro Rider recently connected with Tim Holder and David Fuller to learn the story behind the Lake Norman Dam2Dam Charity Ride launched 13 years ago by the Rotary Club of Sherrills Ford- Dry Pond in Denver, North Carolina.

The event began as a simple idea between friends and Rotarians Tim Holder and Dave Fuller. "We wanted to do something fun that would raise money for the community," Holder shared. As the owner of Purr Powersports & Performance, a powersports business in Lake Norman, Tim's first thought was, "How can we involve jet skis?" Dave suggested a "dam ride," sparking the idea for what would become the Dam2Dam event.

hough poker runs were common on Lake Norman, nothing similar existed for personal watercraft (PWCs) so we created the first-ever Dam2Dam ride, proposing it to our Rotary Club, which embraced the idea. The event was designed for participants to meet at Beatty's Ford Park, a local ramp, and begin the journey from there.

On the morning of the ride, participants gather at the park to check in and enjoy bagels and coffee provided by My Brothers Bagel. Each rider receives an official Dam2Dam shirt, courtesy of RightRock Sportswear. After a safety briefing and recognition of sponsors, the group rides 3.5 miles south to Cowans Ford Dam for the starting point. The riders set off in waves according to their preferred pace, with around four groups of PWCs heading north toward Lookout Shoals Dam.

The first leg of the journey covers 30 miles through Lookout Shoal Lake, with a scenic stop at Lookout Shoals Dam for photos and socializing. Riders then make their way south to Dog Island, 26.5 miles away, where they wrap up with lunch and a sponsor-supported raffle.

Dam2Dam has grown considerably, starting with 25 PWCs in 2012 and reaching 100 PWCs and 120 participants this year. During the COVID-19 pandemic, while we didn't have a publicized event, we still did a ride dubbed the 'Dam Covid Ride.'

Spanning 60 miles from south dam to north dam, the ride takes participants through four counties. The final nine miles, approaching Lookout Shoals Dam, offer a dramatic change of scenery as the lake narrows into a river lined by forests, with smooth water where riders can push their crafts to full speed.

Over the years, funds raised by the event have supported a range of community projects. Initially, proceeds went toward the Rotary Club's park project. Once the park was completed, the club began supporting various causes, from assisting low-income communities to building basketball courts. Recently, the funds have been dedicated to an initiative known as "A Dam Scholarship." Each year, the club awards scholarships to three local high school students. Last year, three students each received nis wards you watch highlights trom the or and the approximation would a approximation of the approximation of the approximation a approximation of the approxi \$2,000 scholarships, and the goal is to increase these awards as fundraising grows. This year's event raised over \$7,500 to support this cause. PR

tv & Fritid I Sweden AB was founded in 2004 by Torgny and Anders, in the countryside in a red barn. Sales grew and in 2012 Joel Ohlsson joined the company, Anders departed, fast forward to 2016 Joel became sole owner. Around this time, Sea-Doo business in Sweden took off.

Daniel started Jetskiparts.se with another partner in 2010, as the first real webshop for jetski and watercraft spare parts in Sweden. It progressed from selling parts in his apartment to getting a small warehouse and obtaining a distribution agreement with SBT. He worked at Mediamarkt (like Best Buy) where he met Joel. They connected over shared interests and discussed possibly starting a business together in the future.

In 2018 Daniel became sole owner of Jetskiparts.se and Atv & Fritid bought the company, and merged the businesses together, from that day Joel and Daniel were partners.

Late 2022 they started their 2nd store in Nyköping with units and workshop at the end of the pandemic when sales were booming, and they lacked capacity in Söderköping. Nyköping's proximity to the capital promised more customers.

Daniel Norell's journey began by helping a friend run a Sea-Doo rental business on Lake Vättern. Years later, Norell bought his first Sea-Doo. Frustrated by the lack of affordable parts, Norell started sourcing them from eBay for himself and other enthusiasts. As demand grew, he founded his company in 2010 while still working full-time at an electronics store. Riding his Sea-Doo was Daniel's escape, allowing him to explore new places and leave his worries behind.



However, by the time they opened, the market slowed, and Sweden introduced a watercraft driving license. Despite these changes, they persevered, working to boost sales staying resilient, ready for the market to grow again.

In recent years they earned many awards including Sea-Doo Dealer of the Year, Can-Am PAC Dealer of the Year, Polaris Best Growth, and Polaris Hero Dealer.

What makes Daniel happiest about their business is that he and Joel built it through hard work and ambition. Success wasn't handed to them; they earned it. They have excellent reviews on Google and Facebook and strive to operate like a family business, focusing on local, customer-oriented service.

When asked what sets them apart from competitors, Daniel shared, "it's challenging to pinpoint one thing. However, we maintain a small company mindset, emphasizing customer service, local engagement, friendliness, and trust. For example, we always return missed calls promptly, surprising many customers. To us, every customer is important. We strive for customer satisfaction and recommendations. Today, our team of 13 across both stores continues the tradition started by Torgny, who founded ATV & Fritid." **PR**

I can bring people's ideas to life and solve those pesky problems that linger for years. I love it when I can bring someone's idea to life!

PR: What are you most proud of regarding Weeks Brothers Watersports?

DW: I am most proud of how far WBW has come in the past 3 years. Seeing our parts and organizers at rides, and events is one of the coolest things. We've helped normalize 3d



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
