Luis de Leon, FuelTech's COO, has a Sea-Doo RXP-X 325 heavily modified to be a good 90mph+ lake fun ski, sporting our FuelTech FT550 ECU and complete line of watersports developed products.

# RIDING THE COLD WAVES: Jet Skiling in Winter Weather

hen most people think of jet skiing, summer adventures under sunny skies come to mind. However, for the truly adventurous, jet skiing isn't confined to warm weather. Riding in winter conditions can be an exhilarating challenge — one that requires preparation, the right gear, and a bit of grit. Extreme riders have even taken excursions as far as Alaska, using specialized ski sleds to carry extra fuel and provisions. Whether you're ready to tackle the icy waves or looking to winterize your ski until spring, here's what you need to know.

# **GEARING UP FOR WINTER RIDES**

Staying warm is paramount when riding a jet ski in winter. The cold wind and water can quickly lead to hypothermia if you're not properly equipped. Essential gear includes:

- Drysuit: A high-quality drysuit is nonnegotiable for winter jet skiing. Unlike a wetsuit, which traps a thin layer of water against your skin, a drysuit keeps you completely dry while insulating your body.
- Thermal Layers: Wear moisture-wicking thermal base layers beneath your drysuit to retain body heat without the discomfort of sweat.
- Gloves and Boots: Neoprene gloves and boots provide warmth and grip, protecting extremities from the biting cold.
- Helmet and Goggles: A helmet shields you from windchill, while goggles protect your eyes from freezing spray and glare from the snow or ice.
- Face Protection: Balaclavas or neoprene face masks can prevent frostbite and keep you comfortable in icy winds.



# PREPARING YOUR SKI FOR THE COLD

Jet skis need extra care and preparation to perform well in freezing temperatures. Here are some steps to ensure your ski is ready:

- Check the Antifreeze System: If your jet ski has a closed-loop cooling system, ensure it's topped up with the correct antifreeze mixture to prevent freezing.
- Winter Fuel Tips: Add a fuel stabilizer to your tank and top it off before heading out.
   This prevents moisture buildup and keeps the engine running smoothly.
- Inspect the Battery: Cold weather can drain your battery quickly. Test and charge it before every outing to avoid getting stranded.
- Flush the System Post-Ride: After riding in icy waters, flush the cooling system thoroughly to prevent ice formation and salt buildup.

# STAYING SAFE

Winter jet skiing comes with increased risks, so safety should always be a priority:

- Buddy System: Never ride alone in winter conditions. Always have a partner nearby in case of emergencies.
- GPS and Communication Devices: Equip yourself with a waterproof GPS device and a marine radio to stay connected.
- Emergency Provisions: Pack essentials such as a first-aid kit, thermal blanket, and extra fuel.

## WINTERIZING FOR THE OFF-SEASON

If riding in winter isn't for you, properly winterizing your jet ski is crucial to maintaining its longevity:

- **Drain the Water:** Flush and drain all water from the ski to prevent freezing and damage.
- Stabilize the Fuel: Add a fuel stabilizer and run the engine for a few minutes to circulate it.
- Battery Care: Remove and store the battery in a cool, dry place, charging it periodically to maintain its life.
- Cover and Store: Use a high-quality cover and store your ski in a dry, temperaturecontrolled environment,

Winter jet skiing isn't just about the ride; it's about the preparation and the thrill of conquering elements most wouldn't dare to face. For those who brave the cold, the rewards are unmatched. And for those waiting for warmer waters, proper winterization ensures your ski is ready for action when summer rolls around again. PR



t just 18 years old, Reese Giese has cemented her place among the elite in jet ski racing, claiming seven world titles and dominating the 2024 season.

Reese, of Scottsdale, Arizona has been on a stand-up jetski since she was 11 years old and racing since she was 13. Her dad, Jimmy Giese, has been involved in motorcycle racing most of his life; the desire to race jet skis was completely a desire of her own.

The love of the sport of jet ski racing and her competitive nature to exceed in whatever she does was the driving factor that motivated Reese to practice multiple days a week to be a champion!

"Becoming friends with the Webster family and our kids riding, practicing and racing together has helped give Reese the tools she needs to be the best," shared Jimmy. He continued, "Reese had a goal to win the Women's Pro Ski GP/Modified class at the 2024 IJSBA World Finals and she did so with convincing authority winning all three motos. Another driving factor was to defend her 2023 title in the Women's Pro Ski stock class which she did as well by

winning all three of those motos. Now a 7-time World Champion in both of the Premier Women's Pro classes, Pro Women's Ski Modified and Pro Women's Ski Stock, Reese not only won both of these classes, but she won all 6 motos between the two classes in dominant fashion. At Just 18 and having 7 World Titles to her name already, she has done more than most women in the sport. In fact, I believe the only woman to have more titles than her currently is Tera Laho.'

> For 2025 Reese will continue to race with the men in the local Expert GP class and perhaps race abroad in a European series in the Women's Pro class.

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

aila Clibourne, 25, grew up in San Diego, CA, spending time at the beach, in the desert, or at the track. After high school, she studied advertising at the University of Oregon. Growing up immersed in action sports like surfing, skating, and motocross, Kaila has always been drawn to adrenaline-fueled activities, whether on or off the grid!

**PRORIDER:** How has growing up with parents who founded Go Fast Girls influenced your passion for motorsports and your role as Marketing Manager?

**KAILA CLIBDURNE:** My parents encouraged me to try any sport I wanted, even if I was the only girl, which fostered my love for motorsports. When it came time to choose a career, the off-road industry felt like a natural fit.

In August 2023, I became the Social Media Specialist for PRP Seats, SpeedStrap, and Status Racing. I've since grown into my role as Marketing Coordinator at PRP, where my Marketing Manager, Justin Constant, and General Manager, Jay Crouch, have been instrumental in shaping me into a well-rounded businesswoman. I currently work at PRP and manage social media for Go Fast Girls, which I started in October 2024 after submitting a proposal.

Collaborating with my parents at Go Fast Girls has been incredible, as they've seen firsthand how I operate in the business world. Trade shows are especially rewarding, with the Sand Sports Super Show being my favorite, as both PRP and Go Fast Girls are there every year.

**PR:** You're an athlete and dirt bike racer — what drew you to dirt bike racing, and how has it shaped your outlook on competition and adventure?



**KE:** I grew up riding dirt bikes with my dad, spending weekends in the desert or the track. My first bike was a Honda 70, and last year, I reignited that passion by buying another dirt bike.

Being surrounded by off-road toys both at home and work inspires me to explore. In October 2024, I purchased a 1986 Toyota pickup truck, and my boyfriend and I are building it into a prerunner. Racing is thrilling, but off-roading is about enjoying the adventure, whether in Glamis, Ocotillo, or Lake Havasu.

**PR:** Do you ride jet skis, and how does the thrill of being on the water compare to your experiences on the track?

\*\*E: I've ridden jet skis, but I'm not the best at it. My stepdad's advice, "The faster you go, the easier it is," applies to all terrains. While jet skiing focuses more on rhythm than the intensity of the track, the adrenaline rush and connection to nature are just as rewarding.

As the host and leader of Legends and Heroes Time Machine, Yellich steers the ship while co-producing and selecting the show's interviews.

Adam Gruender began his racing career in 1985, competing professionally in the 550 open class, ranking in the top 10 for six years before retiring in 1991. After managing Big O Tire franchises, he shifted to the Lucas Oil Offroad Short Course Championship, winning the regional series from 2011–2013, finishing 2nd in 2015, later competing in Pro Buggy for six years. Gruender consistently ranked top 8 nationally and ran top 10 annually at the Crandon International World Championships on Labor Day weekend.

An award-winning branded content creator, Steven Reyes serves as co-executive producer, co-creator, producer, technical director, and video editor for the acclaimed show Legends and Heroes Time Machine, bringing inspiring stories of motorsports and water sports legends to life with passion and precision.

PRO RIVER WITH What (or who) Inspired you to create the Legends & Heroes Time Machine podcast?

from a deep desire to share the incredible history of our sport with the younger generation. Back in the day, we were like a traveling circus, filled with adventure, camaraderie, and challenges. There are so many untold stories —of struggles, triumphs, and sheer fun — that deserve to be heard and preserved.

**CD-H05T RURIN GRUEDDER:** The idea struck me after seeing Clayton Jacobson III, son of the inventor of the jet ski, display two prototype watercraft at the "Run Whatcha Brung" event in Parker, Arizona. I thought if no one documents this history, it could be lost forever. That's when I turned to Mike and said, "We need to make this happen."

#### Pur Who have been some standout guests, and what stories resonated most with viewers?

Bob Phares, the marketing mind behind Kawasaki's JetSki launch in 1973, was incredible. Hearing how he introduced the Kawasaki 440 to the world and organized the first JetSki event at Mission Bay was inspiring and nostalgic.

**MG:** Chris Hagest, an industry pioneer, stood out for his multifaceted contributions as a racer, inventor of the Pro Force Hull, and co-founder of the junior racer program. His journey reflects the innovation and passion of this sport.

#### Mr. What feedback have you received from the jet ski community?

The response has been overwhelmingly positive. At the World Finals Hall of Fame dinner, people were excited about the concept, praising the podcast for capturing the Golden Era of the sport and giving legends a platform to share their stories.

#### The How would you describe the experience of hosting the podcast on YouTube?

Fit: YouTube provides a powerful platform for reaching our community. Leveraging our existing channel, Throttle Junkie TV, we've expanded from event coverage to storytelling allowing us to connect with fans while showcasing the evolution of the sport.

#### Real is YouTube effective for reaching the jet ski community?



#### PR: What was the experience like for you? What stood out as the best part of the event?



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



# RIVARACING TECHTIP

## **How to Measure Top Speed**

very performance enthusiast wants to know the actual top speed of their modified watercraft. Unfortunately, the data displayed by the stock speedometer isn't accurate and can be off by as much as 3mph. Use of a handheld GPS will provide a more precise measure of speed but can be deceiving because most only provide peak top speed which includes inaccurate spikes. At RIVA Racing, we recommend the use of phone-based apps to measure the top speed. An external Bluetooth GPS receiver can be added to your phone for even more precise speed data.


The first step in modifying a watercraft is to record your "baseline" top speed prior to installing any performance upgrades. Doing so allows you to confirm that you're starting with the expected stock speed and can identify possible issues with the stock craft before the modification process begins.

Standardized speed testing procedures are critical to ensure accurate results. When testing parts for top speed and acceleration, the conditions that existed for the baseline test should be duplicated as closely as possible for subsequent runs. If using a phone-based GPS app to establish a baseline, make sure to use the same app for all future runs. Consecutive runs should be made in opposite directions for more accurate speed averaging purposes. Other factors such as altitude, air temperature, humidity, water conditions, and water type (salt or fresh) can make major differences in top speed readings and change the conditions of the test.

Make sure to always use the same rider for all speed passes and don't overlook important factors such as consistent fuel level, foot placement and rider positioning, all of which contribute to the accurate measurement of top speed. **PR**

## Aquabike World Endurance Championship and Closed Circuit World Championship, Lake Toba, Indonesia, 2024

or the second year in a row, Lake Toba hosted the UIM-ABP Aquabike World Championships. The pinnacle of the Aquabike racing year, Lake Toba's primal allure, mirrors the inner desires of racers to dominate their class and the unpredictable waters of an ancient lake. 80 riders from 30 countries descended in this secluded picturesque region of North Sumatra, to claim their medals for Indonesia and the rest of the 2024 racing season. Thousands of spectators cheered and enjoyed traditional festivities by the lake's edge.

Racing began with Endurance, where 33 riders had to conquer three cups and six transfers from base camp in Pangururan, totaling 400 kilometers or 248 mi for transfers and course racing. Karo Cup champion Lino Araujo made a triumphant return after acute health issues. The Dairi Cup went to Francois Medori, and the Simalungun Cup to Hajime Isahai, another delightful comeback for the Japanese rider. The World Championship went to Francois Medori, who took his second Endurance title in 2024 after winning the European leg in Vichy. In second place, Anthony Radetic had strong finishes in the Dairi Cup, followed by Isahai in third just 5 points from Radetic. This is not the last we hear from these riders, which brings us to closed course racing.

In Ski Ladies, Jessica Chavanne defended her GP of Lake Toba 2023 title and took the overall win with great technical finesse and nerve. A mere three points away was Valkyrian Estonian, Jasmiin Ypraus, in second, and Norwegian young gun, Benedicte Drange, in third. For the world championship, Jasmiin proved she was indeed the first of her name and was crowned World Champion of 2024. Chavanne was just 9 points behind her in second, and Drange, having the best year of her rocketing racing career, in third.

In Ski GP 1, all eyes were on the red bib of Quinten Bossche, a convenient target for a talent-heavy lineup. For GP of Lake Toba, Kevin Reiterer pulled ahead for the championship aboard a new boat courtesy of a new sponsor, XBJ. Jeremy Poret said, "What shoulder injury?" and finished in second followed by Bossche in third. For the world championship, Bossche defended his top podium spot, yet another title in his collection of accolades for Belgium. Reiterer took second, and Morgan Poret, the 2023 GP of Lake Toba

In Runabout GP 1, Sweden's Samuel Johansson was the one to watch. The young Swedish rider, no novice to the class, has been making waves for several

champion, third.

years. After three stops in 2024 and tense battles with veteran Francois Medori, Samuel won the GP of Lake Toba AND the world championship title in an emotional conclusion. Medori, despite finishing the New York City Marathon days before his racing week, managed to stay in second overall, tying in points with Samuel. Jeremy Perez had a stellar week and finished third for the GP of Lake Toba. Lino Araujo, no doubt ecstatic, finished third in the world championship. This was also Johan Johansson's final year of racing, choosing to step back to focus on Samuel and Janina's racing careers.

The showmen in Freestyle did not disappoint. Rashid Al Mulla retook the GP of Lake Toba and the world championship, followed by Roberto Mariani in second and Paulo Nunes in third.

This was a strong Aquabike year, thanks to great racing destinations, fun course designs, and, most of all, unbelievably fast and talented riders. If this is the template for jet ski racing, I say... bring on 2025!

Ryan Riling took the 1200cc Novice class title and 1200cc Novice Best Trick trophy, impressive in his first competitive appearance. Runner up in this class was Colin Morrison, also of the USA, and Dennis Saulnier of Canada took his first ever freestyle placing, showing that persistence really does pay off.

In the 1200cc Class we were honoured to have world renowned freerider Tanner Thomas, who pushed Henry Li hard. Tanner took the runner up position making it a USA 1-2, and Adam Reynolds of the UK took third.

The judges unanimously voted young gun Brock Doberstein as Virtual Freestyle's Most Inspirational Newcomer for 2024, and we can't wait to see how this talented young boy, trained by his father Ryan, progresses with his freestyle career.

**PRO RIDER:** Please tell us about your background and what led you to become involved in jet skiing and the Wininger Racing Team.

**KYLE WININGER:** Wininger Racing Team LLC on one hand is the name of the business I started in 2024 to bring parts I was making to the public. On the other hand, Wininger Racing Team was the name of my dad's racing team back before I was even a thought. Just before I was born, my dad hung up the suit and sold his IMCA modified. 10 years later, my parents had my brother and me on the track racing quarter midgets. After aging out of quarter midgets, we raced mini cup stock cars. When the mini cup series dwindled, WRT paused, only to be continued later in the mud racing circuit with a pair of backyard built K5 Blazers. We just like to race; we'll race whatever we can.

Getting into jet skis was a Covid project. I saw a 1988 JS440 online, picked it up on my way home from work and the rest is history. After a few years riding, repairing, and rebuilding jet skis, racing them was a natural progression. I had the opportunity to work as a prototype fabricator at a tech start up where I learned how to TIG weld, operate 3D printers & plasma tables, and CAD in programs like Fusion 360 and NX. With newfound skills and knowledge, the quality of the parts I was able to produce went dramatically up.

**PR:** What inspired you to start your business, and how did you decide to focus on spark plug covers?

Team when the spark plug cases took off. They started the same way as most WRT parts in our catalog, I was filling a need for myself, people saw them and wanted a set. When I originally drew the cases up in CAD I had no intention of starting a business anytime soon. I was just tired of my cardboard spark plug boxes getting wet when I backed the ski trailer into the water. Now WRT has our spark plug cases carried by three major online jet ski retailers!

PR: How has your personal experience in jet ski racing influenced the development and design of your products? What type of PWC do you ride and what are your favorite riding locations?

\*\*Honestly, I've only participated in one jet ski race so far in my life, the season finale of the 2024 Wild Western Watercross series in Sparks, Nevada. I attended the entire 2024 season of races and met many great people and a community that pulled me into the world of aftermarket support for jet skis. My favorite jet ski to ride is a Kawasaki X2. Favorite ride spots include Hogsback access ramp, Camp Far West, and Lake McClure.

**PR:** Please share your future plans for the business, and can we expect any new products or innovations?

The future for Wininger Racing Team is bright! There are many products coming soon from WRT both solely from our camp and with various collaborations and projects with other jet ski related parts companies. 





et skiing is an exhilarating sport, but often leaves riders with low back pain due to the repetitive motions and posture required. Whether you're racing or cruising, the combination of leaning forward and bouncing over waves can put strain on your lower back. Fortunately, incorporating the right exercises and movements can help reduce pain and prevent injury, keeping you on the water longer.

#### WHY DOES JET SKIING CAUSE **LOW BACK PAIN?**

Jet skiing often requires a hunched position, placing stress on the lumbar spine and overloading lower back muscles. The constant jarring motions from waves can create tension, leading to stiffness and discomfort. Over time, muscle imbalances — where the core and glutes are weak while the lower back and hip flexors become tight - can exacerbate this low back pain.







#### 1. STRENGTHEN CORE

A strong core supports your spine and helps absorb the impact of bouncing on the water. Focus on exercises like:

- · Planks: Hold for 20-30 seconds to build core strength.
- Bird Dogs: Engage your core while extending opposite arm and leg.
- · Dead Bugs: Alternate extending arms and legs while keeping your lower back pressed to the floor.

#### 2. IMPROVE FLEXIBILITY

Tight muscles, particularly in the hips and hamstrings, can contribute to low back pain. Regular stretching can help:

- Hamstring Stretch: Reach for your toes or use a strap to gently pull your foot toward you.
- · Hip Flexor Stretch: Perform lunges or a kneeling stretch to release tightness.
- · -Cat-Cow Stretch: Alternate arching and rounding your back to increase spinal flexibility.


#### 3. STRENGTHEN GLUTES AND LEGS

Weak glutes and legs can lead to overuse of your lower back. Exercises like:

- · Squats: Build leg strength while engaging the core.
- · Bridges: Strengthen the glutes and lower back.
- · Walking Lunges: Target the quads, hamstrings, and glutes.
- · Deadlifts: These work the low back, glutes and hamstrings.

#### 4. FOCUS ON POSTURE

Proper posture is key to reducing back pain. Keep a neutral spine, engage your core, and bend at the hips leaning forward. Regularly check your posture and take breaks when needed to reset.





#### 5. CROSS-TRAIN FOR BETTER ENDURANCE

Low-impact activities like rowing, cycling, and yoga can improve strength, and endurance, helping prevent overuse injuries.

#### 6. RECOVERY IS KEY

After riding, stretch, foam roll, hit the jacuzzi, and use heat or ice to reduce muscle tension and prevent stiffness.







The 2024 WGP#1 World Cup final round of the Triple Crown and Asia Cup Championship returned to Jomtien Beach, Thailand. For the second consecutive year, the city enhanced the beach area with offshore sand pumper boats, creating the largest event layout to date, spanning over 2km with expanded grandstands, media zones, and an impressive VIP section.

Major brands Yamaha, Sea-Doo, and Kawasaki set up vendor tents, with Kawasaki unveiling the all-new SX-X 160 watercraft. Jet Pilot and Freedom Motorsports anchored the vendor area, joined by smaller exhibitors and club racing teams from various countries. The Asian Association of Waterjet Federation (AAWF) held its year-end meeting, announcing that jet ski racing will be part of the 2025 SEA Games in Pattaya, Thailand.

WGP#1 assembled a global team of race officials and marshals, with Race Directors from the USA, Australia, Belgium, and the UK, supported by Course Marshals from the UAE, USA, and Germany. Thailand's highly acclaimed Skywave Rescue Team collaborated closely with top-notch medical staff to ensure safety.

The event kicked off with two days of prerace inspections, registration, and open practice, followed by controlled practice and qualifiers for high-participation classes like 1100 Runabout Stock and Runabout GP. With 40 countries competing and a prize purse exceeding \$375,000 USD, competition was intense!

The event featured 22 closed-course classes, four Junior classes and Freestyle. Premier GP classes drew full lines of elite racers battling across four motos, but the randomized starting light system led to 18 red flag starts on day one as racers adjusted their timing. By the end of the event, racers adapted to the system, resulting in smoother starts.

Post-moto inspections ensured compliance, with checks ranging from craft observation to crankshaft teardowns for top-tier classes.

The 2024 World Cup once again showcased the pinnacle of jet ski racing on a global stage! **PR**

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
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
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
